Parish Council Report

MPC thoughts have turned to the May elections when a new parish council will be voted in along with our local district councillors. Of the current parish only two councillors are committed to standing for a second term, which means Moulsford will need three more councillors. If you are aged 18+ and interested in the opportunity to give some time and representation to your community but would like more insight to what it actually involves, please get in touch with any of the councillors or the clerk. All our contact details are on the back of Moulsford News.

In January we finalised our budget for 2023-24. This is later and took longer than previous years due to a number of issues. Firstly, the cost-of-living crisis with inflation currently running at over 10%, impacting us all and for MPC specifically the services we use. Secondly, we have had to dip into our reserves for some essential pavilion maintenance this year as the Pavilion usage and income has not yet returned to pre-pandemic levels. Also, the cost of running elections (parish and district) adds a significant cost to our budget, but is essential to ensure our parish keeps its independent voice. Finally, increased popularity of dog walking in Moulsford, particularly along the Thames Path, means we want to fund another bin for dog waste, but the cost for the collection has been increasing way more than inflation over the last couple of years.

All this means that, for the first time in 3 years, we have asked for an increase to our precept which will equate to an average of £10 per household per annum. It may be of interest to note that our precept will still be low in comparison to similar local parishes as Moulsford has always been able to rely on help from our many volunteers and local schools.

We have had positive responses to our proposal for a Moulsford Hundred Club (MHC) which will specifically raise funds for village projects whilst also providing some regular fun at Friday Night Socials and Wednesday Coffee Shops as we intend to split the draws between these two staples of village life. If you would like to be part of setting up the MHC please get in touch with the clerk or any of the councillors.

Wishing you all the best for 2023 and hope to see some of you – particularly if you are thinking of standing for the PC at the next election – at our remaining council meetings.

What is a Parish Councillor - Sue Powell

I joined the Parish Council autumn 2021, being co-opted on when another member stepped down. I was already familiar with some of the work in the Parish Council, as my husband, Miles was involved with it for many years, and I was a bit apprehensive as to how I would get on. However, I was motivated to stand, like many Parish Councillors, to represent a specific issue – being a firm believer in if you don't agree with something, get involved to help resolve it! In my case, this was maintaining river access for everyone at the end of Ferry Lane.

Just over a year on, I have realised how slowly some things move in local government compared with business and have not yet achieved all that I would have liked to. However, I also have a better understanding of just how important the council is to the running of this village and what can be achieved with enthusiastic and committed councillors.

I have felt supported and encouraged by the other members of the Parish Council and am lucky enough to have been involved in all sorts of things during my time on the council, including most recently the Village Neighbourhood Planning statement (yes, it was me who sent out all the questionnaires) and the website (still in progress). It's a chance to be involved in village life and a way to keep Moulsford special.

Without people stepping forward to take part in the council, we would be amalgamated with Cholsey ward and lose control over much of our autonomy, including planning, the Pavilion, and social events. So, as we near the end of the term for the current council, with many of the council stepping down, I would urge you to consider getting involved to ensure Moulsford continues to thrive.

After a busy Christmas, work has resumed on the Neightbourhood Planning Statement and we hope to be able to present our recommendations to the village late Feb/early March. Cost of Living

Household Support Fund 3 opens in January

The council is opening a third round of the Household Support Fund in January to support households who can't afford essentials over the winter months. Support will be tailored to individual needs but will focus on food and fuel vouchers. Details of eligibility will be published on our Cost-of-Living website pages. Rough Sleeping and Housing Support

The Council is receiving growing numbers of reports of people rough sleeping in the District and we can expect these numbers to increase further. Our Housing Team are expert at supporting people who are homeless or are at risk of homelessness and our Council follows the Housing First approach: first provide people with a roof over their heads and additional support follows. Homes for Ukraine: discretionary £500 payment for hosts

A one-off emergency discretionary support payment of £500 will be offered to hosts under the Homes for Ukraine scheme where we identify a significant and urgent need. The payments will be made directly to guests through our Community Hub in the form of a cash or retail voucher depending on their needs and circumstances.

This is not an automatic additional payment to all guests, and it won't be made where other schemes/funds are available to assist the guest e.g. housing deposits. If you come across anyone who needs help, please direct them to <u>email our Community Hub</u> or call them on 01235 422600.

New measures to tackle Bird Flu

The government has introduced <u>mandatory measures to help prevent the spread of Bird Flu this winter</u>. Bird keepers are now required to keep all poultry and captive birds indoors and to follow stringent biosecurity measures, regardless of type or size. People are advised to follow <u>this guidance</u> and <u>latest information</u> to ensure birds are being housed indoors safely.

Draft National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF)

Just before Christmas the government published its long-awaited prospectus for revising the NPPF for consultation and the link is here.

The consultation ends on 2 March 2023. The government says it will respond to this consultation by Spring 2023, publishing the framework revisions as part of this, with a view to making policy changes take effect as soon as possible.

Time to plan the right future for our districts

South Oxfordshire and Vale of the White Horse District Councils have agreed a revised timetable for the creation of their Joint Local Plan, which seeks to deliver the councils' ambitions for zero-carbon, sustainable development and genuinely affordable homes in the districts up to the year 2041.

