Seed-time and Harvest

Having lived and farmed in Warnford as a family for five generations I regard it a great honour and privilege to be asked to contribute to the Parish News.

Once again we have witnessed another seed-time and harvest. This is the fulfilment of the promise that God made following the creation and the flood. Genesis 8 vv22: 'As long as the earth endures seed-time and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night will not cease'. This clearly tells us that the earth will not last forever. Of course we must do all we can to look after the earth, however, whatever we do, the divine plan cannot be altered. Please read 2 Peter ch 3.

Jesus Christ, when explaining to his disciples about His crucifixion and resurrection resulting in the salvation of mankind to those who believe in Jesus Christ and confess their sin, used the illustration of seed-time and harvest. John 12 v 2: 'Unless a grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies it remains only a seed, but if it dies it produces many seeds'. Pull up the stubble after harvest and you will see the original grain of wheat, dead, but it has produced

the ear of up to fifty grains.

Not only has God created the soil with the potential of bringing forth germination and a harvest, there is also life within the seed. There are several parables in Scripture explaining the good seed and the bad seed. The good seed being those indwelt with the Holy Spirit and through faith in Jesus Christ.

Many years ago I grew a field of barley for seed. Early in the growth of the crop I had a visit from the seedsman to make an inspection. He told me he was looking for wild oats. I couldn't understand how he would be able to find this weed at such an early stage. He explained to me the barley curls round in a clockwise direction and the wild oat in an anticlockwise direction. The wild oat, if left, would need to be rogued and removed, or it would grow higher than the barley and would drop its seed and spread trouble. It is not for us to judge the lives of others, but we know and God knows the details of our lives.

What a privilege it is to work in conjunction with the creator, and seeing yet another seed-time and harvest, in the field and garden. Give thanks to God for his provision and pray that the leaders of the rich nations might have wisdom and guidance in distribution to satisfy those in need.



Wide appeal at West Meon Music Festival

Spanish guitar, a prize-winning pianist, chamber music favourites, a baroque duo recital and a dazzling young soprano: this year's West Meon Music Festival, which runs from the 8th to 11th of September, is sure to appeal to a wide range of music lovers.

The festival, now its twelfth year, was founded by the Primrose Piano Quartet – one of the UK's leading chamber ensembles – who regularly invite their musician friends to join them for the event held in three beautiful Meon Valley churches. This year's eight concerts include four solo or duo recitals, favourite works for chamber ensembles and a late night introduction to Schoenberg.

"It's always a joy to share the festival with our various guests," says Andrew Fuller, the Quartet's cellist and festival musical director, "and we're delighted this year that they include renowned guitarist, John Mills; violinist Huw Daniel, who is the leader of the Orchestra of the Age of Enlightenment; Emanuil Ivanov, a brilliant young Bulgarian pianist who won the 2019 Busoni International Piano competition; and mezzo soprano Helen Charlston, who is a BBC New Generation Artist and winner of the 2018 London Handel Competition."

Works to be performed by the Primrose include piano quartets by Beethoven and Mozart and Tchaikovsky's Piano Trio. They will be joined by string players, Jonathan Martindale, Norbert Blume and Kirsten Jenson in several pieces including Brahms' String Sextet in G major and Schubert's much-loved last chamber work, the String Quintet in C.

As in previous years the festival will be raising funds for The Rosemary Foundation, which operates a "hospice at home" service in Hampshire.

The candlelit evening concerts include a glass of wine or soft drinks. Coffee & biscuits or tea & cakes are served at the other concerts. Concerts take place at churches in West Meon, East Meon and Warnford and tickets are from £10 to £20, with generous discounts for students and accompanied children. 



Dragonflies on display

Darter, skimmer, chaser and hawker. What may sound like a new quartet in Santa's gang of flying reindeer are in fact the names of some of the UK's resident dragonfly species.

This special group of invertebrates are part of the Odonata order of flying insects, which is made up of dragonfly and damselfly species. Here's a closer look at these winged wonders.

Amazingly, dragonflies were some of the first flying insects to evolve over 300 million years ago, soaring the skies with eagle-sized wingspans before even dinosaurs. With a pair of large eyes providing fantastic vision and a top speed of around 30mph – which makes dragonflies one of the fastest flying insects in the UK – they are fearsome predators. There are 17 species of damselfly and 23 species of dragonfly resident in the UK, plus the occasional visiting species from continental Europe. Found in almost every habitat, including wetlands, moorland and woodland glades, these predatory insects bring a splash of colour to a landscape just as wildflowers and butterflies are winding down.

To tell dragonflies and damselflies apart, there is a general rule of thumb that damselflies are slimmer and rest with their wings folded, while the stockier dragonfly keeps its wings spread outwards. Damselflies can be spotted on the wing as early as the start of May, while the last common darter of the year might still be flying on a warm October day. The highest species diversity is found during July and August, and, like most insects, dragonflies are most active in warm, sunny weather. Five species to spot include the emperor dragonfly, the southern hawker, the banded demoiselle, the golden ringed and the common darter.

In our region, Pamber Forest Nature Reserve is a brilliant place to find dragonflies near

the woodland streams and ponds during the breeding season, and hunting for prey along the woodland rides. Over 20 species have been recorded here, including the club-tailed dragonfly, which was a first for Hampshire, and the white-legged

damselfly. It's also a great site for seeing the beautiful demoiselle damselfly and the golden ringed dragonfly. Swanwick Lakes and Testwood Lakes nature reserves near Southampton are also prime dragonfly hotspots.

Australian Wines from West Meon Wine Society

We brought Australia to West Meon at the end of July when we gave a tasting to show how good and how varied Australian wines can be. The event took place on a beautiful summer's evening at the West Meon Sports Pavilion.



Australia, with over 200 years of vine growing and wine making experience, is hardly "new world" these days, but its wine scene is changing in some exciting ways. Having been perhaps best known for branded multi-regional blended varietals, there is more of a focus now on the vineyard, as winemakers look to exploit the particular characteristics of local soils and climates and their interaction with specific varieties of grape.

One evening's event can't cover everything, but we tried to give at least an inkling of what Australia can offer. We showed five of the classics: Margaret River Semillon Sauvignon, Chardonnay (from the Yarra Valley and Padthaway), Eden Valley Riesling, Shiraz (from McLaren Vale and the Barossa Valley) and Cabernet Sauvignon blends (from Langhorne Creek and Margaret River).

And to hint at just some of the variety that's out there we sampled some other grapes where Australia is making a name for itself.

To put the wines in context, we introduced the wines with short briefings on the winemakers, grapes, local characteristics, and winemaking.

The wines were well received on the night.



Rainfall Records Junly/August 2022

This is almost certainly the driest period that we have reported on since starting the rainfall report for the Parish news. From the end of June to the 15th August we have only measured 2mm.

Not only has it been dry but also very hot with daytime temperatures often in the 30's and night temperatures only once dropping below 7C. Fields are brown and parched and harvest more or less completed by mid August with the exception of some linseed crops. A rain is now desperately needed to germinate the rape seed which is lying in very dry soil. As we write this the sky is very overcast and looks as though it could rain?

Rainfall to end of July: 306.5mms (12.03") Same month last year: 465.8mms (18.3")
