Parish Council report March / April

Our 12th of March meeting was our last at the Methodist Chapel.

The first main item on the agenda was Reports. He had been liaising with Shropshire Council officers to secure the approval and arrange a site visit which he hoped would take place by early April.

Cllr Hesketh reported that she and Cllrs Thornhill and Mabe had represented the Parish Council at the official school hall opening (with Cllrs Houghton and Curtis attending in a different capacity). They had enjoyed the afternoon and been im-



pressed with the presentation. Cllr Hesketh agreed to email the Head Teacher to thank her for the invitation and convey the Parish Council's congratulations.

After noting income received and resolving payments, members agreed to support a planning application for a new roof and conversion of an outhouse with landscaping.

Following consideration of extra information about the surface type for the footpath to the new accessible play equipment, members agreed to delegate power to the Clerk to agree the surface type with Tim Simmons provided the quote didn't exceed £11,000. This was subsequently agreed after the meeting with Tim Simmons in consultation with Cllr Jones to surface the path with compacted Breedon stone and pin kerbing for £9,769.50 and reported back to the April meeting.

Our 9th of April meeting was our first in the school and opened with apologies and a report to say that Cllrs John Houghton and Carole Coles had resigned from the Parish Council, both due to family and work commitments impacting their free time and their capacity to fulfil their role. Cllr Houghton has had two stints as a member of the Council, and his incite and professionalism has been invaluable to the council. Cllr Coles has been a member of the parish council for 26 years and has served as the Chair of the council. Her knowledge and experience will be difficult to replace and has been extremely helpful to the council. The Clerk will soon publish a notice of casual vacancies. If you are interested in becoming a councillor then please contact the Parish Clerk via our website.

Reports to members included reports from the police, the Clerk, our Shropshire Councillor and members. The Clerk's report updated members on a request for a meeting between Cllr Jones, Cllr Walker and David Woodhouse about the TPO tree survey; insurance pre-renewal questionnaire regarding the war memorial; the OPCC grant; the playing field footpath; the withdrawal of Scottish Power from the market to supply power for the streetlights; and correspondence form the school and residents. Our Shropshire Councillor Steve Charmley asked about correspondence he had received from a resident and wanted to know our take on the issue but otherwise didn't have anything to report to members. Cllr Curtis drew members attention to a public meeting in Pant about the Vyrnwy Frankton Project, highlighting the new map showing the wider area of study for the project.

Members approved a range of finance matters, considered a planning application at Manor House Farm, agreed to switch the street light energy supplier to Shropshire Council, agreed to apply for a grant from Shropshire Council for another VAS sign, and readopted the disciplinary policy and the grievance policy.

Our next Parish Council meeting is on 14 May 2024 at 7:30pm in West Felton CE Primary School.






Rector's Ramblings

Rev Suzan Williams

Pentecost or more traditionally Whitsun is I think the Cinderella of Christian festivals, it has never really had the impact of Christmas and Easter. It doesn't have the same traditions or social events around it which make it stand out in the wider culture either. I think increasingly the church doesn't really know how to mark the occasion and even the recent 'Thy Kingdom Come' prayer campaign which has actually taken off across the churches in recent years doesn't really make much of Pentecost itself. Yet Pentecost is perhaps one of the most exciting of the church festivals for it marks the moment when God started the church! It is in effect the Church's birthday, the day that God sent the Holy Spirit to inspire and empower ordinary Christians to do extraordinary things for Him.

The Holy Spirit is given freely to all of us as a free gift from God. Jesus promised his disciples that we would receive this gift so that we might know his presence with us as we live out our faith on a daily basis.

"And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another comforter to help you and be with you forever— the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you..."

- John 14:15-16

The problem is when most of us think of comfort we think of the luxuries of life, or being wrapped up in a warm blanket or duvet. We also think of comfort as something that consoles us when we are upset or in need. Whilst all these things are true the word used in the New Testament has a completely different meaning to those we might expect. The word comfort is the same word that we find in relation to prodding, strengthening or stirring into action. The Bayeux Tapestry has a wonderful panel of Bishop Odo, forcing his men into battle, at the end of his battle club, with the abbreviated Latin words: which when translated means: "Here, Bishop Odo, comforts his troops." As individuals we might not find such 'comfort' comforting but the Holy Spirit is given to equip and spur us into action! In fact, the word comfort has traditionally also meant to give or add strength to someone or to encourage, urge or exhort. When we see the coming of the Holy Spirit in that way it makes much more sense of both Jesus' words and what we see in the book of Acts as the early church begins to emerge.

