Bus Service Discontinuation

- This has not yet (at the time of writing) been officially announced by Wilts Council, but we know the decision has been taken. (It may have been announced by the time you read these notes.)
- **The bus route that serves Charlton is to be discontinued with effect from 7th Apr 26.** It is understood that a very low average number of passengers is the reason. And incidentally this applies to all the villages on bus route 93, including for example Hankerton.
- Instead Charlton (and the other villages) will be served by the **Wiltshire Connect** service.
- Wiltshire Connect is a flexible bus service that operates in parts of rural Wiltshire. You can book your ride in advance up to 7 days ahead and on the day with 30 minutes notice (subject to vehicle availability). It costs the same as the scheduled bus services do – currently £2 or £3 per journey and free bus passes are accepted too.

Annual Parish Meeting (APM), Village Hall Sat 25 Apr, 10am for 1030 start

The APM will be on Sat 25 Apr, doors open 10am for a cup of coffee or tea and a biscuit (there may even be cake!). In addition to a report on the past year from the PC Chairman and a look ahead by our Wilts Cllr, the following will be there to explain things to you (and to answer questions):

- **Gem Festival** (11-14 June) – they have been asked to concentrate on the mitigations they plan to limit the noise effect on the village.
- **Solar Farm transport plan** – Construction of the Minety/Upper Stonehill solar farm will start imminently. When it does, all the construction traffic will route on the B4040 through Charlton. For this reason we have asked them to explain their transport plan to residents at the APM.

Also:

- **Community Benefit funding** – £60,000 has now been received from the developers of the Solar Farm. This will be an opportunity for residents to put forward initial ideas for what the money might be spent on.
- **Wiltshire Connect** – we will explain how this flexible bus service works.

Precept 2026/27

The precept (the Charlton PC element of your Council Tax) was set by the PC in the January PC meeting (as it always is). The PC decided to increase the precept to £11,000, an increase of 10.8% but more significantly it means an increase of just £4.38 for the year, resulting in a Band D charge of £44.97 for the year.

Farming News

Since my last article we have had 280mm of rain, which has certainly made the ground wet again. The other notable aspect of the weather has been the mild temperatures, with very few frosts. As a result, winter cereals have continued to grow when they would normally slow down. This has left us with lush, forward crops and higher levels of disease than we would usually expect at this time of year.

The eagle-eyed among you may have noticed sheep grazing some of the winter wheat along Five Lanes. This is a management technique used to remove some of the lush growth while also helping to take off diseased leaves at the same time.



We have just started spreading digestate onto the winter barley at the northern end of the estate.



This is a by-product of the anaerobic digestion plant situated on the Malmesbury to Tetbury road. When applied to the fields, the digestate provides valuable nutrients needed to grow the crop.

In the next few weeks, when ground conditions allow, we will also begin planting spring wheat in the fields directly behind the cricket pitch. This will most likely be direct drilled, and the crop is destined for the milling market to produce high-grade bread flour.

April's Message from the Ministry

"A Face in the Crowd."

Andy Byron & Kristin Cabot were hoping to blend into the background amongst the 66,000 fans attending the Coldplay concert in Boston last July. Unfortunately, the 'kiss-cam' spotted them cuddling up, much to the outrage of their spouses and employers!

A crowd does generally offer anonymity.

That's certainly the hope of the un-named woman in Mark 5. She absolutely doesn't want to stand out. She's suffered for 12 years from a discharge of blood and has spent all her savings on doctors, to no avail. She's getting sicker. She's 'ritually unclean,' and banned from the Synagogue. It's a desperate situation for her.

Large numbers of people gathered round Jesus as he visits her area, but the woman has worked her way through them and has touched the hem of Jesus' garments. It's a bold action on her part. No words are said. She clearly believes that touching is enough.

Astonishingly, she receives what she desires. Immediately her blood loss stops!

I love this. It says to me that we don't have to have a 'PERFECT' FAITH. That God will meet us in the level of faith we possess, when we reach out for Him. We may be mistaken in the details of what we believe, but God is looking for faith the size of a Mustard Seed. I would dare to say that it is impossible to have a perfect faith, and that God is always meeting all of us in in the landscapes of our limited understanding.

So, this woman is healed and then tries to silently slip away into the crowd. Sometimes, we're shy or hesitant to talk about

our spiritual Life. We want what Christ can give, but we'd like it to be private & hidden.

She's not allowed for the effect of this interaction on Jesus Himself. Her touch is sensed by Him. Jesus can always distinguish between the jostle of a curious mob, and the hopeful touch of a needy soul. As Jesus looks around, so the woman is moved to step forward.

She may have been expecting Jesus to rebuke her - for bringing her illness into contact with Him, but Jesus is very kind. He invites her to come closer and says, "*Daughter, your faith has made you well. Go in peace and be cured of your disease.*" Jesus wants to meet her, so she can hear this special name of tenderness.

So, she went home with a better understanding of who Jesus was and of what He had done. She would never talk of the '*Magic of the Robe*'. Instead, she would always talk of the Lord. Had she been permitted to walk away without that conversation, she may have said happily, 'I found a cure.' Now she would always say, 'I've found a friend.'

Jesus won't let her be anonymous - because He wants her to know she is seen and valued and loved. She goes away restored, remembering not his clothes, but his FACE & his WORDS.

When we have the courage to see ourselves as we are, to acknowledge our need of forgiveness and acceptance, we open ourselves to the healing touch of Christ. Our story tells us that Jesus takes a personal interest in you and me. We are much, much more, than just a face in the crowd to Him. Let's come close.

It's time to remove all glass and pottery containers, Christmas wreaths or artificial flowers from the graves and memorials.

Spring is on its way and very soon the churchyard grass will need to be cut regularly. To ensure that it is possible for those mowing the grass to be able to do so safely and with minimum inconvenience the PCC request that all glass and pottery containers are removed from the graves, including those buried in the grass. If these concealed containers are struck by the mower or scythe the resulting fragments could injure, not only, those working in the churchyard but also visitors when walking around the area.

Please also remove any remaining Christmas wreaths and all artificial flowers. We would ask that all non-compostable materials are taken away with you. Only compostable plant and flower debris should be added to the compost heap.

The PCC take their responsibility to provide a safe working environment seriously and any glass or pottery containers left on graves may be removed.

Thank you for your assistance in ensuring that our beautiful churchyard is a safe place for all to enjoy.

News from Wiltshire Council:

Wiltshire Council

The Council set its budget at the last Full Council meeting: Council Tax rise is set to rise 2.99%, plus the usual 2% Adult Social Care levy, making a total increase of 4.99% - like the majority of councils.

Happily the administration has U-turned on the proposed closure of Household Recycling Centres for now - however visits will have to be booked via an online system (despite evidence this increased fly tipping during COVID). They have also reversed the decision to defund the Link Scheme - which is very welcome.

Kerbside collections are changing:

from 2027 food waste will be collected weekly from every household; plastic film will be collected with other recycling every 2 weeks. The collections of residual waste will take place every three weeks (rather than fortnightly as now). (There are worries about the impact of this on certain households including those with small children).
