

News from St. Nicholas Church

October 2022

What a roller-coaster of emotions we have lived through in September this year. We could see the Queen becoming more frail day by day. Still the announcement of her death coming suddenly on that Thursday afternoon, so soon after pictures of her receiving the new Prime Minister at Balmoral only two days earlier, came as a shock to most. Then the whirlwind of the events which took place in Scotland and around the United Kingdom, culminating in the funeral itself in Westminster Abbey and in St. George's Chapel, Windsor, with the accompanying processions, captivated our attention. Only years of preparation and meticulous attention to detail could have resulted in such a fitting farewell to someone who had given her whole life to this nation and to many around the world.

Strolling the 10 hours through the night along the Thames to pay our respects, seemed a paltry response to the years of her tireless efforts for us.

Reminders

The church porch continues to be well visited and the refreshments appreciated. It was useful to have this space for the signing of the condolence book and as a place to reflect and leave flowers for Her Majesty.

The main church building has been open more frequently, to allow for private prayer recently. The candle-lit space seemed appropriate to come together on the evening of Sunday 11th for the national minute silence.

As we return to normal, you will need to contact the churchwardens, as before, for a key to visit. Their details are in the magazine and on the noticeboard in the porch.

Celtic Morning Prayers continue each Monday morning, 9-9.30, in the side chapel. If you have any prayer requests please contact Rev. John Huggins, Rev. Charlotte Coles or the churchwardens, or leave a note in the basket in the

porch and prayers will be said at Monday Morning Prayer time or in private if you wish.

Donations to Ukraine can still be taken to the back of St.Mary's church in Lenham. Directions are in place when you get there and is open daily from 9am- 5pm.

Main items needed are: *nappies, baby wipes, baby food/ milk (not glass), sanitary items, medical kit basics, pain killers, tinned meat and fish (with ring-pulls), blankets and warm socks.*

Re-organisation of the pews is ongoing. The first viewings of the oak refectory table in progress in Peter's workshop look wonderful. Well worth the wait. We are already able to make good use of the space with our existing tables.

Village Coffee time. A great atmosphere in the hall on Tuesdays, through the morning 11.00am-2.15pm. Plenty of time for friends to come and go, shop for greengroceries 11-1pm, purchase Pluckley teas and coffee, hand-made cards, peruse the church eco-samples, buy some local honey and Sylvia's jams and enjoy a hot drink and homemade cakes and biscuits. All before making use of the pop-up Post Office from 12.45-2.15pm. Dogs are very welcome too!

Harvest Festival is at 3.30pm on Sunday 9th October. All contributions of food welcome. There will be an auction of perishable foods, e.g. Homemade cakes, fruit, vegetables etc. The proceeds of these will go to Homeless in Maidstone and non- perishable goods will go to the Food Bank.

Also during the service we will have a chance to celebrate and remember the life of **Mike Davidson**, a fitting time for a farmer, being surrounded by the rich harvest of fruit and grain.

After the service we hope everyone will stay and join together for a Harvest High Tea

Regrettable though it is there will always be the odd, (hopefully exceptional occasion), when the service is cancelled due to sickness or other unforeseen circumstances but the Postmaster has given me an assurance that wherever possible this will be avoided.

There is no truth in the rumour that the service has ceased and I would urge you all to continue to support the Post Office where you can as the more activity there is the more likely we are to be able obtain an extension to the service in the future.

We are trying to bring local businesses into the hall for the coffee morning, (11am to 2.15pm), which runs alongside the Post Office, (12.45 pm to 2.15 pm) and presently they offer locally grown fruit and vegetables, (12 noon to 2pm), Eco Shop products, Pluckley tea homemade preserves including locally produced honey and locally produced hand made cosmetics and soaps.



Grafty Gourmet

This is a great autumnal recipe and so easy to make.

APPLE & BLACKBERRY CRUMBLE MUFFINS

300g of plain flour, plus a little extra for dusting 1 tablespoon of baking powder A Pinch of salt 190g of caster sugar 210ml of milk 1 large free-range egg, beaten 100g of butter, melted Finely grated zest of 1 large lemon 250g (1 large) Bramley apple 150g of blackberries

For the crumble topping:-15g of butter, at room temperature 25g of plain flour 15g of demerara sugar

- 1. Preheat the oven to 200°C (fan180°C) and line a 12-hole muffin tray with paper muffin cases.
- 2. First, make the crumble topping. Rub the butter into the flour until it resembles fine breadcrumbs. Stir in the sugar and work the mixture with your fingers until it forms nuggets.
- 3. For the muffins, sift the flour, baking powder and salt into a mixing bowl and stir in the sugar. In another smaller bowl, beat the milk with the egg, melted butter and lemon zest.
- 4. Peel, quarter and core the apple, and cut into blackberry-size pieces.
- 5. Stir the wet mixture into the flour and sugar mixture until combined. (It's fine if it's still a bit lumpy.) Stir in the apple and blackberries.
- 6. Spoon the mixture evenly into the paper cases and sprinkle over the crumble topping. Bake for 20-25 minutes until risen and golden. Cool for 5 minutes, then serve warm.

The anniversary date this month is 12th October,150yrs since the birth of Ralph Vaughan Williams, English composer. He is among the best-known British symphonists, noted for his very wide range of moods, from stormy and impassioned to tranquil, from mysterious to exuberant. Among the most familiar of his other concert works are Fantasia on a Theme by Thomas Tallis (1910) and The Lark Ascending (1914). His vocal works include hymns, folk-song arrangements and large-scale choral pieces. He wrote eight works for stage performance between 1919 and 1951. Although none of his operas became popular repertoire pieces, his ballet Job: A Masque for Dancing (1930) was successful and has been frequently staged.

On 4th October we will be in the Village Hall to hear a talk by Steve Edney entitled 'Think beyond the flower, plants with good seed heads'. This promises to be a very interesting talk and we look forward to seeing as many of our members and friends as can make it.

In our gardens:- it is time to plant up containers for Winter colour. As soon as you can do so evergreen hedging plants can go in, if this is not possible it is best to leave this task until Spring. Deciduous hedging can be planted all through the Winter providing soil conditions allow.

Lavateras and other tall plants can be pruned by about a half to prevent wind rock damage during Winter. Check all newly planted trees and shrubs regularly and if they are loose firm them in again. Christian Message by Joan Drury October 2022

Fifteen years ago I moved from South London to Grafty Green. Moving away from friends and familiar places is difficult but this day has stayed in my memory as especially happy. Dominic Goodwin had organized the removal of furniture and it all arrived without a hitch. Before long it was installed in Weirton Villa and, to my surprise, we were sitting down to lunch in my new home. As well as Dominic and Vanessa, Gerda was with us, Sally Alexander and Tony Old. A happy day as I began to enjoy life in Grafty Green.

Saying 'goodbye' and adjusting to new surroundings can be traumatic but it is the way of life for Christians. We are called to be on the move. I've been checking this out in the Bible. After the resurrection of Jesus some of the disciples were scattered – Philip to Samaria, Paul travelled about the country and went to Lydda (*Acts 9*) where he met the paralysed man, named Aeneas, whom he healed. On the same journey Peter met Tabitha who also turned to Jesus. As the early disciples turned to Jesus, every journey was an opportunity to share the Christian faith.

I remember a song with the words "Travel far and wide, Tell them why I died." Moving house can become an opportunity to talk. You don't have to be a paid-up member of a Mission Society to talk about Jesus. It is hard to move from the familiar but again and again Jesus said "Go and tell". This is what we must do. I praise God that he gave me the push I needed.
