





Rector's Ramblings

Rev Suzan Williams

Dear Friends,

There are many things to commend about getting in the car and taking a break somewhere in our wonderful British Isles, but being stuck in traffic on the motorway is not one of them!

I'm sure you all have stories of sitting in jams, sandwiched between lorries for what seems like hours with 'roadworks ahead' signs all around and miles and miles of cones. And when you finally reach the roadworks the site seems deserted with no sign of active construction going on at all - diggers seemingly abandoned, and no sign of life!

Apologies to all construction workers reading at this point – I do understand that you need time off too!).

On a recent trip to Kent I got caught up in roadworks both on the motorway and a sign caught my eye that I had never seen before. It read 'We are working out of sight, so you may not see us'. I wondered if this had been created in response to all those grumbles from the general public about just such experiences.

Construction work on motorways is incredibly complex. What we see and experience once the work is completed in the new intersections, widened motorways, new bridges etc. is the result of the keen minds and skills of a myriad of people from all sorts of disciplines from planners to architects, from civil engineers to groundworkers, often working out of sight, always working to a masterplan but all we experience is the upheaval as change takes place- and all this takes time.

Change often causes upheaval, always

takes time, but may bring with it significant benefits.

My experience of seeing God at work is not dissimilar to my experience of motorway roadworks. Life can be hugely frustrating. We try to find a way through the obstacles that get in the way of what we want to do or where we want to be, or we get 'stuck in traffic' in a rut that we can't see a way out of. Perhaps we look around for those who can help us and we see no-one.

But God is working, often working hardest in the most difficult and challenging times we encounter. God may be working out of sight, and you may not see him, but he is there, patiently waiting for each one of us to accept that changing our ways, turning towards him and asking to be part of his masterplan is the only way to bring about the change that leads to life in all it's fulness.

Perhaps the motorway sign that God writes might say this: 'We are working out of sight so you may not see us, but you will definitely know where we have been'

Perhaps it's time to make a few changes in your life and seek the God who loves you and is working to change your heart and bring about a better future for you— even if he seems to be out of sight!

Op the Earden Path with Topiarius

Almost winter

November is understood to be late autumn, that is the last chance to prepare for winter. This means such things as bringing tender plants into the glasshouse, covering gunnera with their own trees before any really cold weather or leaves, clearing indoor tomatoes, lifting begonia tubers and cutting down asparagus ferns. I don't bring in all borderline effect of wind but the perceived wishardy plants at this point but have to imprint on my brain that it must be done when severe weather is forecast—I have been caught out before. It can be advantageous to buy plants in the autumn rather than in spring. It is then safer from the point of view of frost to overwinter them under glass, and will also give them a good start for spring planting out, particularly if you go for the sensible economy of buying smaller but much cheaper plants.

After clearing the tomatoes, it is a good plan to rake and hoe the glasshouse beds before pots are brought in for the winter. I also check the pH in case liming is needed, and convince myself that applying Jeyes fluid will disinfect everything. It is probable that the glass needs tia. I am in the second camp and can washing to maximise light during the duller months. Outside on the vegetable patch it is not too early to be preparing for next year by weeding and raking the beds after the crops have been cleared. This will also make them ready for spreading soil conditioner or compost. We can't generate enough of our own compost so I will be ordering

ProGrow, which will also be used on flower beds.

We are now well into the pruning season and I like to get as well ahead as possible with dealing with shrubs and snow brings it to a halt. Floribunda roses can be shortened to reduce the dom is that the main pruning is left until spring. Shrub roses generally need very little pruning but I do any that is needed this month.

At a time when the planned changes to the garden resulting from the summer review should be underway, I started thinking of the great variation in the frequency that people change plants or make design changes. Some are forever falling in or out of love with a plant or getting bored with a feature, and hence removing things and probably spending a considerable amount of money on replacement with the latest fancy. Others are perhaps guilty of keeping plants well beyond their sell by date, perhaps out of misplaced loyalty or simply inerreadily put off making change until it is clearly essential. In fact, I find that I am generally oblivious to the need for something to change, whether it be a plant or feature, until some unsuspected stimulus produces a sudden realisation that a change is long overdue, and I will then embrace the change with enthusiasm. •

Museum of London. The earliest bells were not tuned, but later an attempt was made to tune a bell by chiselling bits of metal off the inside. Later mechanical means allowed bells to become precisely tuned. The Whitechapel foundry designed the Olympic bell for the opening ceremony of the 2012 Olympic Games. The foundry was not able to provide sufficient metal to make the bell which had to be made in a shipyard. It is not rung these days since it produces such a loud sound that it would upset local residents.

