Minutes of the Parish Council meeting Halam Village Hall Thursday 8th December 2016 at 8pm

Present:

Chairman: Mr Simon Bust; Mr Andrew Paris; Mrs Janet Simmonds; Mrs Sarah Godfrey; Mr Chris Bevans; Mrs Carolyn Todd; Clerk Mr Patrick Rickett.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were signed as a true record.

Village Hall:

Cleaners - it was agreed that Mrs Todd should contact the cleaners suggested by Councillors Rainbow for a 3 month trial. This will be reviewed after that period of time.

Grant: Mrs Godfrey bought the P.C. up to date: – the funding is through WREN, and we need to send a ballpark figure and be prepared to put 10% up front; the PC suggested that £1400 would be an appropriate working figure.

It was agreed to send out a **survey** to the village with Halam News, and also put this on the village Facebook page, to find out if parishioners agree with the Parish Council's proposals and to canvass any other ideas which members of the village might like to add for consideration.

The forms need to be ready at the January meeting for any finalising and will be sent out after the February meeting.

Roads and hedges

Mr Duckworth is working on several items on behalf of the village.

Dog poo bags are being thrown into Shaws' orchard. Cllrs Jackson informed the PC that it is their right if they know definitely who the culprit is, to name and shame them in the Village news. The PC may possibly post notices on lamp-posts, and it was agreed to put a strong message in the Village news as a separate item.

Defibrillator:

It has been suggested by a member of the public that a defibrillator in the village may be a good idea. The PC backs the idea, but would be unable to fund one. Mrs Carolyn Todd and the Parish Clerk will look into this suggestion further.

Planning:

<u>Lime Tree House, Halam Hill</u> – proposed erection of 1 new dwelling. This was passed: agreed 5, with 1 abstention.

Holly House Back Lane - the householder has made an application for the erection of a conservatory to the rear of the property; - this was passed unanimously.

HALAM PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of meeting held in Halam Village Hall Thursday 12 January 2017 at 8pm.

<u>Present:</u> Chairman: Simon Bust, Glenys Herbert, Janet Simmonds, Sarah Godfrey, Chris Bevans, Carolyn Todd, Clerk:Patrick Rickett.

<u>Minutes of the previous meeting</u> were signed as a true record after amending the item re grant wording by removing the last sentence.

Village hall:

The <u>cleaners</u> are to be taken on a 3-month trial, 2 people for 1 hour, once a month for 3 months; clerk to contact them and Mrs. Herbert to monitor. This was agreed 4 in favour, 2 abstentions.

<u>Grant</u>: Some questionnaires have been received, but more responses are needed. A reminder should be put in the Village News as a separate item – that villagers should please submit the survey, online at https://surveymonkey.com/r/XR9YP75, or fill in the forms provided in support of our grant application. This will help us to succeed with the grant. It should be outlined that most of our money goes towards the mortgage and bills for the Village Hall, so the hall is deteriorating due to lack of funds. It was suggested that our contribution would be £1300 towards the grant. This was agreed unanimously.

Roads and hedges:

Parking on School Lane during school hours has been raised again; it was agreed that the clerk should write to the Headmistress, asking that staff and parents park considerately and to point out that it is a traffic offence to park close to a junction i.e. the junction at School Lane and The Turnpike.

<u>Defibrillator</u>: Mrs. Todd and the clerk are liaising on this, approximate cost will be £1000-£1500.

Finance:

- 1) It was agreed to pay the fire check £38.80 passed unanimously.
- 2) Budget an up to date budget was circulated.
- **3) Precept** agreed to raise this to £8000 to cover rising costs passed unanimously.

Meeting held: Thursday 9th February 2017 at 8pm in Halam Village Hall.

Present: Chairman Mr. Simon Bust, Mrs. Glenys Herbert; Mrs. Sarah Godfrey; Mr. Chris Bevans; Mrs. Carolyn Todd; Clerk Mr. Patrick Rickett.

<u>Minutes of the 2 previous meetings:</u> were signed as correct records.

Roads and hedges: The headmistress from Halam School sent a reply re parking, with a copy of the letter circulated to parents and staff; Parish council will continue to monitor the situation.

Cllr Laughton will look into several items including: the state of Halam Hill; the flashing lights which seem to flash at random times - this seems to be a problem with most lights; the accumulation of water outside Littledale House. He will speak to Mr. Duckworth about this and request a gulley sucker for Radley Road.

Open Meeting:

- 1) The light in the phone box is going to be repaired.
- 2) The bus shelter windows have been painted.

