

We're having another 'Phil' the Bag fundraising collection!

'Phil' the Bag

Yes, our next event is another 'Phil The Bag' day, which will take place on **Sunday 18th October**, when we invite you to bring any old clothes, shoes, belts, bags and soft furnishings to the Village Hall in plastic bags/sacks between 10.30 and 12.00 and, if you like, stay for tea, biscuits and a natter with whoever else turns up.

We arrange for 'Phil' to collect the unwanted items - which are either re-sold cheaply in developing countries or the material re-cycled - and the Hall receives a very useful payment. (Note: very heavily soiled clothes, carpets, bedding items like pillows & duvets, and left-over off-cuts of material can't be accepted, I'm afraid.)

In the past, these events have turned into very sociable occasions - an opportunity to catch up with others in the village that you might not see on a regular basis. So, please, save your old textile products, etc. until the day, and do come along for a cuppa and a chat.

How do we use the money we raise from our various events, you might ask. Well, we have unavoidable outgoings, of course, like electricity & water bills, insurance and general maintenance, but any surpluses go to improving the Hall facilities. Most recently we have bought additional small tables (so we can extend the standard ones to accommodate larger groups for our meals and other events) and we have acquired a number of railway sleepers, which we will use to retain the soil in the planted area to the left of the Hall, in an attempt to neaten it and keep the fire exit route clear. Future plans include installing dimmable lights in the Hall, to improve the ambiance at evening social events. So do, please help us to keep up the good work, for the benefit of our lovely village!

Please do look at my fund-raising page if you have time. Any amount that you can spare will help to continue to provide wigs to children. The address is:



As usual, I try and keep my recipes very simple. You could not get more simple than this tasty Summer dessert recipe.

Mint Choc Chip Ice Cream Pie

8 oz chopped chocolate, melted
4 cups of Rice Krispies
2 pints mint chocolate-chip ice cream, slightly softened

1. In a large bowl, combine the melted chocolate and cereal until the cereal is completely coated. Transfer to a 9-inch spring form pan. Press the mixture into the bottom and 1 inch up the sides of the pan. Freeze until just firm, (5 to 10 minutes).
2. Spread the ice cream in the prepared crust and freeze, covered, until firm, for at least 2 hours and up to 3 days.

WINDOWS 10 – What’s it all about?

According to Microsoft this is the “The best Windows ever”, if you are using Windows 7 and 8 and haven’t reserved a copy of Windows 10, go to: <http://www.microsoft.com/en-gb/windows>.

You will also be able to click on a link to find out more about the new features or play a video to see what is being offered. In summary:



- 1) **Start Menu** - The Windows 7 Start Menu is back and overlays the Windows 8 Start Screen, making it easier for you to find what you need.
- 2) **Security** – 3 new features:
 - **Device Guard** – which is aimed at blocking attacks by vetting applications that try to access a Windows 10 machine.
 - **Windows Hello** - a password-killer feature that uses biometrics (your face, iris, or your fingerprint) to launch Windows 10 devices. This is only available if you have a device with a fingerprint reader and scanning software and hardware for the infrared technology.
 - **Passport** - Windows 10 will ask you to verify that you have possession of your device before it authenticates on your behalf, with a PIN or Windows Hello (see above).
- 3) **Cortana** - the digital Personal Assistant. It works across your day and your devices to help you get things done, sending reminders at the right time and place.
- 4) **Microsoft Edge** - an all-new browser that’s built to give you a better web experience. Write (hardware dependent) or type notes directly on WebPages and share them with others, read online articles free of distraction, and save your favourite reads for later access.

Christian Message August 2015 - Loneliness

The sun is shining, the sky is a cloudless blue, the countryside has a luxuriant growth of fresh green leaves, the gardens are ablaze with the colour of roses, and the birds are singing so exuberantly it's difficult to hear oneself speak. And yet I feel constrained to write about loneliness!

Why is this, I ask myself? Perhaps it's because I've attended rather a number of funerals in the last few weeks and it has been brought home to me how many people around are lonely.

The latest census revealed that some 34% of the population live alone. There are various reasons – bereavement, marriage break down and divorce, loss of jobs, and homelessness.

Some people, of course, live alone from choice and enjoy their own company and don't ever feel lonely.

There is a big difference between being alone and loneliness. People can be in a crowd and feel lonely, or in an unhappy marriage and be lonely. If we look around there are many in our midst who live alone and suffer from loneliness. The people who cope best are those who get involved in their communities, take up new hobbies and occupations, make new friends or take on charitable work – but however active they are, the feeling of loneliness at the end of the day is never entirely diminished.

How many people, enjoying the companionship of home life, stop and wonder what it might be like to live alone?

For the bereaved, particularly those who have lost husband or wife, they are suddenly hit with the knowledge that they are now alone. All the things they did together, all the household jobs they apportioned out, all the joys and pleasures of the life they shared, have been taken away, and suddenly they find themselves alone, living in an empty house with no one to talk to. The grief is huge to begin with and though it lessens a little as time goes by – the loneliness comes back at the most unexpected times – sometimes when illness or depression looms or when some incident in daily life causes difficulties.

As time goes by you go on holiday, spend a happy weekend away or go out for an enjoyable evening with friends – and then come back to an empty house with no one to talk to. Does this ring a bell?

You feel unwell and wish there was someone around to look after you, or you hurt yourself and wish there was someone to give you a comforting hug.

You have problems with your children and wish you had a spouse with you to share the problem.

You go to church and have a happy morning worshipping God and sharing your faith with fellow Christians – and then go home alone for lunch knowing that most of the congregation are going back to family and friends.

I could go on and on. I am sure what I have said resonates with many.

There are so many people around us living lonely lives and yet we don't always notice. In the Bible, in Proverbs, we find this verse: 'An anxious heart weighs a man down but a kind word cheers him up.' Simple acts of kindness can bring good cheer - a phone call, a knock on the door to say hello, or a smile as we pass in the street. And we can always say a prayer asking God to be with them as they return to their empty house,

For remember, there is someone we can always call on – Jesus Christ. His final words before His ascension were, 'I will be with you always to the end of time.'
