Reducing the speed limit on Liverton Hill

I dread writing about this matter, as the proposal to reduce the speed limit on Liverton Hill has been beset by delays for which I can only apologise. By the time this article has gone to print, a statutory Traffic Regulation Order advising residents and motorists about the proposed speed reduction will have been advertised. The new 30mph speed limit if approved will stretch from the top of Liverton Hill straight

through to Grafty Green (but not the part from Platts Heath to Liverton Hill). On the basis that most if not all of the responses are positive, the speed limit will be introduced shortly thereafter.

A new speed indicator device in Grafty Green

I have ordered a new speed indicator device for Grafty Green to encourage motorists to slow down and adhere to the speed limit. This is at the request of the Parish Council who will jointly fund the sign with me (from my Member Highway Fund).

Protecting Kent's roads

With 15 parishes in my electoral Division, I have received numerous complaints about the ongoing problem of HGVs using inappropriate rural routes. KCC views this issue seriously and has been developing a Freight Action Plan that will seek to introduce a number of initiatives to mitigate the impact of lorries on Kent's roads. A few of the actions highlighted in the plan include:

- work nationally to develop a standard method of data sharing with the suppliers of devices and local authorities
- work with the Freight Transport Association to promote best practice
- develop a facility to provide information to businesses on most suitable routes
- investigate the possibility of a Lorry Watch scheme (where Trading Standards officers fine lorry drivers caught flouting weight and width restrictions and other road regulations).

The plan will be issued for consultation shortly and will be adopted as a strategic approach to tackling a problem that has menaced Kent's rural roads for too long.

2012-13 KCC Budget

KCC has frozen its council tax precept for the second year running despite having to make £95 million savings and retaining eligibility criteria for adult social care to "moderate" - one of only a small number of authorities in the country that has not raised the threshold for accessing these services. Staff will also received a 1% pay increase after a two year wage freeze. KCC is also investing an additional £23m to

support the most vulnerable children in the county, including the 1500 children in our care system.

Kent Jobs for Kent Young People

A new £2m fund to provide help for employers to offer apprenticeships for young people is currently being formulated by KCC. It is hoped that this funding will help support up to 1000 opportunities for school and college leavers and graduates and provide a vital first step for young people to gain meaningful employment. There are too many young people struggling to find work and this fund is desperately needed to support them find jobs. More details will be announced shortly.

The Grafty Gourmet

This is a very simplified version of a coconut curry. Ideal for those that do not keep a vast selection of spices in the cupboard. Sometimes, less is more. Certainly, its the nice little things in life, that go a long way. Simply serve with rice for a fantastically easy meal.

Easy Chicken Coconut Curry - Serves 4

3 tablespoons curry powder

1 teaspoon ground ginger

2 tablespoons vegetable oil

1 white onion, chopped

2 cloves garlic, crushed

4 chicken breasts - diced

1 small head cauliflower, chopped

1 can unsweetened coconut milk

1/3 cup chicken stock

1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon ground black pepper

- 1. Heat a saucepan over medium heat, add curry powder and ginger and heat for 1 minute, until fragrant. Add the oil, onions and garlic and cook until onions are soft. Stir in the chicken and cook for 10 minutes.
- 2. Add the cauliflower to the pan and pour in the coconut milk and chicken stock. Season with salt and pepper. Reduce the heat to low and simmer, stirring occasionally, for 30 minutes. Serve with rice.





If you want to reduce the number of unnecessary files on your hard disk to free up disk space and help your computer run faster, use Disk Cleanup. It removes temporary files,



You can use Disk Cleanup to clean up all the files on your computer, for more information about the different types of files you can delete, Go to Help and Support, from the start menu.

To perform a quick clean-up of some of the most common files on your computer do the following:

 Click the Start button. In the search box, type disk cleanup, and then, in the list of results, click Disk Cleanup.



- If the Drives list appears, click the hard disk drive that you want to clean up, and then click OK.
- In the Disk Cleanup dialog box, on the Disk Cleanup tab, select the check boxes for the file types that you want to delete, and then click OK.

