

# **ULCOMBE PARISH COUNCIL**

## Minutes of meeting held on Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> November 2021 at 7:15 pm in the Village Hall

Present: Parish Cllrs F Kenward (Chairman); R Robinson; M Lovegrove; I Moir; M Lingwood; P Titchener. Also present: MBC Cllr Z Trzebinski ; I Bowie (Clerk) and 11 members of the public

### PRIOR TO THE START OF THE MEETING:

Representations from the general public will be taken for a period up to fifteen minutes before the opening of the formal meeting. Individuals may speak for up to three minutes at the discretion of the Chairman. The minute book will be closed.

Members of the public attended the meeting and raised the following matters:

- 1. Apologies, Declarations of Interest and Dispensations:
  - 1.1 Apologies for absence received and confirmed by the Council Members who cannot attend a meeting shall tender their apologies to the Parish Clerk prior to the meetings, under Section 85(1) of the Local Government Act 1972, the members present must decide whether the reason(s) for a member's absence shall be accepted. Apologies were received from KKC Cllr Prendergast The Chairman announced that Councillor Bill Stacey has resigned. All Councillors expressed their regret and thanked Cllr Stacey for his hard work and commitment to the parish council and the community.

- 2. It was RESOLVED that the minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2021 were confirmed as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.

- 4.2 UPC KALC Representatives: Following the resignation of Cllr Stacey a vacancy had arisen for a Cllr to join Cllr Lingwood as one of the two allowed per parish council at Maidstone KALC. Cllrs Robinson and Titchener expressed their interest in being considered. Following this members were asked to vote on which member they wished to serve as the KALC Representative. A vote was cast in favour of Cllr Robinson by 5 votes to 1 Cllr Robinson was therefore elected.

To receive an update and consider any parish council actions with regard to the Flooding in **Ulcombe** : It was reported that the Lead Drainage Engineer from KCC had walked through Ulcombe and checked the gullies and drains. A plan will be drawn up of the Village with the objective to slow the rate of the flow of water to prevent more flooding by natural flood management. This plan will be submitted to the Environment Agency and South East Rivers Trust (SERT). If it is accepted it will be funded by the Environment Agency. The parish council will be responsible for the upkeep of any measures. This will not happen quickly. Unfortunately, not all houses in Ulcombe will be in the scheme.

Cllr Lingwood was elected as the parish council's representative on the Ulcombe Village Flood Resilience Group.
