Draft Parish Notes

Meeting of the Parish Council held at the Pavilion on Monday 17th October 2022 at 7:30pm. The meeting was attended by Cllrs S Harrod (Chair), P Allen, C Deacon, D Harms, and M Horsley. Apologies were received from Cllr W Fox (Vice-Chair) Cllr Freddie Van Mierlo (OCC) and Cllr Caroline Newton (SODC). Chris Ashworth (Clerk) was in attendance, along 1 member of the public. No declarations of interest were received in matters on the agenda.

The County Councillor's monthly report was received and reviewed and is available on the Parish Council website along with the District Councillor's. No correspondence was received in matters not otherwise covered on the agenda.

P22/S3601/LB (3 Priory Bank Church Road Great Milton OX44 7PA) New chimney pot to extend height above the ridge to current regulatory height for a wood burner. Cllr S Harrod reviewed the application and consulted neighbours. The Parish Council unanimously agreed to SUPPORT this application.

Tetsworth Parish Council (TPC) has become increasingly concerned by the number of planning applications for solar arrays in our small part of South Oxfordshire. We have no desire to oppose the policies in place to provide renewable energy but are concerned that our area of the county is being asked to bear the brunt of their implementation.

The sites at Cromwell Farm and Harlesford, together with the sites proposed by the Dodwells application and that adjacent to Postcombe, could result in four large solar farms in the narrow stretch of the M40 corridor between junctions 6 and 7. The current planning procedure under which each application is considered individually does not take this cumulative effect into account.

TPC proposes that we arrange a meeting between representatives of our councils and SODC to persuade its planning department of the need to include within its framework a district-wide spacial strategy for the provision of renewable energy that would ensure an even distribution of such sites.

Great Milton Parish Council is happy to get involved in the process with Testworth Parish Council and will send a representative along to any meetings arranged in the future.

The minutes of the September meeting of the Parish Council, held on Monday 26th September, were received, reviewed, agreed and signed as a true and accurate record of proceedings.

The monthly bank reconciliation, accounts and bank statement was received, reviewed and approved. The reconciled bank balance as of 10th October was £43,715.90

The Parish Council discussed their financial priorities for the forthcoming financial year. It was agreed to a 0% increase on the precept again for another year.

Parish clerk and councillors' update of matters in hand

Work on the 20mph scheme is ongoing. Great Milton's scheme has been implemented.

Work on the gateway features has been raised with the signing contractor. It will take a few weeks for the necessary materials to be acquired then we will be given a date of installation.

The Great Milton Christmas Carols around the tree on the green, followed by mince pies in the pub, will take place on Tuesday 13th December, at 18:00. There will be a Christmas tree collection point set up within the village, adjacent to the entrance to the Rec. Posters will be produced with the details. The trees will be collected on w/c 9th of January when the normal garden waste collection begins.

Security in the village

Residents are encouraged to please continue to report any incident that they witness or experience to the police via the 101-telephone service or online via the police.co.uk website.

Funding for the youth club

The Councillors discussed the potential for helping fund the youth club in the village. A representative for the youth club attended the meeting and gave details about what they have achieved so far and what the plans are with more funding. They hope to be able to offer an affordable, safe and enjoyable place for 8–13-year-olds. Funding would help with the purchase of equipment for the children to use, help cover the hall hire fees and get all staff/volunteers first aid trained.

It was agreed that a donation of £500 would be made immediately. A further £500, less the amount of any funds received from other Parish Councils, would be paid in the New Year.

The Parish Council will also investigate providing Wi-Fi at the Pavilion.



Warm welcome campaign

The warm welcome campaign was discussed with places that could be used and talked through, and the Councillor's suggested the local Pub as the best place to provide this, which will be discussed with the tenants. The Parish Council is going to invite a member of the warm welcome campaign to come along to the next meeting, if possible, to discuss this matter in further detail.

Thame food bank initiative

A collection point was talked about at the meeting, along with its viability. This item will be talked about further at the next Parish Council Meeting, when we hope to have a representative of the initiative attending.

