NEWS FROM THE WIDER CHURCH ...

Congratulations to Archdeacon Jackie

It was announced in early July that Jackie Searle has been appointed as the next Bishop of Crediton in the Exeter Diocese. Jackie has been the Archdeacon of Gloucester (and part of the leadership team of our Diocese) since 2012 and said this about her time here: "My six years in the Diocese of Gloucester have been significant — and to the people of the diocese and particularly Gloucester Archdeaconry I want to say thank you for all we have shared in the service of Christ. It has been a pleasure to serve the communities of this diverse Archdeaconry and I will leave with gratitude for the immense love, faithfulness and commitment that I have encountered time and again in our churches, schools, chaplaincies and communities. I will miss great colleagues here, a superb diocesan and cathedral team, and the many leaders, lay and ordained, with whom I have worked."

Bishop Rachel encourages us all to "say one thing"

In July, the Bishop of Gloucester launched a social media campaign encouraging people to share one thing that they value in others, which is not about physical appearance.

#say1thing is part of the wider #liedentity campaign, which raises awareness of body image anxiety in young people and the pressures they face through social media to look a certain way.

Bishop Rachel is sharing with young people the message that who you are, is more than how you look. She said, "It's been amazing spending time with young people in schools as part of the #liedentity campaign. When they each tell me what they value most about someone they love or aspire to be like, it's never about appearance.

"Yet what happens on social media is completely different. Young people face a barrage of insults about what they look like and they face huge anxiety about the pictures they post, hoping for likes and then often having to deal with terrible insults. We are living in a society where our value is being determined by what we look like, rather than who we are from the inside out."

We are encouraging all people on social media to change this message by posting a picture of their friends or family and sharing one thing they value about that person with the hashtag #say1thing.

If, like me, you are beginning to feel your age and everything seems to take a great deal longer to do, then welcome to the club! The important thing is we are not alone; the sad thing is that we can begin to feel of no use any more. I've been thinking about this very seriously recently and I have come to the conclusion that this isn't true.

In Psalm 139, (well worth sitting down to read and meditate upon), the psalmist writes of his uniqueness in God's eyes and Selwyn Hughes writes this — "this psalm emphasises the fact that every single person born into the universe is unique. You don't have to try to be somebody you are somebody — with a particular life message that no other person in the universe can quite duplicate".

I thought long and hard about this and realised that God was saying to me, "OK you can no longer run around and do all the things you used to do but God wants to show you that you can do other things".

It is interesting that at this time my morning Bible readings had been about service – how could I still be of service to others? Then I thought, if I can no longer go to people why not invite them to come to me or give me a call! I am available now more than I have been for a long time, could I help people by being a good listener?

In recent months I lost my sister – the last of my near family – and had to make decisions that I found very difficult, things that hurt and made me feel guilty and I needed someone to share this with and pray about with. At a Christian retreat I found this help and it brought me such peace and as my Bible reading said yesterday, "for you have set my heart free". (Psalm 119 verse 32).

God showed me that this was something I could do. I pray that in the future my work for Him might be along these lines.

So, if you need to talk to someone or pray with someone give me a ring, come and have a cup of tea and talk.

This, I believe, is the new ministry that God is leading me to.




The fund raising weekend earlier in the year raised over £400 which helps with the cost of producing this

E-Prayers

When people face troubles for themselves, their family or friends, many - churchgoers or not - turn to prayer. There is so much evidence of its power to bring healing and wholeness, although not necessarily a cure, and also of its effectiveness when more people are praying.

From the beginnings of the Christian faith there have been groups that pray for those who ask for this to be done and for other areas of suffering or need.

In these days of pressures on time it is hard to get groups together and a modern alternative is spreading all over the Christian world. It is E-prayers, whereby individuals of faith offer to pray in their own homes for those who ask for it. We are gathering a small group together to do just this.

Naunton Village Hall

Naunton Village Hall reopened for business at the end of July following a £250,000 refit that took six months to complete. Originally built in 1937, the hall had served the community well over eight decades but was in need of complete modernisation.

With monies raised over the years from local events such as classic car rallies and food markets together with personal donations, the support of the Parish Council in raising a precept plus grants from Cotswold District Council, Tesco's, the Notgrove Trust, Somerfield Trust and the Garfield Weston Foundation, the Trustees were able to undertake a total renovation of the hall.

Although it retains, virtually, its original foot print the kitchen has been enlarged and completely re-fitted with a range cooker, industrial dishwasher and fridge; there is also the addition of a small meeting room. Insulation throughout, plus a blend of under floor and radiator gas-powered central heating ensures warmth even on the coldest days. There is new flooring throughout the hall and lounge whilst the toilets have been upgraded and modernised. The building has been redecorated throughout and the external walls rendered and painted.


