Grafty Gourmet

This is a great Italian dish called Polpette di Pollo and is great served with pasta, rice or a green salad.

Chicken Meatballs

Meatballs:

300 g cooked chicken
3 slices of brown bread, crusts removed
50 ml milk
50 g olives
2 tablespoons capers, drained
1 clove of garlic, peeled
4 tablespoons grated Parmesan
1 large egg olive oil 1 handful of fresh flat-leaf parsley, chopped to serve

Tomato sauce:

2 tablespoons olive oil 3 cloves of garlic, peeled and crushed 2 x 400 g tins of chopped tomatoes 1/2 teaspoon sugar

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C. Using a large knife, roughly chop up the chicken, giving it some texture, then set aside. Roughly break up the bread into a bowl and pour over the milk, tossing it together, and set aside until the milk is absorbed.
- 2. Put the soaked bread, olives, capers, garlic and parmesan in a blender and blitz until combined. Add the chicken and break in the egg, then pulse the lender very briefly, until the mixture is blended enough to be moulded into balls but is still a chunky. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Roll the mixture into small balls about 2.5cm wide (if the mixture is a little too wet to work with, add some extra breadcrumbs until it comes together).
- 3. Place the meatballs in a greased ovenproof dish. Drizzle generously with oil and bake in the oven for 30 minutes, turning the balls halfway so they're golden on all sides.
- 4. While the meatballs are cooking, make your tomato sauce. Heat the olive oil in a large frying pan over a medium heat, add the garlic and cook for approximately 3 minutes, until softened but not coloured. Tip in the tinned tomatoes, then fill the empty tin a third of the way with water and add this as well. Cook over a high heat for 8–10 minutes, stirring occasionally, until the sauce has reduced and thickened. Stir in the sugar to sweeten. Season with salt and pepper.
- 5. Add the sauce to the dish 5-10 minutes before the meatballs have finished cooking. Serve with some parsley scattered on top.





I went to a presentation on Social Networking a while back and was absolutely horrified to hear the first presenter start by telling everyone that print was dead. I have created 85 websites in the past few years, I provide social networking for clients, I help people set up new businesses, help others re-launch, I design logos and provide lots of printing and I run two business associations. Quite frankly I was horrified at his out and out intention to feed the audience with mistruth.

I know we all have to suffer lies and deceit on social media and general media these days. It isn't right. Consequently I spent some time doing some legal, decent and honest research and this presentation is the result. Don't miss it, it will surprise some of you. It did me!

Tuesday 4 October. At the Harrow Inn. Reading from paper or reading from screens.

What do consumers really prefer? A survey of UK consumers recently undertaken provides some unexpected results for many people. As the world of communication continually shifts towards digital, books, magazines and other forms of communication are increasingly read on screen. 



So many changes! It's happening all the time. Across the world and closer to home. In our villages there are new houses, neighbours, shops, council members. For each of us, as well as the day-to-day changes that come with getting a little bit older, there are step-changes like leaving home, college, new school, marriage, babies, new jobs, redundancy, money worries, ill health, retirement and bereavement, breaking up with partners. In our Churches there have been changes over the years too; in the buildings, in what's offered – and of course vicars come and go.

Change can be difficult and stressful. Sometimes we resist change because we disagree, or fear the outcome, or just because we hate change and feel comfortable with what we know and are familiar with. What we can be sure of, though, is that we will never know what *would* have happened if we'd made a different decision.

I often hear people say "if only...." They are reflecting that a different decision, a few moments delay, a few seconds earlier, and something (usually tragic) would have been avoided.

Faced with all this upheaval and change, how best can we cope? Who or what will help us steer a level course?

One of the books in the Bible has a chapter about faith. It says this: "By faith Abraham, when called to go obeyed and went, even though he did not know where he was going." (Hebrews ch.11)

It's faith – listening for and heeding God's "still small voice" – that will help us through changing times. God promised to be with Abraham and lead and guide him – and he kept that promise. He makes the same promise to each of us, if we will only listen. Here's another promise, this time from the book of Proverbs in the Bible: "With all your heart you must trust the Lord and not your own judgment. Always let him lead you, and he will clear the road for you to follow." (Proverbs 3:5)

That's a lovely promise and while we never know "what if," we do know this: that God promises to be with us and to hold us if we just ask. He offers guidance and help in making decisions and through all the changing scenes of life.

This is my last message in the four village magazines before we retire at the end of September. Our prayer for all is that you will know God's love and guidance, now and always.