<u>Defibrillator</u>: Two free units have been obtained from the British Heart Foundation. One will probably be located in the phone box. A location for the second is needed. A training course will be held and volunteers are needed to look after the boxes..

This will only take 5 - 10 minutes each week. Training courses will be set up when everything has been received.

Village Hall:

<u>Village Hall bookings</u> are good –Natter at 9 is back, Bettercare have made a group booking. The Hall is booked for May 4th for elections by the County Council.

The cleaning seems to be going well. Chris Bevans has found three websites that the Hall can be advertised on for free – a new enquiry has already come from this.

<u>Grant application:</u> Mrs Godfrey informed the PC that the application is almost ready to go. She gave the PC a breakdown of the cost of the work to be done. A total of £720 in donations have been received so far, and 5 more have been offered.

The PC are putting £1300 towards the cost and it was agreed that another £500 could be made available, giving funds of £2520. With this extra available, replacement windows could be added in this was agreed unanimously.

The PC agreed that Mrs Godfrey would be the main signatory and Mr Paris would be the 2nd contact – this was agreed unanimously.

Finance: Agreed to pay – cleaners £31.00.

Matters Arising from Previous Meeting: Andrew Paris asked if there was any further information re the activities on the land opposite the entrance to St Helen's Croft. Grant for Village Hall: An application has been made for a grant of around £26,000 for essential repairs and improvements. The outcome of this application should be known by the middle of May.

Roads and Hedges: The roads have been swept recently by the District Council. County Cllr Jackson was asked to progress the cleaning out of the gulleys in the village.

Cllr Jackson was asked about resurfacing on Halam Hill – no funding is currently available, but money may be available from the new budget in May.

The road surface on the Turnpike has sunk in places where drainage work was completed two years ago (outside Strickland Farm) – Cllr Jackson to report to Highways.

Parking at the school still continues to be an issue. The new Head is aware of this and is working to alleviate the situation. The pub will be approached to see if some school staff parking could be available during the day.

A new flashing school sign is to be located by the village hall. Mrs Herbert complained that the flashing orange school lights are operating at inappropriate times – any malfunctioning of the lights should be reported to the County Council via their website or on 0300 500 80 80.

<u>Defibrillator:</u> The Parish Council has obtained two defibrillators for the use of the village. It is proposed to mount one in the old phone box, but a location for the second one is needed. Please give suggestions to Chris Bevans or other members of the parish council. Training will be needed for anyone wishing to use the equipment, this will be discussed further at next month's parish council meeting — please contact Chris Bevans or Mandy Rickett (813181) if you would like to volunteer to be trained.

Open meeting: With the changes of boundary from May onwards, County Cllr Jackson will no longer be Halam's representative at County level. The Chairman thanked Cllr Jackson for his help and

input over the past years and wished him well in the forthcoming elections

Finance:

- 1) Unanimously agreed to pay for the village hall cleaners, and the NALC subscription. Unanimously agreed to set up direct debits to pay N&S District Council bills (they no longer accept cheques).
- 2) The parish council's Standing Orders were reviewed and adopted.
- 3) The parish council's Financial Regulations were reviewed and adopted.

<u>Date of next meeting:</u> Thursday 13th April 2017 at 7pm (note earlier start) in the village hall. This will be the Annual Parish Meeting, followed by the Parish Council Meeting.

<u>Present:</u> Mr Simon Bust, Mrs Glenys Herbert, Mrs Janet Simmonds, Mr Chris Bevans, Mrs Carolyn Todd; Parish clerk Mr Patrick Rickett, Cllr. Rainbow.

<u>Minutes of the previous meeting</u> were signed as a true record.

Matters arising from the previous meeting: 1) Mrs Todd was co-opted as a Parish Councillor. 2) The water pressure is no better than last year and in some cases has got worse, – clerk to write to STWA.

Chairman's report:

It was decided to disband the Village Hall Committee and return this responsibility to the P.C. as it was not working as envisaged. Mr Bevans has put a lot of work into the Village Hall website and lettings. Mrs Herbert is keeping a check on the Hall; thanks to both were recorded. The P.C. is satisfied with the cleaners and lettings are increasing. Again we have applied for a grant for the roof – thanks to Mrs Godfrey and all those who helped with the application.

The allotments are not doing well - only 2 are let - this item to be on the agenda for the next meeting. Planning applications are fewer than before, and NSDC seem more in tune with the P.C.

