BUSES

New timetables for the numbers 9 and 11 buses will take effect from 30 August. We are currently awaiting the new No 11 timetable. The timetable for the No 9 has been posted inside the bus shelter outside the village hall and on both noticeboards. It seems that Stagecoach is under the impression that no-one from Monkton wants to go to Minster (or at least not expecting to come back!). The route travels from Monkton to Ramsgate via Minster, but not on the return journey, meaning that anyone who catches the bus to Minster will then have to go on to Ramsgate in order to get home!

It would appear, in many ways, that the more we improve the means of communication, the more difficult it becomes to communicate!

Time was when Banks, Building Societies, Tax Offices etc maintained local branches, where friendly human beings understood your query and dealt with it. Enquire of any of these nowadays, and you may well find yourself struggling to understand a man in a call centre overseas! At times it appears the world has retreated behind a wall of technology and it's not surprising to hear that some people nowadays actually prefer to send mojos to one another because it is easier than the fag of having to write, or talk face to face!

But wait a moment - You, dear friend, are actually reading these words on a printed page! It's good to remember that paper magazines and books still have their appeal, and newspapers have not been entirely superseded by their on-line versions. There is something quietly satisfying about holding the day's news in your hand, and being able to dip and browse at will without having to press the infernal button! Despite all our technological advances, the written word, on paper, continues to serve us, as it has done for centuries past, including the days when the scriptures first appeared. With only quills, ink and parchments, the Gospels and the letters of St Paul made their way through the ancient world with surprising speed, thanks to the 'technology' of the day – the excellent roads and the efficient postal service, both provided by the Roman Empire.

MEMORIES OF MONKTON

'Docker Hill'

Docker Hill Farm is situated in the middle of Monkton, on the right of the road leading down to the Recreation ground. I think it covers about 300 acres [about 120 hectares]. It has only been called such since about the middle of the 1970's. Prior to that it was part of the farm owned by Mr Trevor Willett and known as Parsonage Farm. Mr Peter Dyas became the tenant when the farm was sold.

If you walk the farm track, over the railway and on towards the Abbots Wall, the next to last field on your left before the wall is Docker Hill.

If we go back to the late 1960's early 1970's, you would have seen the ruins of a small brick-built house on the top of the hill. The marshes looked very different then. All of Monkton marshes were under grass and the field lay-out was very different then, as it is today.

The house, when it was still standing, housed the Shepherd and his family. No running water or electricity. A Mr Love was the last Shepherd to live there. My mother went to school with his children [I don't know how many] in the 1930's. Every day they would walk to school in all weather, changing out of their wellington boots and into shoes in the winter, and according to her they hardly ever missed a day.

Where the name comes from has been long forgotten, it may have been named after the first Shepherd to live there. All fields had names at one time. The farmer who now works the farm probably only knows the fields by their acreage size.

Spiders Seeking Love

You may have noticed an increase in the Giant House Spiders in your home recently (I know we have!). Even the smallest change in weather can affect them, so our recent heatwave would account for them coming in trying to look for refuge in dark, shady corners. Giant house spiders spin sheet-like cobwebs in neglected corners of the room and wait close by for unsuspecting insects to get caught. They are most active at night.

The giant house spider is the larger cousin of the House spider, and can be found living behind the fireplace, under the sofa, or in the bath. Giant house

spiders are particularly prevalent in the autumn when the males are out looking for females. The males stay with their chosen females for some weeks, mating numerous times until eventually they die, at which point they are eaten by their female. Female house spiders can live for several years and both males & females can survive for months without eating or drinking.



It's easy to work out the gender of a house spider (if you want to look at it for that long!). Males have longer legs

and smaller bodies. Both sexes have a set of palps – short appendages on either side of their jaws which look like little arms – but the males look like they have boxing gloves on theirs. So, it's the males that you usually see, looking for love - the females tend to stay put in their webs, hidden away.

The Giant House Spider is one of the fastest and largest spiders in Britain. It can run at a speed of around half a metre a second. Luckily I can run faster!!


