The Committee is working hard on a number of other events during the year (more details to come in further editions of MN) but include VE day celebrations, another Moulsfest in June with camping, an autumn vintage bus tour of local pubs and a Halloween Party.

Parish Council Report

Starting off with some good news, we are very pleased to report that we have received two grants for key village projects. Many thanks to all those who helped make these grants happen.

Firstly, we have been awarded £2,000 from County Councillor Mark Gray's priority fund as a contribution towards resurfacing works on Ferry Lane, to be matched with contributions from Parish funds and Oxford County Council. As residents may be aware, the condition of Ferry Lane has been deteriorating, making it increasingly hazardous for the combination of vehicles, cyclists and walkers trying to traverse the patchy surface and potholes. We are now starting to liaise with OCC Highways to commission and plan the works.

Secondly, we have been awarded £1,000 from District Councillor Anne-Marie Simpson under the Councillor Grant scheme towards development of the playground project. Combined with the donations raised during the Christmas season (more thanks!), this enables us to commission a review of both the playground and the wider recreation ground from experienced local landscape architects. We want to understand better the full potential of this special space in the heart of our village, not just for children's playground equipment, but for enhancing it for everyone else, and also its flora and fauna. Fundraising will continue as proposals take shape, with the Events

Committee taking a lead on this over the social season; many thanks to the team for their efforts. We look forward to updating everyone as ideas develop and are floated out for feedback.

The first Parish Council meeting of 2020 in February highlighted two important areas of village concern. Residents will be aware that Friends of the Elderly (FOTE) are currently working on proposals for a substantial development at the Old Vicarage of apartments and associated amenities. A group representing FOTE came to the meeting to present updates on the original proposals and both residents and the PC were able to pose questions about the plans. A more comprehensive report will shortly be available on-line in the meeting's minutes on the village website. Given the levels of interest in the proposals we have requested that FOTE seek to hold another public consultation with residents, but as I write, we have not had confirmation as to when this may be - so we would urge you to keep an eye out for notices. As yet, a formal planning application has not been submitted, but when it is, the Parish Council will be considering all aspects and implications of the proposals very carefully when forming our response. Also vital in planning consultations are the comments of the wider public, and we strongly urge villagers to take an active part in the process and make your views known. Full advice on commenting on applications, including guidance on the all-important material considerations can be found by Googling 'SODC planning' or more precisely, at: http://www.southoxon.gov.uk/services-and-advice/planning-and-building/find-application/comment-planning-application. Villagers may also wish to contact the Moulsford Residents group (see last month's Moulsford News) who are keeping track of the proposals' progress as well.

The other key matter was the increasingly challenging conditions being encountered along Halfpenny Lane, where inappropriate vehicle speeds, increasing traffic levels, oversize vehicles, narrow highway sections and badly potholed verges are just some of the factors combining to create hazardous situations - as evidenced by a number of accidents and near misses. Residents of the lane have raised these issues with both the PC and OCC, and we are now investigating with local councillors what can be done to improve the situation. In the meantime, please take great care when using Halfpenny Lane.

Finally, with the recent weather causing fresh problems, if you do encounter pothole issues on Halfpenny Lane or elsewhere around the area, please remember you can submit a report on <u>fixmystreet.com</u>; broken drains, flooding, fly-tipping and more can all be logged for attention.

From the Vicar Andrew Petit

My dear friends,

By the time this edition of *Moulsford News* reaches you, we have begun the season of Lent. For many centuries Lent was traditionally a time of fasting, (or perhaps I should say *increased* fasting, as people often fasted from meat on Fridays all year round). Not many fast these days or at least not quite in the traditional way. However, fasting in various forms is now making quite a come-back. We have just had *Dry January*, where many have given up alcohol for month, possibly following some over-indulgence during the festive season. Others have taken up *Vejanuary* and adopted a Vegan diet during that month. And of course, many are adopting a Vegan diet as a long-term or even permanent life-style choice. This might be for health reasons, or to help preserve the planet, or on ethical grounds rejecting not just the killing but the farming of animals.

Whether you agree with such an approach or not, it does show that for many, fasting is not seen as a negative decision, but as a very positive one that will bring benefit and blessing either to the individual or to the wider community through helping preserve the environment. Indeed, we are beginning to recognise that we need urgently to cut down on many of our current appetites not only to bring benefit to our planet but for our very survival. We desperately need to fast from fossil fuels, our addiction to plastic, and the excessive amounts of meat and palm-oil we consume, if we want to ensure that our planet can continue to be a place which can maintain our very existence.

Every year, the Archbishop of Canterbury recommends a book for Lent, and this year he is recommending *Saying Yes to life* by Ruth Valerio, which explores what it means for us to be human beings, made in the image of God, who are entrusted to look after this wonderful planet that has been given to us. Just as many see different kinds of fasting as a very positive decision taken in order to be healthier, so Ruth Valerio, presents taking imaginative action in changing our life-styles, as a wonderfully positive way of helping our planet to be healthier and the human race

to be happier.

Whatever your beliefs, I would like to add my recommendation to that of the Archbishop of Canterbury, that you read this book.