The Holy Spirit also empowers us to be the people God created and knows us to be, in that sense the Holy Spirit

Sp the Earden Path with Topiarius

May the good times roll

Hopefully, the good times of May will not be spoilt by a late frost, but it is necessary to keep at least one eye on the weather and have the fleece at hand. Climate change seems to mean extremes and the unexpected. We suffered enough from the extreme rainfall earlier so gentle weather in May would be much appreciated. Probably the most vulnerable things are the new potatoes being frosted and getting bedding out in the last week of the month.

Before that, I will be spreading compost on the soft fruit and scattering Growmore on the grass. Like the bought in soil conditioner I applied to the vegetables and some flower beds in the winter, the compost will be spread rather more thinly than I would ideally like, and less than the no dig gurus preach about. However, it is probably a bit more than most people would use in a conventional digging routine. The amounts of organic material applied in the ideal no dig situation are perhaps a bit like woodland that gets a deep covering of leaves every year. Our garden is well endowed with trees and we try to make good use of the fallen leaves by keeping them on the beds, but there is sometimes a bit of conflict between doing good and having a tidy look.

Tender vegetables like tomatoes, cucumbers and courgettes will need potting on, while very early tomatoes can go out into a cold glasshouse. It is also time to sow runner beans and many of the brassica such as cauliflower, cabbage and kale, plus the last of the maincrop potatoes. I sow all brassica in 40 cell tray inserts and use large modules (12 cells to a tray) for runner beans. These can be put in a cold frame to geminate. Sweet corn will go into small modules (18 cells to a tray) and kept in a warm glasshouse. Using containers is much safer and certain than sowing direct.

In contrast to the danger of frost, there is now more heat in the sun and I find it necessary to remove some panes in one glasshouse to give extra ventilation. Subject to that eve on the weather forecast, I shall start planting out bedding in the last week of May, starting with plants in containers.

It brought home how individual gardening is when I read Christopher Lloyd saying that May is not a peak month in most gardens and his is no exception. On the contrary, I often think that May is my favourite time and the garden at its best. Obviously, it depends on what you grow, a host of spring shrubs like rhododendrons will boost the May interest while a lot of bedding will not be making its presence felt until much later. What is certain is that everything is still fresh and not overgrown in May and you will still have enthusiasm for tackling the weeds. ♦

HAUGHTON FARM Rednal Aerodrome - WWII

Roger Hampson remembers his father selling off livestock because much of the farmland had been requisitioned for building the aerodrome.

The airfield perimeter track ran along the back of the family farm, and only a few yards from the house was a fuel storage area, with three underground tanks each containing 3,000 gallons of fuel. Because they were so close to the airfield, they were given extra protection by the RAF – a reinforced steel kitchen table, which the whole family was instructed to hide under in the event of an emergency!

Roger said, "My brother Henry and I used to stand at the farm gate when they started up the Spitfires and we'd see whose had flown off first."

On the 8th September 1942, SERGEANT-PILOT STANLEY PAUL LISTER, RAF took off from Royal Air Force Station Rednal, Oswestry, Shropshire, in Spitfire P7963.

Tragically, on this day Stanley's aircraft developed a swing on take-off, and he crashed into a barn at Haughton Farm on the edge of the airfield. Rednal Watch Tower witnessed the horrific accident and immediately sent out the crash tender and ambulance, who quickly arrived at the scene.

Sgt Lister was taken from the wreckage by the Emergency crews, who did all they could for him; but sadly, Stanley died from his injuries in the farmyard at Haughton Farm.

Stanley's body was brought back home to his grieving family, and he was buried at The Military Cemetery at Shorncliffe Camp, Folkestone, Kent.

There is a plague in his memory at Haughton Farm, Rednal.

He enlisted in The Buffs as a Territorial at the age of 17, and two years later joined the R.A.F. He underwent his training in Canada, and returned with his unit to this country in April.

Councillor and Mrs. Lister have three other sons serving.



GARDEN WASTE AND RECYCLING CENTRES

We're asking for your views on proposals for an annual subscription charge to collect garden waste from homes in the Shropshire Council area - and about how we can reduce the cost of running our five household recycling centres.

