Resolved at the full meeting of Thornhackett Parish Council on 17.05.2023

Thornhackett Parish Council associates itself with Dorset Council, who declared a Climate Emergency on 16.05.2019*, and all the other local authority and other organisations, in declaring a Climate and Ecological Emergency and hereby declares a Climate and Ecological Emergency (CEE) and resolves to:

- 1. Commit to becoming where practicable a carbon neutral organisation in all that we do directly by 2030. To this end a plan of action in collaboration with our community is to be created.
- 2. Include consideration of environmental implications when assessing any action proposed to be taken by the Parish Council or any planning application submitted by other parties.
- 3. Seek ways to encourage and facilitate our community in reducing direct and indirect CO2 emissions.
- 4. Increase our community's resilience to the effects of the changing climate.
- 5. **What we aim to do**: Commence a Community Action Plan with a Working Group.

Take active steps where possible to encourage:

- (a) More sustainable use of transport
- (b) Reductions in energy use
- (c) Co-operation with organisations seeking to develop low carbon and community-led affordable housing
- (d) Production and sale of locally sourced food
- (e) Elimination of the use of pesticides
- (f) Any other appropriate actions that may be identified from time to time including adding this declaration to form an intrinsic part of The Parish Councils working progress.

Next steps:

- 1. Add the declaration to the Parish Councils Duty of Consideration
- Identify the Declaration on the Parish Council Website. Set up a section on the website for Climate Change and Natural Environment to distribute information for the community.
- 3. Set up a Working Group to consider and develop an action plan in consultation with the community.