Thanks were also given to the Clerk, Mrs Rickett and Financial Officer Mrs Thompson, Internal Auditor and all Parish Councillors for their work and commitment.

Finally the PC assumes as no parishioners attended they were happy with the last year.

As there was no further business the meeting closed at 7.20pm and the ordinary Parish Council meeting commenced.

Parish Council Meeting held in the Village Hall on Thursday 11th May 2017 at 8pm

<u>Present:</u> Simon Bust; Andrew Paris; Chris Bevans; Glenys Herbert; Janet Simmonds.

Election of Chair & Vice-Chair: Chair – Simon Bust, Vice-Chair – Andrew Paris; agreed unanimously.

Election of Other Officers: The following appointments were agreed unanimously: Christmas Charities – Simon Bust & Andrew Paris; Press Officer – Andrew Paris; Transport – Glenys Herbert; NALC Representative – Janet Simmonds & Carolyn Todd; Snow/Flood Warden – Simon Bust; Flag Officer – Simon Bust; Crime Reduction Officer – Andrew Paris; Internal Auditor – Marina Thompson (to be confirmed); Financial Officer – Mandy Rickett

<u>Village Hall:</u> 1) The professional cleaners will continue with monthly cleans. 2) Two heaters are to be repaired. 3) Mr Bevans reported that bookings continue to be steady, and that the two elections this year will help boost funds. 4) The yoga class will not be held on the evenings of PC meetings so these will revert to their usual time. 5) Grant for Village Hall - awaiting further news.

<u>Defibrillators</u>: It was unanimously agreed to site one defibrillator in the (redundant) phone box, and the other at the entrance to Manor Fields. Further training will be arranged at some time in the future for interested parishioners.

Roads and Hedges: 1) Some pot-holes have been filed, but a parishioner complained about the general poor state of the local roads. 2) Comment was also made about verge cutting - the grass is cut four times a year, but deeper strips are now left to help preserve wildlife and wild flowers. Grass by junctions should receive special attention. Any particular problem areas should be reported to Highways at the County Council. 3) The flashing lights at the school seem to be functioning at the wrong times -County Cllr Bruce Laughton will be asked to get this corrected. 4) A skip was recently parked in the village, which caused a few traffic issues. All skips on the highway have to be approved and licenced by County Council, - householders needing a skip are asked to be considerate in the placing of skips on the roadway. 5) Cars parked on School Lane during school hours are still causing problems. The issue has been highlighted in the school newsletter, and it was agreed that the description and registration numbers of any vehicles parked inconsiderately will be noted for further action.

Allotments: There are still some allotments available – please contact the Clerk, Pat Rickett (813181) if you are interested in taking one. In the meantime the Clerk will keep the allotments clear and tidy.

<u>Parish Council Laptop:</u> This has been bought and receipts now need to be submitted to NALC who have financed this purchase.

Open meeting: 1) Fiskerton Tip – County Cllr Roger Jackson is trying to get this re-opened. 2) Halam Community Facebook page – Chris Bevans was thanked for keeping the village informed of any suspicious activity in the area. This seems to be working as an "improved Neighbourhood Watch". 2) Affordable Homes – the Parish Council has been contacted to discuss the possibility of building six affordable homes in the village. A representative of the scheme will be invited to the next meeting

Planning: Land adjacent Cedar Lea, Radley Road: proposed erection of two 2-bed bungalows and creation of new access to highway – after much discussion the parish council were unable to come to a majority decision. It was agreed to report back to N&S District Council that the vote was split 2 in favour, 2 against (with one abstention).

<u>Finance:</u> Unanimously agreed to pay for 1) monthly cleaning. 2) Village hall insurance. 3) VAT on previously purchased road salt (VIA invoice – this VAT will be claimed back).

<u>Date of next meeting</u>: Thursday 29th June 2017 at 7.30 pm (**NB**: date change and earlier start) in the village hall. The proposal concerning six affordable homes will be discussed at this meeting – a representative of the scheme has been invited to attend.

Development of Affordable Homes in Halam?

Following on from Housing Needs Survey conducted in 2012, Newark & Sherwood District Council have identified the need for affordable homes in Halam and Edingley.

NSDC have identified a potential site in Halam which would be suitable for six or seven affordable homes. Preference would be given to local residents to live in these houses.

A representative of the scheme, Jill Sanderson from Newark & Sherwood will be coming to the next Parish Council meeting to outline the potential scheme – all members of the public are most welcome to attend.

The meeting will be at 7.30pm on Thursday 29th June in the village hall.