The sound of church bells upsetting local residents has a long and distinguished history. In America the ringing of bells in a Californian church distressed the locals so much that they called in the local council. Long were the arguments about freedom of expressing religion and right to a quiet life. The chimes of the church in Wantage, celebrated by the late John Betjeman, caused so much disturbance to the local Landlord that he burst into an evensong shouting 'what about love thy neighbour?' Church bells summon not only the faithful but also record the time. Such announcements may be too noisy for some and local noise abatement officials have from time to time been called in to adjudicate. Generally church bells signifying the time are silenced between 11.00pm and 7.00am. The Duke of Bridgwater, of canal fame, was asked by his workers to set the clock to strike 13 times at 1.00pm since they often missed the single chime and didn't get back to work. The clock was later installed in St Mark's church, Worsley near Manchester, where it can still be heard to strike 13 chimes at 1.00pm. ◆

BELLS AND CHURCHES

Bells have been associated with the Christian religion for centuries. Bells themselves are one of the oldest musical instruments, possibly originating in China 5 millennia ago. Church bells ring to announce the time, to proclaim that a service is beginning and to celebrate events during a service: smaller hand bells are often in Catholic and high Anglican churches to acclaim the blessing of the communion bread and wine.

In St Michael's, the tower contains three bells, but none can be rung since the structure of the tower would not support the force of a swinging bell. One of the three bells appears to have a different history from the other two. Lloyd Kenyon's scholarly history of West Felton church mentions a bell being installed in 1662. A further bell with the inscription, not easily discerned these days, "canteMus Domino CantiCum novum" - 'let is sing unto the Lord a new song' was hung in 1700, the capital letters MDCC indicating the Latin date for 1700. It is not clear how many bells there were in the church at that time.

St Michael's church tower collapsed in 1782 and the fate of the bells is not stated; neither is it mentioned whether too hearty a ringing of the bells had a rôle in this disaster. The bells must have been restored since there is a record, again in Lloyd Kenyon's article, of a bell being rung for the curfew. The

first record of this is in 1844-5 but it may have started earlier. The sexton was paid 7s 6d (about £50 in today's money) for ringing the curfew, to start at 7.00pm and to finish at 5.00am, from 5th November to 1st January.

This practice lasted until 1862. Ringing of the curfew originated in the time of William the Conqueror. The word Curfew is derived from the French 'couvrefeu' or cover the fire, indicating that all lights and fires should be extinguished. It was repealed by Henry 1 in 1100, but evidently the practice continued for centuries after that.

Another bell, a tenor, was acquired in 1857 bearing the name of the founders C and G Meares, London foundry, to replace the 1662 bell which had become cracked. An inscription reads: God save the Church the Queen and the Realm. The initials of the churchwardens JD and WH (John Dovaston and William Howells) are also recorded. The old bell had some monetary value but the church had to pay £21 for the new bell and £13 to have it installed.

C and G Meares were bell founders at the London bell foundry in Whitechapel. One of their bells, admittedly rather smaller than those in St Michael's is currently for sale on eBay for £3500. The Whitechapel foundry cast the Liberty Bell and the bell for Big Ben. The foundry started in 1570 and cast its last bell in 2017, the bell being given to the

ST CHAD'S CHURCH, HAUGHTON

St. Chad's Church, Haughton was built in 1886 by the Reverend T.M.B. Bulkeley Owen, of stone taken from the Tedsmore quarry. Previously the Vicar of Welsh Hampton, before inheriting the Tedsmore estate from his father, he also founded All Saints Church in Shrewsbury, the foundation stone of which was laid some ten years earlier in 1875. It was built from stone taken from Shelvock quarry also on Tedsmore estate.

In memoirs published February 1914, frequent reference is made to the large congregation who gathered regularly to worship in St Chad's. It is said that the Church was well loved but it also appears that its Priest inspired great respect and affection within the Parish, and this must have added greatly to the warmth and attraction of his services. Children were often present in such numbers that when seating was full, they sat round the altar steps. The Reverend Bulkeley-Owen was a strong supporter of the Oxford Movement, and it is interesting that the Anglo Catholic tradition was revived and continued for many years in the Parish of West Felton.

