- The 'Dementia Friendly' village project with Village Care: prioritising signage and seating around Collingham. Signage especially on PROW, where there are less visual clues with types of buildings and building names. It is also considered that some people find the name off-putting or scary, so perhaps just a 'Friendly village'. Liz Norton, who is a Dementia Champion, has offered to do a short training session with members of the Parish Council if they wish. All these sessions are free, and Liz gives her time as a volunteer.
- Fly tipping reported as it happens, with an increase at the end of May. Several incidents of asbestos being included in the waste material, which takes longer to remove. NSDC providing an excellent service on this.
