Road Closures/Car Park upgrade Footpath

Residents be warned! Disruption to the roads throughout the Parish will occur during the school holiday period, starting on July 24th. South East Water will be closing the Speldhurst Road in Langton Green from Lampington Row towards Speldhurst to just past Winstone Scott Avenue, in order to facilitate the laying of a new water main. This may take up to 41 days and major delays could occur. You are advised to see the details of the road closures and how it will affect the surrounding roads on the Parish Council web site www.speldhurstparishcouncil.gov.uk

Maps will also be on the Parish Council notice boards and copies will be available from the parish office and in the entrance to all village halls in the parish.

Broadband improvements

As part of the BDUK/KCC/BT broadband improvement programme, BT has installed the first fibre-technology street cabinet in the parish (at the top of Newlands in Langton Green). Look out for further work on other cabinets in the parish as BT continues its Phase-3 rollout, originally timed to take place from July to December this year.





Work will commence sometime in the near future (date to be advised) to tarmac the lower car parking areas in the village hall car park, something which is necessary due to the expansion of Langton Green Primary School. There will inevitably be some disruption to the existing car parking area while the work is being carried out.

Tree planting

Following the sad removal recently of the beautiful (but diseased) copper beech tree facing The Green in Langton, the Tunbridge Wells Borough Council tree officer is recommending a hornbeam as a replacement. The planting will be arranged by the Parish Council at the appropriate time. A yew tree will also be planted at The Hare end of The Green when the current spate of water-work repairs in the village have reached a conclusion.

'Lollipop' man

Following the sudden passing of Peter Hart recently who, as the school's 'lollipop' man at the Lampington Road crossing, was such a valuable asset to both parents and children, the school now need to recruit someone else to take over the role. Footpath clearance

With a financial contribution from the Langton Green Village Society; hard work from a number of councillors and occasional help from Kent County Council, the footpaths in the parish are just about managing to being kept clear. Because of the wet winter

The responsibility for keeping footpaths clear lies with the properties which back onto them. Please help us to keep these vital access paths open to the public. 'First Responders' are volunteers who are trained to respond to emergency calls in their local area through the 999 system, in conjunction with the UK's regional Ambulance Service NHS Trusts. They are often first on the scene and trained to administer vital, life-saving first aid treatment before the arrival of the ambulance crew.

'Trees in Village' competition

In 2012 the residents of Furzefield Avenue solicited the help of the Parish Council to bring back their avenue to the tree-lined road they used to know and love. Ten trees were planted – field maple, june berry, hawthorn and rowan and to see them today is a real pleasure. Now they have been entered in the 'Trees in the Village' competition organised by The Men Of The Trees – an organisation set up eighty years ago to encourage and care for trees all around the country. The recent project to remove all the redundant old tree guards in Shadwell Woods is also being considered as an entry in the competition.

Air traffic - update!

Most residents will have heard on the news of Gatwick Airport Ltd's proposal for a second runway. What may not be so widely known is that in addition to this, Gatwick Airport is proposing to increase capacity at the existing runway and to modify the approach and departure routes. This will impact on the parish and there is a 12 week consultation period from May 23rd for residents to pass any comments – negative or positive to Gatwick Airport Ltd.