A six-week consultation runs until 20 May.

What are we asking?

We want to know if you would be willing to pay £52 a year - equivalent to £1 a week - to have your garden waste collected.

We're also asking how we can reduce the cost of running our five household recycling centres. Would you be willing to pay more than £52 a year for a garden waste collection if the additional money was used to keep all the centres open? Should the opening times be reduced? Should a permit scheme be introduced?

Why are we proposing this?

Shropshire Council must make £62m of savings from its budget this year - mainly due to growing demand for social care, which now accounts for almost £4 in every £5 of the council's budget. This means making some difficult decisions.

Charging for garden waste collections, and closing two of the council's five recycling centres, are two proposals that are in the council's budget plans. But before we make any decisions, we first want to know your views.

Did you know?

Collecting garden waste is not a service that the council must by law provide but is one that we, and we're sure most residents, would prefer to continue.

While garden waste collections in Shropshire are currently free, more than 80% of English councils already charge for this service and many have been doing so for several years. The average annual fee across the country is £55.







Ecclesiastical Declarations

George Kennedy Allen Bell:

if the name means anything to anybody it may be that as Bishop of Chichester he was accused, 37 years after his death, of sexually abusing a girl during the 1940's and '50's. (The accusation was subsequently not confirmed). Yet as the present Church of England Bishops come out with a declaration that the war in Gaza and the killing of Palestinians should cease immediately, George Kennedy Allen Bell should be remembered as a harbinger of such proclamations.

The Church of England has a knack of being able to divide opinions. In 1939 Bishop Bell argued that the church should not be simply a spiritual prop to the state, but should stand against destruction of moral values. Famously on 14th February 1944 he spoke in the House of Lords against the bombing of civilian populations as a means of warfare, possibly influenced by the experience of Guernica in the Spanish Civil war. During the Second World War civilian populations had been affected by bombing on both the German and the Allied sides. The most controversial was yet to come with the bombing of Dresden in 1945. Whether this was justified or not remains a subject for military debate. Bell's speech probably cost him the post of Archbishop of Canterbury.

The dilemma of waging a moral war has engaged the church for over a century. During the First World War, Randall Davidson, the Archbishop of Canterbury at the time, urged the government not to use poison gas, as the Germans were doing. Most of his urgings however related to the welfare of the troops, advising that alcohol should be limited and that brothels should not be close to army camps. As military capabilities became more destructive, so the church became more involved in trying to prevent actions on the battlefield that it felt to be immoral.

In calling for a cessation of the conflict in Gaza to prevent deaths amongst the civilian Palestinian population, the Bishops in the Church of England have embraced matters involving non-Christian religions and with which this country is not directly involved. Although the declaration called upon both Israel and Hamas to stop fighting, the emphasis has inevitably fallen upon the Israeli army to stop fighting since it is they who are causing the casualties. Bell would undoubtedly have called upon the Israelis to cease fighting: would he have called upon Hamas to end the weaponisation of the population? In times past the Church itself might have sought a military solution, although Christianity has in general confined itself to fighting when Christian

interests were at risk (the Crusades) or Christianity itself was split (the Wars of religion).

Yet as the church seeks to settle foreign disputes, it has those closer to home to resolve. Separate arrangements have had to be made for those who do not accept women clergy. Same sex marriage continues to raise emotions. Most recently six Dioceses in the Midlands have caused controversy over an advertisement for an officer for "deconstructing whiteness". Such was the outcry that the Archbishop of Canterbury was moved to write to the lead Diocese asking "what on earth the advertisement meant". Seeking to elucidate this Bishop of Lichfield, General Synod member and a participant in the Diocesan minority ethnic clergy group, gave this explanation. "Whiteness means race; it predates slavery, and is manifested by the social, political, economic, and cultural behaviour". She further explained that this was the norm by which other cultures were compared. Unsurprisingly the advertisement was deemed to be racist and was withdrawn. As the furore died down, more sober voices pointed out that Treena Larkin was trying to deconstruct the whole culture of the country. It had nothing to do with 'whiteness'; the population happened to be white rather than any other

colour. More provocatively it was pointed out that our country can't be that bad if so many people want to come here. Senior members of the clergy complained that such language risked alienating ordinary members of the Church of England and made people feel guilty about being white.
