We are looking forward to the lighter evenings so we can start doing more outdoor sports and farm tours. **Rosie Woodcock**





Dear Friends,

Lately, I have been admiring how beautiful our four churches are. By this, I don't just mean the buildings themselves (though they are all amazing in their own way). I actually mean the consistent way they blow me away, week-in, week-out. Each week I stand in the pulpit and marvel at the flowers on display, each collection deliberately and carefully arranged. Each week I stand behind the altar in gratitude for how well Holy Communion has been prepared for, with the various linens washed, ironed, folded, and laid out alongside polished plates and chalices. Each week my heart is warmed as a smile greets me at the door, something especially welcome if it has been a busy week. Each week, I thank God for our volunteers.

These are people whose work often goes unseen. Whose commitment often goes unnoticed. Such people have a unique Christian ministry. They pick up the phone and check up on their neighbours, particularly those who are lonely. They deliver meals-on-wheels to those who might struggle preparing food on their own. They wake up each morning ready to care for their loved one. They donate to the food bank, drive people to the shops, befriend the lonely, welcome the new-comer, put on community events, edit and collate community magazines such as this one, and sing in our church choirs. These people, many of whom I know are reading this, include those who are the lifeblood of our communities, the beating heart of our churches, and the bringers of light and love to situations that sometimes only they know about.

It reminds me of two things. The first is something Jesus himself says in Matthew chapter 6, about God the Father seeing and knowing about the good work we do, even if others don't see it. *(See Matthew 6. Verses 2-4).* The other is a sonnet I read today, by the poet Malcom Guite.

So much goes unseen and stays unsaid, So much that carers keep within their hearts; The children who get parents out of bed, Already tired before their school day starts, The neighbours who keep giving up their time, To add a daily round of extra care, Veronicas who cleanse the sweat and grime, And those whose gift is simply being there, The patient partners lifting up a cross, To bear the burden their beloved bears, Who ease each other through the pain and loss, And feel that no one sees, and no one cares. And there is One to hear, to feel, to see And he will say 'Ye did it unto me.'

LETTER FROM HEREFORD FOR JUNE

Hello Everyone,

As I write this we are preparing to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Whatever your view about having a hereditary monarch from a historical point of view most of us alive today will not see such a long serving monarch again in our lifetime. This truly is therefore a once in a lifetime event and may never take place again. Queen Elizabeth the Second came to the throne 70 years ago. She has already reigned longer than Queen Victoria who reigned for 63 years and 7 months and King George III who reigned for 59 years and 96 days. This is a significant historical event and it should be marked with appropriate national celebration. Some of you reading this may have met the Queen and have very clear memories of that moment and the impact it made. The jubilee coincides with Pentecost and the 'Thy Kingdom Come' global wave of prayer organised by the church and it strikes me this is entirely appropriate given that the Queen has such a strong personal faith. As she herself has said on many occasions, it is her personal faith that guides her actions and her life. <i>"To many of us our beliefs are of fun-damental importance. For me the teachings of Christ and my own personal accountability before God provide a framework in which I try to lead my life. 1, like so many of you, have drawn great comfort in difficult times from Christ's words and example." (Christmas message, 2000)</i>
Whilst it is easy to complain or write off royalty as an historic anachronism, which has no place in the 21 st Century we are fortunate in our nation to have a Queen who has publicly stated her belief in Jesus and takes seriously her role as head of the Church of England. She recognises as so many of us have that there is a better way to live our lives and that trust in Jesus is at the heart of that life. It does not matter who we are or what our circumstances are, God does not judge by our race, gender, age or many other things we use as humans to divide and discriminate he judges the heart. When Samuel was called to anoint a new King over Israel, he had to learn the same lesson that God did not choose the obvious candidates. <i>"When they arrived, Samuel saw Eliab and thought, "Surely the Lord's anointed stands here before the Lord. "But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not consider his appearance or his height, for I have rejected him. The Lord does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart." <i>1 Samuel 16:6-7</i></i>
The challenge for us is to ask ourselves what guides our lives and shapes who we are? Do we simply live for ourselves or do we recognise that there is a better way of living that God has provided for us through the death and resurrection of his Son Jesus Christ. The offer to live God's way is constantly available to us but we must choose it. As the writer of the book of Revelation says Jesus stands at the door of our lives and longs for us to let him in. "Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with that person, and they with me."
Whatever our view of the Queen as an earthly monarch, as Christians we believe in a King and a Kingdom which is everlasting and without end. Our service and allegiance is not to the United Kingdom but to God's Kingdom : something our Queen understands and acknowledges. We can and should celebrate the Queen's 70 years of service to our nation shaped by her faith, calling and determination to serve God. We should also remember, as Paul taught Timothy, to pray for her and our nation's leaders but remember too that the faith she so often speaks about is available to all of us too. "I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people—for kings, queens and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. This is good, and pleases God our Saviour, who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth. For there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus."

