OUT AND ABOUT "UP NORTH" (OF THE RIDGEWAY)

A quick drink after an evening class was my introduction to the Boar's Head at Ardington. Having never visited this pub before, I was surprised to recognise some of the other customers – the West Ilsley ladies darts team was playing a match! The pub seems to be a good mix of local watering hole - on that evening a TV was temporarily set up in the middle room so that drinkers could watch the European Cup – and informal restaurant offering a good range of interesting-looking dishes. In the interests of the WIN readership, I forced myself to investigate further, and we visited for lunch on a cold and showery Saturday. We chose from the "lighter" menu on the blackboard. Salmon fishcakes served with a small but nicely mixed and presented salad, and a fish pie which included tuna and scallops were both excellent. We said we'd "just look" at the dessert menu but were tempted by the interesting selection – a peach melba (a poached peach and home-made vanilla icecream) and a tayberry shortcake rounded off the lunch, followed by a cafetiere of coffee strong enough to ensure that we stayed awake for the Wimbledon ladies final when we got home! The bill, which included two pints and two halves, came to £30. The service and ambience were both excellent, and when combined with the quality of the food, it's unsurprising that they have been awarded Oxfordshire Dining Pub of 2000 by the Good Pub Guide.

On reporting back to evening class on the good time we'd had, I was informed that the Hare at West Hendred offers a similar standard of hospitality. Our public-spiritedness knows no bounds, so we headed off to check this one out too – a visit several years ago hadn't been impressive. Well, what a transformation! The place is clearly geared up for dining, but whilst we were there several locals came in for just a drink. The staff are both friendly and efficient and the printed menu offers a good variety of tempting dishes. We

chose an avocado and bacon salad, and a terrine to start – both well presented and flavoursome. Cumberland sausage with mustard mash and onion rings, and salmon fishcakes with a selection of prettily presented vegetables both went down well. The bill, which included two glasses of house red and two pints, came to £35 without service.
