Welcome to the latest edition of the Rushcliffe Stakeholder Update. My name is Craig Berry and I am the officer responsible for the policing of Rushcliffe Borough.

As per the last stakeholders report we have increased the number of social media reports and neighbour alerts we are putting out and trying to relay various types of information that you may be interested in..

We currently have just over 2,500 people signed up to neighbourhood alerts, which is an email based system. The benefits are we can be specific in sending out the information to a particular area as when registering yourself to the scheme you provide a Post Code area as to where you live. Although the Police do not have access to the specific details of the distribution list, we can request our reports are sent to persons registered within a certain radius of a particular point, such as a village or road.



Three youths have been arrested following a burglary in East Leake where a vehicle was stolen with keys from an address on Mulberry Way on 25th July 2019. The stolen vehicle was also recovered. The county Burglary team are investigating this.

During the recent warm weather it has been seen that people have been leaving windows open overnight, providing easy access to burglars to enter houses and steal. Ground floor windows or upstairs windows where easy access could be made should not be left open overnight. There are various security mechanisms that be bought to restrict access to windows.

Team updates: West Bridgford

Officers took part in a cycle marking and lock swap event at the Rushcliffe Contact centre/West Bridgford Police station on Saturday 27/07/2019 in conjunction with Rushcliffe Borough Council

Significant crimes as follows

A number of vehicles have been broken into within the West Bridgford area, a number of those were where valuables were on display within the vehicle.

Dwelling house burglaries were reported in Edwalton, Ruddington, along with Radcliffe Road, Tudor Square in West Bridgford.

We have also had some reports of devices being placed on cash machines, the information is that the transaction appears to go as expected, however the cash is trapped in a device and not dispensed. The customer then walks away, leaving the criminal to come and recover the device and the cash.

There has been some good work by a local officer in relation to handbag thefts at local supermarket, hopefully some further updates in the coming week's reports.

General patrols

On Monday 22/07/2019 local officers met with Borough Cllr. And Rushcliffe Borough Councillor Community safety officer, promoting bike security. 'Want to keep it LOCK IT' campaign.

PCSO Jane BARKER has been busy on cycle patrols the West Bridgford beat areas. Jane has also making contact and engaging with the rough sleepers on a regular basis, along with regular visits to the Friary drop in centre.

PCSO's continue to patrol around the town centre on foot providing a hi-vis presence in West Bridgford.



Team updates: Rushcliffe South

Recent community events attended by the Rushcliffe South NPT as follows.

Engagement with the young people at Normanton on Soar primary school event, on their last day before the summer break.

The Bingham and Radcliffe on Trent Local area group meeting on 25/07/2019, this was also attended by Local and borough Cllrs.

A drugs warrant was executed at an address in Ruddington during the last week. Over 200 cannabis plants were found at various stages of growth and drying within the property. A male was arrested and put before the courts in relation to those offences

Other offences include the theft of bikes from Bingham and Ratcliffe on Soar and Radcliffe on Trent.

A black Mercedes was stolen overnight from Tollerton.

There have also been 2 reports of theft of catalytic convertors stolen from unattended vehicles in car parks in the south of Rushcliffe.

Overnight on the 24th/25th July a number of dwelling house burglaries took place in Radcliffe on Trent. Some good work by local officers and the local burglary CID team has resulted in 3 arrests being made. Further updates will be made on social media outlets.

The Community Road Safety (CRS) kit has been used by a couple of villages in the last 2 weeks, Cropwell Bishop and East Leake. The idea of the CRS equipment, used by local volunteers, is to educate drivers to recognise the speed limit and adhere to it.

An incident of a suspicious person seen in East Leake over the weekend 27th/28th July 2019 was reported to us. Officers were quickly into the village and with the help of local residents responding to a social media request, the male was located and detained.

Some good work around the use of social media which has resulted in some help from local residents.



Team update: Rushcliffe response

This week has been an extremely busy period for the team. One particular area of response policing that has been busy is burglary. With the weather being hot it is often our choice and temptation to leave windows open during the night. Unfortunately, we had to report eight burglaries in the Radcliffe-on-Trent area over one night, this included the theft of a motor vehicle. I am pleased to report that arrests have been made and detectives are continuing their investigations into these reported crimes. I would certainly recommend that you go onto the Nottinghamshire police website to remind you of the home security checklist. crime.prevention@nottinghamshire.pnn.police.uk

We attended an evacuation procedure to assist with the Nottinghamshire Fire service to remove over 25 families from their homes in the village of Bunny; a gas pipe had been breached. I am pleased to say that nobody was hurt and that all the residence acted calmly and moved swiftly to the local public house for their own safety. Transco attended and capped the broken pipe overseen by the emergency services before all the families were back inside their homes within the hour.

My team attended an assault of a female at a local public house where the known offender had left before we arrived. The victim received first aid at the scene and was conveyed to hospital with a head injury. The suspect was located nearby and arrested for GBH and promptly dealt with by the Public Protection unit within the CID. The female is now recovering from the incident. Domestic violence is always dealt with positive action and bringing offenders to justice is a force priority.

My officers have included their time into Operation Crown wheel this week and volunteered to help target ASB within the West Bridgford area. This has included working with the neighbour teams and other response officers to engage and stop and search any individuals involved in disorderly behaviour that has been reported to us. This is a joint effort to make the area a safer environment for all to enjoy.

Mental health is always a concern; the team was called to East Leake, after a local doctor had informed us about one of their clients claiming suicide with young children present inside their house. We attended and forced entry into the property after hearing the children crying inside. A medical team were called and assessments were carried out resulting in the victim being sectioned under the mental health act. The family now have the help that they need as they continue to work with the medical professionals to determine a better future.