Code of conduct

The new code of conduct was read by the Councillors, and all agreed in favour of supporting it.

Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL)

The CIL was mentioned and agreed that it would be saved for a project in the future as one comes up.

Rector's Pint

It is with a heavy heart that I write this. In truth, I never really know how to tackle the subject of remembrance, but this year, that has been hugely amplified.

We do not have boots on the ground, yet. But we are effectively at war, or at least involved in a proxy war between the 'West' and Russia. I wonder what history will actually tell about the causes of this. It was an invasion, and Ukraine with its already creaking infrastructure, is being pulled to pieces Any possible diplomatic solution seems to have receded, if it was ever in sight in the first place, beyond a blood-tinged horizon. Once again there is war in Europe; what will our emotions be this year at our remembrance services, when we all say, 'we will remember them'?

A prayer at times of international unrest

Almighty Father,

Whose will is to restore all things

In your beloved Son, the King of all:

Govern the hearts and minds of those in authority, And bring the families of the nations, Divided and torn apart by the ravages of sin, To be subject to his just and gentle rule; Through Jesus Christ our Lord.

November will be a month of remembrance, not only with our remembrance services (please see the service list in this newsletter) but also with our special service of Commemoration and Thanksgiving for the Departed. This is a time we can reflect on loved ones who are no longer with us, sing some familiar hymns, listen to a brief reflection, read out names, and light candles in their memory. It will also be the day when our books of condolence following the death of Queen Elizabeth II will be closed, after we kept them open for a while to allow as many people who wanted to sign to do so. I know that I wrote about the death of Her Majesty the Queen last month but when I took the first Book of Common Prayer service (the historic form of worship in the Church of England, dating from 1662 which we use once a month) it was very strange, as several of the prayers refer to Elizabeth our Queen and her governors. All those of us who take these services had to adapt, and make sure that we prayed for Charles, our King, and his governors. (Some of the books are very dog eared – after all, they are 70 years old! At some point we will need to replace them).

The service of Commemoration and Thanksgiving for the Departed will take place at 4.00pm on Sunday 6th November at St Peter's in Great Haseley. I am hoping that there will be tea and cake to follow.

View from Views

I feel compelled to mention the passing of a good friend and neighbouring farmer, David Watts, who sadly died 2 days after his 101st birthday. I had known him for a very long time. He served in the Royal Navy during WW2 being torpedoed I believe more than once (as so many were). His dear wife also served her



country during the war being one of those who ferried planes for the RAF. As a farmer's son he eventually was able to get the tenancy of the family farm in Stadhampton where

he never stopped working and, even in retirement, he kept himself busy wood working and repairing items for the village plus tending his large garden and for others.

We are still very short of soil moisture, however we just had enough early in September to plant our Rape. This was under threat at the end of the month but luckily the rain we had at the end of the month has given it the boost to save it and, so far, we seem to have escaped the Cabbage Stem Flea Beetle (CSFB) which is always a risk with late planting. So far the pigeons seem to have left it alone; I am hopeful they will not be too much of a problem now as the plant has practically covered the rows. I am not sure what to report on the companion crop except it certainly suffered from the dry weather so is not the carpet of green we are looking for to suppress weeds; it is however recovering. It just remains to be seen how effective it is going to be and we are determined to continue with the experiment by sowing another area in the middle of a field. Although the Lupins were a failure we are going to give them another chance. This is a bit of a gamble as all our fields are of a size that are in reality too big to experiment with. Anyway we are going to continue as I feel the prospect for lupins should be good and could go towards replacing some Soya as their protein is between Soya and Beans & Peas.

Last year we made a mistake in the marketing of this year's harvest, being attracted to what at the time appeared to be a good price: this led to the last of last year's Barley, which left the farm just weeks before we started harvest, selling for a much higher price that that fixed last September as a speculation. You cannot always get it right.

