Everyone has returned back to school full of enthusiasm after the Easter break, various after school clubs are up and running again, this includes the orchestra, sports clubs and drama. Year 6 visited the Ashmolean Museum for the "Take One Picture" viewing, they looked at the painting by Walter Sickert titled "Brighton Pierrots" (1915) as part of the creative curriculum. Class 3 have also studied some Cinquain poems, these poems usually consist of 5 lines and tell a small story. The children came up with some excellent poems of their own, here is an example... (see below!)

Poetry is continuing to form a big part of the literacy lessons this term, Class 3 looked in detail at the well known poem by T. S. Eliot (Macavity, "the Mystery Cat"). They watched a video of the famous children's laureate Michael Rosen reading the poem aloud and then looked closer at the poetic devices T. S. Eliot used such as rhyme and repetition of words and phrases. They also examined and explained unfamiliar words before creating a "Wanted" poster with a picture of Macavity, a description of the latter and a list of his supposed crimes...

The school converted to Academy status on May 1st and will continue to work with other partnership schools even more closely than previously. Further details of what this will mean for the school will be in next month's Village Voice.
