

March Group Meeting Report

ollowing the brief AGM, the group was privileged to have Sian Woodward give us an insight into Parliament and its workings. Having worked in the Houses of Parliament for many years Sian has now risen to becoming one of the clerks who sit in front of the speaker. The role of clerk goes back many hundreds of years. In addition to these duties which include advising the speaker on such matters as the House standing orders, another of her tasks is running the Table Office. This involves scheduling of questions members wish to raise. In the past she has worked on many of the select committees which are established to scrutinise ministers and the actions of their departments.

She then outlined in more detail the composition of the two houses, with the Commons comprising 365 conservative, 199 Labour 47 SNP, with the balance making 650 in total from minor parties. 'The Other House', as the house of Lords is referred to, now contains nearly 800 members including 26 Archbishops – the only ones to have arms to their seats to save embarrassment if they nod off after a good lunch!

Adding a more personal slant to her talk, Sian mentioned that contrary to most peoples perception she is a Crown employee. As she was working in Parliament at the time, she and her husband were able to get married in the beautiful St Marys Undercroft chapel, which is set down below the Great St Stephens Hall. One of her most memorable experiences occurred on her first day, when just 21. With real trepidation she was taken into the members dining room to be greeted warmly by none other than Tony Benn. Another moment she shared occurred when she was still very junior and was tasked with counting members entering into one of the lobbies, each being recorded by name. One notable face she did not recognise was Tony Blair – her excuse being that he was not often seen in the lobbies as he rarely voted.

At the end of her informative talk Sian welcomed and covered a diverse range of questions.