News from Rushbury Church of England Primary School

It is a while since the school provided an update for the Honeypot Magazine and plenty has been going on in the meantime. Firstly, we managed to come through a very challenging start to 2022 in relation to the pandemic. It almost felt as if it was inevitable and just a matter of time before school was impacted in the way it was. Fortunately, we have stayed open for every school day for all pupils since the most recent national lockdown, but January into February in particular, witnessed significant covid infection rates with staff and pupils. Fortunately, this summer term has started much more smoothly and it is the first time for a very long time that a school term has felt how it should do! Our Year 6 completed their SATs (Standard Assessment Tests) just last week, the first time in three years that this has occurred in primary schools, nationwide.

Our pupils are now benefitting from so many shared experiences with other schools in our vicinity – orienteering at Carding Mill Valley and a cricket tournament at Church Stretton in recent days and weeks. We also have plenty more planned and an end of school year performance to plan, prepare and rehearse for. A play which will have more pirates and mermaids than you could shake a stick at!

Having spent such a lengthy period in near-isolation due to the pandemic, this school year has been about re-establishing links with our community; strong links which had existed over many previous years. This was one of the reasons for renaming our classes as Ticklerton, Gretton and Stanway to further cement those links and add context to Rushbury School – even for our very youngest pupils. In addition, Ticklerton Class (ages 4-7) enjoy their weekly walk and have benefited from an increased understanding of their local environment and the Apedale Parish. We also recently enjoyed a whole-school sponsored walk to Stanway Farm as well as guided tours of St Peter's Church thanks to Revd Mann, towards the start of this academic year.





We have also planted a silver birch tree in the school grounds as part of the 'Queen's Green Canopy' initiative to mark her platinum jubilee. Furthermore, we also intend to hold a 'street party' to celebrate this landmark day by transforming our playground into a street scene, ahead of the half-term holiday.


A couple of weeks back our Year 5 pupils delivered an in-person presentation to members of Rushbury Parish Council, sharing what the school had been up to over the last 12 months or so. To further develop links with the community, we have also set up a school council and a 'Rushbury Rotakids' organisation – both have been busy since their inception.

Firstly, our school council through promoting a 'get active' weekend for all pupils, raised almost £1,000 for the victims of the war in Ukraine and are busily organising a cake sale to raise funds for the 'Cancer UK' charity. Our Rotakids Club have looked closer to home and worked alongside Church Stretton Rotary Club to raise awareness and approach organisations who may be able to help school to fund the cost of a defibrillator, to be situated outside the school and near to St Peter's Church. The children felt that the defibrillator situated at Rushbury Village Hall was a fair distance and that there was a need for a second one for the benefit of residents and visitors to the village of Rushbury. In addition, Rotakids have been working alongside Lorna Taylor on the 'Restoring Shropshire's Verges Project', by establishing a wildflower meadow in our grounds to encourage biodiversity on the school site.

Finally, the school was very proud, early in the spring term to finally witness the bicentennial plaque being erected on to the front of the schoolhouse building. Do take a quick look when you happen to next pass through Rushbury.




