Moulsford Parish Council elections are scheduled to take place on Thursday 4th May 2023.

Moulsford Parish Council has 5 Councillor positions, we know that at least 2 of the current council will not stand this time.

Moulsford needs more people to step up to ensure we have local representation and to help maintain our well-kept village.

# **Moulsford Needs You!**

On Thursday, 4th May 2023, everyone aged 18 or over who is eligible will have the chance to vote in the district council and parish council elections.

New for this election is the requirement to show photo ID when voting at the polling station. A range of photo ID will be accepted, including passports, driving licences, disabled parking blue badges and cards with a PASS Mark.

If you don't have an accepted form of photo ID, you can apply for a free vote ID document, known as a Voter Authority certificate; you must do so by 5pm on 25 April in order to vote in this election. More information is available from: www.electoralcommission.org.uk/voterID

#### **Parish Council Report**

We're now into the run up to district and parish council elections in May which means this particular MPC will cease and, if we have enough candidates standing, a new parish council will be formed to take us forward. Moulsford needs at least three candidates to be able to form a council, but ideally 5 or more so we have a full council.

In the meantime, the parish council carries on as normal.

This past month has seen a success at SODC Planning Committee for MPC where our objection has been upheld due to harmful impact on the character and landscape setting of the village within the NWD AONB (P22/S4300). As the recommendation of the Planning Officer was to grant the application, it was pleasing to have our local view considered and planning permission refused by a majority on the committee. It also serves as a timely reminder with the parish election looming, that local representation has influence and does, indeed, matter.

We were further reminded how much planning issues interest our small community at the second meeting for the Neighbourhood Priority Statement. This was well-attended and our draft statement along with updated information on this pilot scheme providing food for thought and some interesting comments. There is a need for further consultation on this document, Clir Powell will continue to provide updates.

MPC100Club is progressing, but there's still plenty to do before we can hold our first draw. We have the necessary certification to run a "Small Lottery" and we are working through the constitution for the committee, the rules, the format and finally the launch! P23/S0443/HH - Old Bakery Cottage Moulsford OX10 9JD

It was unanimously approved by the Parish Council that no strong views.

P23/S0521/LB - Cranford House School Moulsford OX10 9HT (listed building consent)

It was unanimously approved by the Parish Council to Object over concerns to traffic generation caused by the number of small scale developments. There is also a concern over what the school has planned within its published existing 5yr plan, which MPC have not been consulted on. In addition there is a subsequent ongoing accumulative worsening of congestion, traffic generation and parking concerns resulting from previous development.

Hello and welcome back my fellow tree lovers. I must apoligise for forgetting to attach the answers from the quiz in Tree time Edition 4, so here they are now:

- 1. If you have read my first edition of Tree time, you would have said it was Rowan, and that is absolutely correct!
- 2. Also in my first edition, I explained the meaning of the Crown of a tree. I said; The top of the tree, the crown... If you said the top, you are correct again.
- 3. Next, London plane has extremely adapted to very polluted areas including London, giving it the name.
- 4. True, this was hard to remember, so if you did, give yourself a pat on the back.
- 5. Lastly, name 10 trees. Well there are estimated 73,300 known species and 7,000 unknown older species, so naming every possibility would be a nightmare. But here are 10 I know from memory; Redwood tree, Mountain Ash, Sycamore, Holly tree, Silver birch, Cherry tree, Mangrove tree, Maple tree, Ebony tree and the common English Oak.

Enough with that, so lets get right to it! My tree has actually already been mentioned. Can you guess which one it will be? The Cherry tree!

Specifically the Sweet Cherry Tree, as there are roughly 430 different types. Wow learn a new thing every day! So lets begin.

I'm sure you know what a cherry tree looks like, there are a few here in Moulsford, but for those who don't know,

here's a quick sum up.

The leaves are oval, but have jagged edges pointing up to the tip of the leaf. These can grow up to 5 inches, and are usually a darkish green.



The flowers are white but sometimes light pink, and appear in clusters of 3-5.

The medium sized trunk is silver and white, with brown stripes running horizontally around the tree.

Cherries usually have a very short lifespan of 15-20 years, but the oldest and still alive cherry is the famous Jindai Zakura in Japan – still flowering every spring an estimated 2,000 years since it was planted.
