these 2 charges' (what they call parishes in Scotland) ...'there is this job, it's your skill set'...'we are going to buy a house for the job, would you look at the details and let us know what you think'. In my experience there are only so many times that you can say no to a Bishop. So, under the subterfuge of going for fish and chips, sea air and ice cream in August we travelled north to just have a look. I expect that you can guess where this is going. It is with huge mixed feelings that Mike and I will be leaving the Meon Valley towards the end of October, Covid allowing. My last service will be at West Meon on the 24th of October at 10.30am.

The job, which is that of Transitional Ministry in two charges, is specific in nature. The task is to help the church communities to determine what their future will look like. It is a senior clergy post for a fixed 3-year contract. And as my church secretary in Kilmarnock said...'you know Mary you are really good at unsticking places...'.

And so, we will say farewell, with many fond memories of conversations, walks, shared drinks and laughter. Mike and I are both thankful for the time we have spent with you. It must be said that it has been a difficult year for all of us but you are an amazing community, you demonstrate community spirit at a level that many in this world will not experience. It has been a blessing to be with you.

In August 2020, when we arrived, we had no intention of packing the boxes and heading north again. I suppose, however, we are both vagabonds at heart. On a spiritual level I hold on to the many who have found travel to be a significant part of their spiritual life, whether it has been about pilgrimage to a particular place or perhaps, walking pilgrimage routes such as San Compostela. There is something in all that of being prompted by the Holy Spirit to take up new challenges. Although I know many would say that the prompting of the Holy Spirit/ God is a figment of the imagination, I would disagree. In my ministry I believe that I have been often nudged in the direction of new challenges not always to new places but sometimes. Perhaps as we come towards the day when the church remembers St Wilfrid (12th October) a peripatetic priest of not only Meon Valley fame, but of a great deal of Great Britain and beyond, we should be attentive to our individual calling where our individual gifts can be used to help

So perhaps we should consider what form a calling or a nudge might take. Sometimes it is simply an unexplained thought, perhaps to pick up the phone or even write a letter. These days, however, I do believe that we are all being called to take more of a role in care of our world. After all, why wouldn't God call us to take care of his planet. There are so many things that can be done. On Sunday the 3rd of October the focus of our Harvest Service at West Meon will be what is being billed as 'Climate Sunday', a Sunday where as individuals, as a church and as a wider community we will commit ourselves to action in support of our wonderful earth. 

We had a meeting on Monday 13th September in the Village Hall, and it was so good for all of us to meet up again to enjoy a chat together and a cup of tea and cake! We have an outing to Hambledon Vineyard on Monday 27th September, where we will be treated to a vineyard tour and a wine tasting. Men and friends are also invited. The Petersfield Group have arranged a meeting at Rake Garden Centre for tea and a chat on Monday 4th October and the Hampshire Federation Annual Meeting will take place at The Anvil in Basingstoke. Our speaker for the afternoon was Bill Dawson, whose wife is a member at Medstead W.I. The subject of his talk was 'Wildlife in Far Eastern Russia', which was as a result of a trip made with his wife on a guided holiday. They started their trip with a few days in Moscow where they visited many churches and museums, and Bill had some beautiful photographs of the architectural delights of the city. They then travelled to the far eastern area of Russia and went birding on the Kuril Islands, where they saw beautiful wild orchids, sea eagles, spectacled guillemots and many other unusual sea birds. They also saw many other beautiful flowers, sea lions, foxes, puffins and four different varieties of auk and two different types of albatross. They also visited Simoshira island, which used to be a Russian nuclear base where Bill's photographs showed that everything had just been left at the end of the Cold War, with heaps of rusting equipment everywhere. They visited the Baring Straights between Russia and the United States and flew to Providenya, where they saw musk ox and bald eagles, but they were not allowed to land. They also visited Wrangel Island which is home to a huge population of polar bears - and Bill's photos of them were amazing!

Our next meeting is on Monday 11th October at West Meon Village Hall at 2.15pm. Our speaker is Andrew Negus and his subject is "Winchester's Bishops, Buildings and Bones". Andrew has talked to us on many occasions and we know we are in for a treat, as he is such a good speaker.

## The Secret Life Of Harvest Mice



Rodents are a key component of many healthy ecosystems, such as grasslands and woodlands. They provide food for lots of species from birds of prey to larger mammals. Rodents often produce lots of young every year, so must have ample food available for them – usually seeds, fruit and small insects. When rodent populations dip there are knock-on effects across the habitat. There are 14 species of rodent commonly found in Britain, including rats, squirrels, mice, voles and more recently the beaver. One of the least familiar of these is the harvest mouse, Britain's smallest rodent, and we will take a closer look at them this week.

Harvest mice are not especially fussy, they are happy anywhere there are ample stems for them to clamber up, very rarely descending to the ground if they can avoid it. They are tiny, around 6cm long, with a tail close to the same length. The tail is used to help with balance and climbing. They react quickly to disturbance, disappearing back into the vegetation in response to nearby noises.

Harvest mice are thought to be fairly widespread but are very difficult to find. Their presence is mostly picked up by the signs they leave behind - their intricate nests. The nests are carefully woven from grass and leaves within dense vegetation, at least 10cm above ground, so even these are difficult to spot! Harvest mice adapted to farmed habitats by creating their nests in crop fields such as wheat and barley, but modern combine harvesters have caused a new threat.

When fields were hand-cut, the mice could easily run to the safety of field margins, but modern machinery does not give them the time to escape. They also build their nests and live in verges, reedbeds and grassy hedges. These habitats have been lost in many areas as green spaces are developed and wetlands drained.

Recent studies have helped shine a light on this elusive mammal, but more must be done to protect the harvest mouse. They seem to be able to respond quickly to changes in habitat, as long as the habitat is connected to others and buffer zones are present between developments and their living space. Reintroductions can work well, as the mice are relatively easy to breed, and once conservation efforts are in place they seem to breed and colonise the reintroduction area quickly. The more we learn about marginal habitats like road verges and field edges , the more they are shown to be important for all sorts of wildlife, including our smallest rodent.


