Notes from the Underground

From the Vicar

Dear Friends

I hope you had an enjoyable Christmas and New Year? I know, for many people, Christmas will seem a very long time ago. Many people take their decorations down on Boxing Day, or soon afterwards, and for most people the celebrations will now be well and truly over. But, in the Church, as I write this on 22nd January, we are still celebrating Christmas or, at least, Epiphany. In many churches, including All Saints, the Crib stays up until after the celebration of Candlemas, and in some churches the Christmas tree stays up until then, too. In my home, the tree is still up (though many of the baubles have fallen off), and I love seeing the lights on the tree.

Christmas can be a difficult time for many of us, with bereavements, illness, family quarrels or relationship breakdowns, and this year I'm sure money-worries and the cost-of-living crisis will have caused anxiety too. January can be a difficult month, too, so I – and many Christians – enjoy the opportunity to prolong our celebrations and keep our crib, tree and lights up through the dark days of January, until we have celebrated the festival of Candlemas, or the Presentation in the Temple – when Mary and Joseph brought the baby Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem. There, the baby Jesus was greeted by Simeon and Anna, and recognised as “a light to lighten the nations (Gentiles), and to be the glory of God’s people, Israel” – words sung in many Cathedrals and Churches across the land at choral Evensong most weeks.

At Candlemas, we turn our gaze away from the crib, or stable, and begin looking towards the cross, with Simeon’s prophetic words to Mary, “and a sword will pierce your own soul too.” This year, Ash Wednesday falls on 22nd February, marking the beginning of Lent.

On Ash Wednesday, we will be launching our new “Tea-time Church” gathering in St Mary’s, Garsington, with tea, cake, squash

and, perhaps, hot-dogs for our first session. There'll also be a short Bible story, an activity and some prayers, and the chance to talk a little about Lent. All are very welcome to attend "Tea-time Church," and I'm hoping that it will provide an opportunity for school children, parents, and others (all ages), to gather together for cake (and, sometimes, sandwiches, and fruit), and to hear and discuss a short Bible story. Please contact me if you would like more information, or if you can support this new gathering by providing cakes, fruit shoot drinks or similar for children, and some healthy snacks. As we turn away from the Crib, towards the Cross, I'd like to close with a poem by Howard Thurman:

*When the song of the angels is stilled,
When the star in the sky is gone,
When the kings and princes are home,
When the shepherds are back with their flock,
The work of Christmas begins:
To find the lost,
To heal the broken,
To feed the hungry,
To release the prisoner,
To rebuild the nations,
To bring peace among others,
To make music in the heart.*

I wonder, how will you "make music in the heart," in 2023?
How will you make a difference?

Parish Council

All the Parish Councillors were very sad to hear of the recent death of John Paxton. He was a stalwart member of the community for many years, including serving on the Parish Council. He was very keen on the environment and he was the person to go to for anything environmental, such as to give advice on what trees or shrubs should be planted at a particular place in the village. John was always a pleasure to talk to, and he will be sadly missed.

There is an amendment to the planning application to run an underground cable from a proposed new solar farm near Milton Common along the roads through both Cuddesdon and Denton to a substation in Cowley (P22/S2220/FUL). The amendment includes a heritage statement, ecology appraisal and tree survey. There is also a water crossing survey report, which proposes that the three river crossings (two at Cuddesdon Mill and one at Denton Brook) are achieved by horizontal drilling for a distance of 50m at a depth of 5m below the road at each location.

While commenting on this amendment, the Parish Council has taken the opportunity to reiterate its opposition to the application. The cable will be routed under the road from Cuddesdon Mill, through Cuddesdon, down Denton Hill and on to Garsington. The work is expected to take months to be completed, and is entirely inappropriate for our single track roads.

The Parish Council has no strong views on the planning application for extensions and alterations at Jubilee Cottage, Denton Hill (P22/S3922/HH), although the increase in the volume of the building exceeds the planning guidelines.

The Parish Council has supported the application for installation a bay window and other changes at Wesley House, Denton Hill (P22/S4307/HH). The District Council has decided to allow modification of the porch roof at Dove House (P22/S4008/LDE) as a permitted development which does not need planning permission.