When I reported that harvest had gone without a hitch autumn planted has also with rain just on cue as the last tractor left the field. This did not amount to much but since then we have had a couple of mm; enough to carry it on till we get some serious rain. We had almost perfect conditions for plant as well, I think due to the lack of ploughing which has left all the residues of the last few crops still in the soil making it more friable. Now we await disasters to follow; I cannot believe our luck will continue.

Funny old world; we seem to have made an about-turn in our leaders as we now have a male Monarch and a female Prime Minister. I believe the former has a little more experience than the latter yet we have to put up with her decisions and he is not allowed to express an opinion. I had great hopes that she was going to be a real breath of fresh air and sweep away all dead wood and get things done. This seems to have been wishful thinking. Leave alone the financial situation we seem to be in, which frankly I find difficult to get my head round, as I thought that, if you had mounting bills, you would do all you could to increase your income, not cut it. But then the PM was elected on that premise; one would assume such a radical scheme to have some basis. Now to compound the concern that our Government does not know where it

is going or understand how things work, we learn that planning is to be relaxed, farm subsidies are to be focussed more on production than the environment, and many other issues to encourage growth rather than conserving what we have achieved so far. This could mean the scrapping of all environmental payments and encourage us all to produce more food, which would mean undoing all the good we have been doing over the years. I also think that many of my colleagues will take great offence from the comments made by the Home Secretary who said Farmers should work harder in order to employ more indigenous labour, and use more technology, robots and the like. She can try if she likes. What planet are these people on; will the Green lobby accept a different support package? And how do they think that the UK population will want to work six months of the year and relocate to a caravan in the middle of nowhere, to work in a harsh environment? Only Farmers are daft enough to do that.

John Howell MP writes...

With Party Conference season now over the House returns to business. For my part I was unable to attend Party Conference as I was asked to join two other UK parliamentary representatives on a Council of Europe delegation to Bosnia Herzegovina. The delegation was tasked with monitoring the Presidential and General Elections to verify that the elections were free and fair, and that there was no obvious corruption in the process. Election observation missions help to ensure that the crucial values of the Council of Europe in the matters of human rights, promoting democracy, and the rule of law are known, understood, and accepted, and that countries are committed to them in the ways in which they conduct elections. In this instance we were able to confirm that the election was peaceful and fair. However, in the longer term many questions remain about the stability of the country. This work of the Council of Europe makes an important contribution in working towards greater stability, both in Member States (of which there are 46) and beyond. Observations are by official request of the national authorities.

In recent years we have become only too aware of our global interdependence, both because of the pandemic and, more recently, as a result of the conflict in Ukraine. One aspect of our global interdependence is around food security and supply chains. The need for home production is ever more important for continuity of supply, and also to reduce the miles that our food travels. In an area where farming is important it is good to see the industry being given

more independence and financial resilience. The new Environmental Land Management Schemes being rolled out will support farmers to not only produce high-quality food but also to protect and enhance the natural environment.

Another issue that I know to be of local concern is that of planning. I have long championed reforms in this area, seeking greater local input through Neighbourhood Planning, and I am pleased to see that the proposed legislation looks to strengthen this. I have also long expressed my concerns at the lack of infrastructure coming forward in line with development and will be watching closely to see how the proposals for a new Infrastructure Levy will work to ensure that we have the things we need for our communities, such as schools and GP surgeries. I know that some concern has been expressed at the proposals for Investment Zones, especially in relation to the environment. It is my understanding that key planning policies will ensure that developments protect our precious natural heritage and maintain national policy on the Green Belt.

For many the overarching concern at the moment is the cost of living. Whilst we await the details of the Government Financial Plan, I trust that everyone is aware of the support for which they are eligible. Full details of this can be found on the Government website at www.gov.uk/cost-of-living. At this link you can find the support set up for everyone, as well as support for those on low incomes, those with disabilities, for small business, and several other links.

As we settle into this period of parliamentary time there will be many issues for discussion. If there is an issue that concerns you, please do share your thoughts.
