#### 'My head is still in the clouds'

August saw local resident Louise Stewart join a group of professional Wingwalkers called AeroSuperBatics and fulfil a decades-held ambition to take to the skies for her first Wingwalk and raise funds for our local hospice.

Following a safety briefing and instructions on how to climb onto the aeroplane, she found herself standing upright on the second wing, strapped in with bolts. She was given signals to use to communicate with the pilot. And then the engine roared, the propellor whirred, and the 1940s Boeing Stearman biplane bumped along the grass, before suddenly she was airborne and travelling at speeds which reached 120mph.

She describes it as exhilarating, as the plane worked with the force of the wind and tilted her from side to side, rendering her weightless for a few seconds as it dipped down and then whooshed upwards. The pilot dipped the wings so that the waving crowds below could see her, and she could appreciate the breathtaking views of the countryside below. Even dodging the flies as they collided with her goggles did not detract from the amazing experience, which lived up to her long-held expectations. After about ten minutes in the sky, the pilot put on the smoke trail behind her for the grand finale, reassuringly warning her, 'You're not on fire'!

Louise used her event to raise funds for the Prospect Hospice in Wroughton, a local organisation that she already supports which provides vital end of life care. She raised the grand total of £1,255, and paying for the Wingwalk herself, means that every penny from sponsorship, the quiz night at the Inn with the Well and the raffle with prizes donated from local businesses will go to the Prospect. Louise says a huge thank you to everyone whose generosity contributed to this fantastic sum.

She particularly wants to thank Rachel and Martin Stannard for creating entertaining and unique quiz rounds, notably on famous and infamous Police Officers, as well as the 'Wings of Prospect' which cleverly wove in questions about wingwalking as well as the Prospect. Her thanks also go to Megan and Mike Shaw for hosting the quiz and serving the tasty half-time hot dogs. Congratulations to Team 'Late Again' who were first time quiz winners after a small 'Stewart's Enquiry' (!), and last but by no means least, a shout out to Mark Bevan, whose generous auction bid nailed the colossal 5kg jar of chilli jam! We hope that wasn't too hot to handle.