You will need photo ID to vote at the local elections

The government has introduced a requirement for voters to show photo ID when voting at a polling station at some elections.

This will apply for the first time at the local elections on Thursday 4 May 2023, so please spread the word to your friends and family.

Accepted forms of photo ID will include, but are not limited to, passport, driving licence (including provisional license), disabled parking blue badge, certain concessionary travel cards and proof of age cards with a PASS mark.

Anyone who doesn't have accepted photo ID can apply on the government's website now for a free voter ID document, known as a Voter Authority Certificate.

John Howell Mp Writes... January 2023

I agree with the Prime Minister when he said that New Year should be a time of optimism and excitement and yet many look ahead to 2023 with apprehension. There are indeed many concerns at home and abroad. The concerns that dominate for each of us will vary according to our own circumstances and needs. Over the Christmas and New Year holiday period I had several conversations on the fallout from the pandemic with many people feeling that the negative effects, particularly in relation to mental health and well-being, are still taking their toll. The nervousness at the news that China would reopen its borders is an example of the fear that lingers, not only in relation to physical health, but also over the dread that life could be restricted once again. However we must remember that we are in a very different place to where we were at the start of the pandemic with knowledge, vaccines and medicines available to help prevent such devastating measures being taken again.

For those concerned at the continued cost of living issues I was pleased to see the Government announcement of further support this year for pensioners and those on low incomes. It is also good to see the continued support in relation to energy costs for business and non-domestic customers. This is subject to on-going review in a fast-changing situation.

I know that many constituents are concerned over issues relating to Thames Water. I have written previously on my concerns on storm discharges. I have also raised a number of other specific concerns with the company over time. I was saddened, although not entirely surprised, to read in the Ofwat annual assessment of water company performance that Thames Water fell amongst the worst performers. I am in touch with the Chief Executive of Ofwat on this.

Another concern that also tends to arise with the new year is changes to bus services when timetables are reviewed. Having investigated some of the concerns I understand that for bus companies there are

many issues to consider when looking at the sustainability of services. In some cases it is simply a matter of low passenger numbers that makes a route unsustainable, and the companies need to divert resources to other routes where there is greater usage to keep these running. However sometimes the issues are wider. For example on one route up for change the bus company wanted to use double decker buses across the whole route and some of the rural roads included in the journey were not suitable for such vehicles. Whilst the Government does have a National Bus Strategy the challenges in rural areas are many.

There are, of course, many big issues which affect us all which are will rehearsed in the national media and which the government is already working to address. Cowley is now host to the recently developed Oxford Community Diagnostic Centre. This site can provide blood tests, 'x-rays', ultrasounds, CTs, MRIs, echocardiograms and more.

The Centre, which is not too far from the Eastern By-Pass and BMW Cowley Works:

- Will reduce waiting times
- Provide services nearer patient homes in a quieter location than the acute hospital sites
- Has free parking!!

There is a drop-in x-ray service (for people aged 18 and over) Once your GP has requested your x-ray (electronically so no paperwork to take) please attend the Centre between 8.30am – 4.30pm Monday to Friday. As this is a drop-in service there is no need to book in advance.

Blood tests (for people aged 16 years and over)

Once your GP has given you your test forms, please book an appointment

Citizens Advice tip

Citizens Advice Henley has expressed concern that people in need are not taking advantage of cheap broadband and mobile phone schemes set up specially to help them.

Loosely termed “social tariffs” or “essential broadband”, these schemes are discounted deals intended for those on Universal Credit, Pension Credit, Employment and Support Allowance, and some other benefits.

Statistics show that only 1.2% of those eligible to register for these low tariffs have done so, although they could save over £100 a year.

Social tariffs are provided in the same way as normal phone and Internet packages, but at a lower price.

Network providers liaise with the Department of Work and Pensions (DWP) to ascertain customers’ eligibility, and the DWP is required to provide only the necessary information, so that personal information remains safe.

At the time of writing, not all telecom companies offer social tariffs but it is possible for those who qualify to switch to a supplier that does provide them. The usual fees for switching contracts, leaving a contract early or terminating them have in many cases been scrapped for those on benefits who qualify for these tariffs – but check with your supplier to make sure.