If you are unsure of what the file types are then do not delete them until you are sure of what you are deleting by using Help and Support.

I would recommend that you delete Temporary Internet Files, these are created when you browse the internet and the Recycle Bin, which is where the files you have deleted go, just in case you



need them again. It might be worth checking what you have got in the recycle bin before deleting the files.

Note: You can also delete files from the Recycle Bin by "right-clicking" on the icon on your desktop and selecting "emptying the recycle bin" from the pop-up menu.

The April Night Sky

The **Sun** is in the constellation of Pisces at beginning of April, and moves into Aries on the 19th.

Full Moon occurs on Friday 6^{th} April when it appears to be in the constellation of Virgo, and **New Moon** is on Saturday 21^{st} April.

Mercury is at its greatest distance west of the Sun on 18th April, so in theory this elusive planet may be visible just before sunrise low in the western sky.

Venus is again a brilliant "Evening Star" this month. It can be seen in the western sky just after sunset, and remains visible late into the evening. Relative to the stars it is moving rapidly eastwards, in the constellation of Taurus.

Mars is high in the southern sky at dusk, and doesn't set in the west until dawn. Relative to the stars it is almost stationary in the constellation of Leo. Through a telescope it may be possible to see the dark and light patches on the surface, together with the white North Polar Cap.

Jupiter is low in the west at the start of the month, and by the end of the month it disappears below the horizon less than an hour after sunset. It is therefore not the best time to view this planet as very little detail can be seen.

Saturn is in opposition to the Sun on 15th April, so this month can be seen all night. Relative to the stars it is moving very slowly north-westwards in the constellation of Virgo. Through a telescope you should be able to see the famous rings together with many of its moons.

This month is the turn of the **Lyrid** meteor-shower, which will probably peak around midnight on 22^{nd} April. The meteors will appear to radiate from a point in the constellation of Lyra, close to the bright star Vega.

Last January I reported on the latest results from the Large Hadron Collider at Cern regarding the hunt for the elusive "God particle". I can now report that scientists at the Tevatron particle accelerator in Boston have found similar evidence of its existence despite using different methods to search for it. However, scientists are still expressing doubts as to whether the Higgs boson, otherwise known as the "God Particle" really does exist. The Higgs boson, which gives other subatomic particles mass, is viewed as the final missing component of the Standard Model, the most widely accepted explanation of how particles behave.

Reflection...

I could not forget the evening that I got the call from the bishop to let me know that Holy Family Church was offered to me as the parish priest. I had no idea how to react because it meant that I will be uprooted from my home since I have moved here to England in 2003. I struggled moving to a new place because it meant leaving behind my friends and new found family. The painful memory was still fresh in my mind when I moved to this country. I never knew the pain of leaving one's native land until I got here and after three months it suddenly dawned on me that I am alone in this part of the world. This is the feeling that runs across my system as soon as I knew that I am moving away. Yet this feeling slowly disappeared when I started to see the situation in the light of my vocation as a pastor. I realised that my life is meant to be spent according to the needs of the church. My desires for comfort should be eclipsed by the welfare of the church.

Life would have been extra difficult for me if I had not seen it in the light of my faith in Christ. I remember that my life was not mine since I was ordained to the priesthood. I felt sorry for myself for entertaining anxious thoughts about moving away because it did not take so long for me to realise that my worries were empty. The warm welcome and reassuring cooperation of the community of the Holy Family have simply made my settling process an excellent experience. The comforting words of my former parish priest resounds at the back of my mind that bring only your true self and sincerity to your new parish. I knew that I have not much to offer to my parish other than my humble service and availability to them. With this in mind, I am on my sixth month since moving here, I am grateful to Archbishop Peter Smith of Southwark and to Holy Family Community for giving me the chance to preach the gospel in this corner of the diocese. I am happy to carry on the evangelization here so long as the gospel requires me to be in this parish.
