PUBLIC SESSION (SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDERS)

Street Lamp at Church Piece.

Contractors will charge £150.00 to inspect light. EDF have been informed that the light is inoperative. Cllr Edmonds informed the Parish council that street lighting was one of their formal responsibilities.

The branches at Church Piece will not be cut by AVDC. British Telecom will trim branches if they interfere with telephone wires.

Village Hall indicator sign. The Village Hall Management Committee will meet on 1st October and discuss possibilities. A Brown indicator sign will cost £ 500.00
