## VILLAGE HALL EXTENSION GETS THE GO-AHEAD

The Village Hall Management Committee are delighted to announce that, due in no small measure to the efforts of their Secretary, Iris Osborne, they have successfully secured sufficient grant funding to allow us to proceed with the work to extend and re-equip the Hall kitchen. With the aid of a grant from the KCC Kitchen Hall Fund and additional grants from the KCC Members Grant Fund secured by our two KCC Councillors, we have sufficient secured to allow work on the extension to start in July this year.

As many of you may know, the current Village Hall was built as a replacement for the old wooden structure which proved beyond repair when attempting to modernise it with the addition of a small kitchen and toilets. The new Hall was funded with a lot of help from TDC, and has served us well for nearly 30 years. As part of that construction it was necessary to install a septic tank in the front of the Hall (just where we want to extend the kitchen). This tank was never actually used, as the then Water Board provided mains drainage to the Village at that time, avoiding the need for it, but it is still in situ, and creates complications for the builders and their ability to dig new foundations.

Time has now come to update and modernise with a kitchen meeting current food hygiene and preparation needs. However, sadly, the work will take some months to complete, and will cause inconvenience to users of the Hall. We can only apologise, and promise that every effort will be made to minimise the inconvenience and disruption. It is likely that the small wall on the boundary to the Street will need to be demolished to allow off-road parking for skips, cement lorries etc. To access the site we may have to ask users to enter the hall via the Fire Door or Small Extension to avoid coming too close to the working area. We can only hope that these small inconveniences will be amply rewarded by an improved Hall fit for the current and future needs of the Village

Our thanks go to Phil Dadds for drawing up the plans, and to all the others who have contributed to achieving this important stage in the evolution of the Hall.

#### CROWN & SCEPTRE - AN UPDATE

Most of you will know that the current owner/developer applied for planning permission to demolish this historic building, which TDC quite rightly refused. In December 2017 the developer was given notice to reinstate the building and replace the roof. He subsequently lodged an Appeal to the Planning Inspectorate at Bristol.

At the original Planning Committee meeting in February 2015 the developer asserted that the facia of the building would be retained and, although they could demolish if they wished, they had no intention of doing so. The March 2015 Planning Approval included a clause for its retention.

The Kent Association of Local Councils, on behalf of Acol Parish Council, kindly acquired advice from a Legal Consultant, who mainly confirmed that the developer is in Breach of Conditions which should be enforced by TDC, and for which there is no right of Appeal.

Acol Parish Council have responded to the Appeal, pointing out to the Planning Inspector that the alleged deterioration of the building has been caused by the deliberate removal of the property's roof and susequent exposure to the elements since March 2017. In addition we pointed out some of the erroneous statements and factual inaccuracies within the Appeal.

Sir Roger Gale has also written to the Inspector in support of our response, having taken the time to inspect the site at the end of April to see its continuing neglect and derelict condition.

The end date for responses is  $9^{th}$  May, so we will hear the result some time after that.
