Friday 21 May 2021 – a date for your diary

Exciting news! – We plan to commence our Friday socials a little earlier than planned. Our first social of the year shall be on **Friday 21 May 2021.**

As with many things over the last year – our Friday Social Events shall be a 'little different', certainly until full lockdown restrictions are relaxed. This means measures being implemented to meet Covid 19 requirements for the safety of all. The measures we need to adhere to shall be clearly posted on each evening.

The social events shall be 'outside only' other than for controlled access to toilet facilities and so these events shall be weather dependent.

Villagers shall need to record their attendance for track and trace purposes. We shall have tables available for groups (a maximum of 6 people or two households) and drinks shall be ordered via one or more hatches, depending on the number of attendees. The order shall then be delivered to a separate table for pick-up.

A 'Covid marshal' shall be on duty to ensure relevant distancing measures are adhered to and ensure regular sanitisation of surfaces. Please do not take offence if you are reminded to maintain relevant social distancing measures and it shall be necessary for you to stay within your group.

It is great that we will be able to meet up with friends again in our wonderful village. Please do try and join us, but please do help us to ensure that everyone remains safe and that all measures are followed.

Parish Council Report

The last month has seen a lot of activity within the village that has required the attention of the Parish Council. For those who enjoy a range of different tasks and topics then the life of a parish councillor is for you. For example, this month we have:

- Co-ordinated the Moulsford village response to the death of HRH Prince Philip via the village website (<u>www.moulsford-pc.org.uk</u>) and Facebook pages
- Continued to develop the short and long-term plans for the recreation ground
- Worked with the pavilion management and events committees to understand and interpret the rules and guidance for re-opening the pavilion and planning the first social activities under Covid restrictions
- Undertaken a series of meetings and exchanges of correspondence with the various authorities to maintain public access to the river
- Responded to planning applications both within Moulsford and those that might have a impact on the village, such as the proposed Transitional Energy Plant (mini power station) between South Stoke and Goring.

The guidance and assistance of Geoff Twibell, our Parish Clerk, is essential in helping us keep up with the steady stream of information from the local authorities. Unusually, our current councillors all work and must juggle PC matters around our work and family commitments. This has been particularly challenging during the recent lockdowns. However, we all volunteered so it must be fun!

One topic that is on the PC agenda is whether Moulsford would benefit from creating a neighbourhood plan. Currently, Moulsford is defined as a "Smaller Village" by the planning authorities and, along with being within the North Wessex Downs AONB, this provides some protection against large developments.

Preparing a neighbourhood plan gives communities direct power to develop a shared vision for their neighbourhood and shape the development and growth of their local area. Communities like Moulsford can choose to set planning policies through a neighbourhood plan that forms part of the development plan used in determining planning applications. For example, communities can define where they want new homes, shops and offices to be built, have their say on what those new buildings should look like and what infrastructure should be provided, and grant planning permission for the new buildings they want to see go ahead. Neighbourhood planning provides a powerful set of tools for local people to plan for the types of development to meet their community's needs and where the ambition of the neighbourhood is aligned with the strategic needs and priorities of the wider local area.

The PC are currently looking at the benefits that Moulsford could receive by having our own neighbourhood plan. There is support available from SODC and many local towns and villages have taken advantage of this in making their decisions and preparing their plans. One thing that is clear is that it is an extensive task that requires a lot of consultation within the parish – it is a neighbourhood plan and not a Moulsford PC plan and will require the formation of a village task force. We will continue our investigation but, in the meantime, if anyone is interested in helping with this process or simply wants more information, please contact a member of the PC.

From the Vicar

My Dear Friends,

This is the time of year when our churches have their annual meetings. I always feel that these meetings are a bit like pausing at a view point on a long hilly walk, when we have an opportunity to look back over where we have come from, to look forward at the way ahead and to take stock of our fitness and provisions.

This year, like all of us, we are looking back over a very challenging stage of the journey during the last 12 months, and especially the last part during this later winter lockdown, which seems to have been particularly arduous. It's no surprise that many are feeling very tired and weary. More encouragingly, the next stage of the journey looks easier: the sun has come out and the relaxing of lockdown restrictions not only makes the path easier to negotiate, but means we are more likely to be able to travel along at least some of it in the company of friends and family.

It is good too at this point to check up on those who are most vulnerable. We may feel ready to forge ahead, but not everyone else will feel that way. Christians believe that we have a heavenly Father who knows and cares about our deepest needs and sorrows and who promises to be with us every step of the way. And if you are wondering where He is, keep your eyes open, for He often shows that love by sending us human 'angels' to give us comfort, help and encouragement. In fact, many will say that they have been seen in action much more during the last year!