St. Chad's Church history is closely bound with Tedsmore and descendants of the founder who came to live there. The stained-glass window above the altar and the finely worked iron cross above a sandstone pillar outside, are memorials to the Revered Bulkeley-Owen and to his wife. The stained-glass

window is from Charles Kempe & Co Studios, glass of exquisite quality. It was the Hon. Mrs Bulkeley-Owen who embroidered the beautiful altar frontals. The altar itself was made of oak grown on the Tedsmore estate and carved by the estate carpenter. The Revered Bulkeley-Owen died on January 5th 1910, and Tedsmore passed to his nephew General Mainwaring Jacson, who continued to take services in St Chads. General Jacson's brother, the Reverend O.F. Jacson inherited the estate five years later. Services were taken by Reverend Jacson. His wife played the organ and ran the Sunday school. The Sexton, Albert Harding, at that time was a well-known local character who, of course, rang the bell, and his loud singing voice is well remembered by those who heard it during the service, he tended to hang on to notes when everyone else had finished.

St Chad's was first lit by candles and oil lamps; hymns were sung without accompaniment. Later a harmonium was installed and gas lighting, with gas supplied first by an acetylene generator and later by calor gas cylinders. In 1979 electric light fittings were put into the original iron supports. The gas lamp shades which give an attractive glowing light, were retained. Electric heaters had been put in some years earlier. Professor Blair-Bell, professor of gynaecology in Liverpool University, was a

(Continued from page 22) generous benefactor of St Chad's. He was a friend of the Jacson family and attended services in the Church, retiring to live in Eardiston House. A Memorial bearing his name and arms can be seen on the west wall. Professor Blair-Bell and his wife are buried in the churchyard, the place clearly marked by a tall

bronze cross. Yoland Brown, in her Ruyton XI Towns history tells us, "The renowned Gynaecologist, William Blair-Bell, is listed as living in Eardiston House in the 1929 and 1934 Trade Directories. His wife Florence died in 1929. Blair-Bell himself collapsed on the train returning from London on 25th January 1936. He was taken to Royal Shrewsbury Infirmary where he

was confirmed dead. A review of

was confirmed dead. A review of 'William Blair-Bell – father and founder' by Sir John Peel in 1986 tells of a man for whom all mothers should be eternally grateful. It has been said that Blair -Bell (1871-1936) was the greatest gynaecologist of the century: that he laid the foundations of modern gynaecology, raising it from a branch of general

surgery to a separate and important new discipline. His admirers stress his flair for research, his skill as a teacher as well as a surgeon, and his administrative ability. Most of all, they remind us that he was mainly responsible for the foundation of the College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists in 1929. Son of a General Practitioner, he began his career in a GP practice in Wallasey. He was appointed as Assistant Consulting Gynaecologist to the Liverpool Infirmary in 1905 at the age of 34, when he began a lifetime of quarrelling with anyone who dared to disagree with him. In 1921 he began his controversial work on the use of lead in the treatment of uterine cancer. His biographer credits him with the introduction of chemotherapy for cancer." William Henry Davies, who lived at the Smithy at Rednal, went to work in America as a butler for a doctor, but unfortunately he took pneumonia and died, the doctor had the young man embalmed, dressed in his butler's uniform and paid for the body to be brought home for burial. The chest at the back of the church is the coffin that brought him home. He was buried in St Chad's churchyard and his grave can be found in row 18, beneath the big tree. Some years ago, the North Shropshire Work Force carried out careful restoration work to the churchyard and to the boundary wall. More recently a new gate was donated by the Lloyd family, a replica of the original. Well established families in West Felton and those who have come to live here more recently, continue to care for St Chad's. The inside is carefully tended, brasses polished, and altar linen laundered; flowers are arranged by volunteers. The church yard is regularly maintained.

In 1998 a new roof was required. The cost £11,000. Many events were held to raise the money, and in May 1999 work started, during this time services were held at St Michael's church. The work was completed in August 1999, a fitting celebration of the new Millennium.

Haughton pool was once a ducking pool where many people were ducked for minor offences, for example, one man was ducked for stealing a rabbit and killing it to feed his eight children.
