Greetings to all of you in what has been a most extraordinary week. Although you will be reading this as the month moves from September to October, I am writing towards the beginning of

September. The things that have taken place during these last few days have been so momentous that they must not pass without comment. They invite reflection if we are to make sense of how we are feeling, so let's begin. And what better place to begin than with a few verses from the Bible. Lamentations, Chapter 3 verses 22 and 23 tell us that 'the steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is his faithfulness."

At the beginning of this week we had a Queen and no prime Minister. By the end of the week we had a new Prime Minister and a King. Although the death of Queen Elizabeth II was by no means unexpected, it still came as a great shock when it happened. Suddenly we were all plunged into a scenario of instability, of discontinuity and of change. For all of us, the Queen had been a constant presence in a changing world and her death brought disruption to the natural flow of our lives. How are we to process what has taken place? The Church finds itself in the season of harvest at the moment, and I wonder if we might begin to make sense of the death of the Queen if we view it partially through the lens of harvest.

After the harvest, the fields look bare, stripped of their produce. There is an emptiness. But before long, the sowing will begin and eventually new crops will appear. The seasonal cycle follows the same pattern with leaves falling in the autumn rendering the trees bare, but before long, the new buds appear and the trees spring into life. New life with all its promise has begun to take shape.

Today, the new King, Charles III, was proclaimed throughout the Commonwealth. Although we continue to mourn the death of Queen Elizabeth who meant so much to so many, we celebrate the new beginning that is symbolized by the accession to the throne of the new monarch. And underpinning everything in this time of change is the steadfast love of the Lord who watches over us, who continues to guide and support us. His mercies never cease; great is his faithfulness.



LETTER FROM HEREFORD FOR OCTOBER

At the time of going to print there was no Parish Newsletter available from the diocesan team, but we hope you may enjoy this instead, from their website.

The Wood Wide Web

Autumn colours will be adding a touch of drama to our trees in the next few months. But while the scientific world has understood for 100's of years why these leaf colour changes take place - it has only recently been discovered that amazing things are happening under the soil too...

Described by some scientists as a 'wood wide web' studies have found that trees are connected to each other through underground fungal networks where they communicate and share water and nutrients with each other in times of need. For example, if they are under attack by insects they will send distress signals to other trees which then have time to alter their own behaviour to protect themselves better. Trees living connected together in forests have far longer lives than isolated trees

Studies at the University of British Columbia in Vancouver have shown that particular trees in a forest use their deep roots to draw up water and make it available to shallow-rooted seedlings. These same trees also detect distress signals from other trees and increase the flow of nutrients to support them.

Until recently the western world has generally thought of trees as striving individuals, disconnected from each other and competing for limited resources such as water, nutrients and sunlight. Now, with an ever increasing body of scientific evidence, this idea is being replaced with one where trees have evolved to live in interdependent, co-operative relationships. A woody wonderland indeed...

Seeing the world through Klara's eyes is an interesting commentary on our rapidly changing environment. Rosemary Shepherd



Notes to the accounts for the year 2021 and comments on 2022

In 2021 we lost the income from printing the 49er and this is the first full year of using outside printers. In addition due to the pandemic we spent more on postage as we posted out the February and March edi-

For 2022 we increased the cost of our advertisements – both boxed and small. The subscription amount remained at £7per annum. The total number of magazines required currently stands at 375. However this includes complimentary copies such as those put in the churches and the archives so not all of these are paid for and we always make sure to have a few spares to cater for new requests, so 380 is currently the usual number ordered. (Andrea added that extra were printed for the Diamond Jubilee.) As advised at the last AGM the bank is now charging us £5 a month service charge. They are also charging us £0.40 for each cheque paid in. I regret I did not spot this at the time. The current cost of having the magazine printed is approximately £1 but for the last 3 months, following a price rise, the printers have made it easier for us to keep costs down by choosing some pages to be black and white within a colour publication. The balance at the bank on 15th July 2022 was £11,617.66.

Editor's comments

Following the first year of using commercial printers, our income is covering expenses with a little to spare. However, printing costs rose from May onwards this year due to the increased costs of ink and paper, but the printers have been very accommodating and are now allowing us to choose to have two black and white pages printed on one A3 sheet This is causing more editorial work but the early indications are that it is proving a big help in keeping the price down without having a great impact on the guality of the magazine. The current balance is slightly higher this year despite the increased printing costs.
