Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council held at 7.30pm on Tuesday, 18th September 2007 in the Village Hall

Present:

Cllr D Allen (Chairman), Cllrs J Parker, J Goddard and M Ogle. In attendance: S Pickard (Clerk). Members of the public: 1.

1 Apologies for Absence - Apologies were received from CCIIr J Hempsall and CIIrs H Shreeve, P Ogle and R Small and Mrs Drake (member of public).

2 Minutes of meeting held on 17th July 2007

The minutes of the above meeting were approved and signed as a true record.

3 Matters Arising

a) Environmental health issue at Vine Farm

The Clerk reported a letter had been received from Mr John Bowler at Bassetlaw District Council reiterating that the statutory responsibility for mapping of the public sewer systems lies with Severn Trent Ltd and not with the District Council (who are only obliged to keep records of the public sewers). Mr Bowler invited Parish Councillors to inspect the plans retained by his department. The Chairman commented that it would be beneficial to look at the plans before going back to Severn Trent and it was AGREED to take up the offer once Councillors were a little less busy. Cllr Goddard reported that work, as promised, had been carried out over the summer – two pipes in a 'Y' formation (one an old cast iron pipe) had been discovered and when jetted water came up the side of the kerb stones (a length had been cut out as there appeared to be nothing to connect the two). A bung had been put in the old cast iron drain and it has now been concreted in. No culvert was found. Cllr Ogle added that she had been awaiting notification from Mr Bowler concerning drainage maps. The Chairman said he felt all the Parish Council could do was to continue investigations and it was AGREED to raise the matter at next month's meeting (when Cllr Small would be present to organise a visit to inspect the maps at Bassetlaw).

b) Nottinghamshire County Council request re Back Lane

The Clerk advised an email and letter had been received from Laura Summers, the Area Rights of Way Officer. She had inspected byway No 22 on 17th August and concluded that its condition "is acceptable for this kind of public right of way" although there "were signs of rutting on a small section, but this was not serious" (photographs were enclosed). Cllr Goddard said he would talk to Ms Summers. It was also AGREED to write to Ms Summers pointing out that a request to inspect the lane was first made in February when the wet, wintry weather had had great effect on the surface. By the time the inspection was made, the surface had dried up and the grass grown. **ACTION: S Pickard.**

c) Rampton Community Forum

The Chairman referred to the meeting held on 13th September. The Parish Council was not represented at the meeting and the Chairman commented that from looking at the Minutes it would appear that the meetings were more concerned with issues regarding the Tenants' Association. The low attendance appeared to confirm this.

- i) Mr Hardy commented on the brick built building on the way to Laneham. The Chairman said this was a stable and planning permission had been obtained to erect it.
- ii) Mr Hardy said he had noticed a lot of weeds on the kerb edge in the village, unlike neighbouring villages that were clean. The Chairman said that it was up to the individual to maintain their own patch.

11 Urgent Business

- i) Cllr Parker asked why phone calls from the Neighbourhood Watch scheme were received so late on a Saturday evening. Cllr Goddard said this was due to the programming of the automatic system and he agreed to look into the matter.
- ii) Noise disturbance at Strawsons. The Chairman read out a letter received from Mr and Mrs Wray complaining about the noise going on as late as 3am and how it disturbed their sleep pattern. Also another parishioner had contacted the Chairman over the summer to register his complaint about noise. Cllr Goddard added that Mrs Mary Drake had asked if the business was now 24hr operational because there had been such an increase in night activity, involving large lorries. The Chairman added that only today he had seen two lorries coming through the village trying to get to Strawsons. It was AGREED to write to Mr Strawson to advise him of the complaints received, the effect it was having on villagers and what they could do to ensure that lorries do not come through the village. Also the Planning Department at Bassetlaw should be contacted (Mr Deakin) to request clarification on night time operations. **ACTION: S Pickard.**
- iii) Cllr Parker reported a patch of sinking tarmac on Low Street near the pumping station and she agreed to monitor the situation.
- iv) Cllr Goddard alerted the meeting that lampers were back in the area. Mr Hardy said he was aware of this and usually asked permission on their behalf to hunt rabbits on nearby land.

There being no further business, the Chairman thanked everyone for attending and declared the meeting closed at 8.45 pm.