The plan's timetable had previously been scheduled around the creation of the Oxfordshire Plan 2050 – a county-wide plan being produced by all of Oxfordshire's planning authorities, which would have set housing numbers and decided the broad locations for larger-scale developments. The five Oxfordshire councils were unable to reach agreement on the approach to planning for future housing needs and so they mutually agreed that it was best to end work on the county-wide plan. While continuing to cooperate the councils will tackle all these issues locally through their own Local Plans.

The Cabinets at South and Vale have therefore both agreed to adjust the timetable for their Joint Local Plan work, to allow time to carry out local versions of the work that would have been carried out as part of the Oxfordshire Plan 2050. The new timetable for the Joint Local Plan allows South and Vale to assess the need for housing at a local level. It also allows both councils to shape and develop even stronger policies on climate and ecological action that could lead the way nationally.

Work to understand local views on the future of the districts has already begun. In May 2022, both councils launched a <u>joint consultation using interactive maps</u> and an easy-to-use survey that was met with a great response. This innovative approach has been praised by government as an exemplar for other authorities to use.

The new timetable is a renewed focus on housing that is appropriate for our district and the councils will work with communities and leave space in the planning policy framework for neighbourhood plans to make decisions that are right for their areas recognising that it is important for our residents that their communities come first. It also gives councils more time to be much more robust when talking important issues like the climate emergency. The Councils will still be able to use much of the collaborative work produced as part of the Oxfordshire Plan 2050, as well as the Oxfordshire Strategic Vision that sets a series of guiding principles for 'good growth'.

Both councils agreed the revised timeline for the Joint Local Plan at Cabinet meetings in December as part of an item to update the Local Development Scheme (LDS), which sets out what the development plan consists of and contains the timetable for the production of the new Joint Local Plan. The full LDS is available on the South Oxfordshire District Council website.

Community Infrastructure Levy Charging Schedule

South Oxfordshire District Council has formally adopted its revised <u>Community Infrastructure Levy</u> (CIL) Charging Schedule, which came into effect on 3 January 2023. The updated schedule will increase the amount of CIL developers are required to pay on new development and introduces a levy for developments including student housing, build to rent housing and elderly person's accommodation which are currently exempt from charges.

The revised Developer Contributions <u>Supplementary Planning Document</u> (SPD) will also come into effect on 3 January to support the updated CIL Charging Schedule and provide further guidance on how the Council will secure developer contributions through section 106 agreements.

Nearly £900,000 given to local communities for local improvements

South Oxfordshire District Council has released almost £900,000 to help pay for local community improvements in the district in the six months April-October 2022. The funds came from a Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) — money that's collected from developers as a condition of their planning permission to build new homes in the area.

Since April, the district council has paid out £870,440 to local councils that have new developments built in their parishes. £847,945 of CIL funding was identified in the district council's performance report for their first financial quarter, and since its publication, a further £22,495 has been given to Warborough Parish Council after new homes were built in the village. New Housing Delivery Strategy and Plan for More Affordable Homes

This is an exciting one for our administration and will see us building momentum behind council and community housing schemes.

A new housing delivery strategy and action plan was agreed by Cabinet Members at South Oxfordshire District Council at a meeting earlier this month. As part of the plans, the council hopes to deliver some of their own social housing in the future to help residents on lower incomes access safe and secure affordable housing.

The delivery strategy will also help the council's aims to tackle the climate emergency to reduce carbon emissions by encouraging developers to use sustainable materials while building well-designed energy efficient housing. It also aims to encourage housing providers and residents to access grant funding to help retrofit their homes to reduce their carbon footprint.

The action plan will look at how the council can help community led housing initiatives to build new homes and, where appropriate, provide grant funding and developer contributions to help make the schemes financially viable.

This builds on the work the council has already done to provide funds to support new homes. Earlier this year the council gave £1.2 million towards the cost of creating new affordable housing in Henley and Thame. In Wheatley, 12 zero carbon affordable homes are set to be built with help from the council. Along with the strategy a further £2m in capital funds was approved to go towards council housing. New approach for community health and well-being

A new strategy has been adopted introducing a new approach to health and wellbeing developed by both South Oxfordshire and Vale of the White Horse District Councils, to help their residents come together to take part in sport, health and recreational activities that improve their physical and mental wellbeing, while forging stronger social links within the local communities.

We are pleased to report that the Park and Charge scheme that put 124 electric vehicle chargers in 10 of the council-run car parks across both districts has won an excellence award, called an "Evie". Evidence is showing that the charging bays are being used more and more; our foresight in installing infrastructure before demand outstrips supply has been widely praised.

New tree roles for the councils

We have collaborated with the other Oxfordshire local authorities to create two new community tree and woodland planting roles. The two new recruits will work to increase tree cover across the county through training volunteers and community woodland creation activities.

With walks from half a mile to twelve miles plus long, and a note of suitability for pushchairs and wheelchairs, everyone can find a walk to enjoy.





Tree Time


Hello all and welcome back to another Tree Time Interview.

I am MEGA excited about this article, because I am doing the Giant Redwood tree!

This tree, (In Latin it is Sequoiadendron Giganteum) is humongous, and known to be the biggest tree in the world out of trees already discovered. So let's get started! Bottom to top this time.

So starting with its huge trunk; the bark can be very thick, up to 30 cm, so roughly 1 foot, and quite soft and fibrous. It has an unusual bright red-brown color when freshly exposed. Hence the name 'Redwood'.




