Oxfordshire's Citizen Science WaterBlitz

The 8th Thames WaterBlitz will take place on 26th to 29th April 2019. This bi-annual Citizen Science event, first launched in September 2015, involves hundreds of volunteers carrying out quick and easy to use tests for phosphates and nitrates in local ponds, lakes, ditches, springs, streams and rivers. The Water Blitz is timed to coincide with tests carried out on the non-tidal River Thames by scientists from the Centre for Ecology and Hydrology (CEH). Sharing the data with the Environment Agency, CEH and Catchment Partnerships helps to fill gaps in our knowledge about our local environment. The intensive testing done by volunteers can help identify key pollution sources or clean water spots that act as refuges for some of our special wildlife that's more sensitive to water quality, such as the beautiful but rare fen violet.

Registration is now open for the next Thames WaterBlitz between the 26th and 29th of April. Please follow the steps on this video to register for the event and request your free Freshwater Watch kit https://freshwaterwatch.thewaterhub.org/group/thames-blitz. Don't forgot to register before 21st April to allow time for testing kits to be posted.

Oxfordshire 2050

The Oxfordshire Plan 2050 team has launched a 'Call for Ideas' to try to identify areas for new development and environmental protection in Oxfordshire.

The Plan will set out aspirations for the county's future and consider how best to deliver new homes and infrastructure and other improvements. The plan team wants to gather public views on which broad locations should be considered within the Oxfordshire Plan 2050. These could be locations for large-scale housing or employment, infrastructure projects, or for strategic environmental designations. Even if you just have some initial thoughts, please do let the council know what you think. Oxfordshire Plan Have your say!

The Airfield Development

Hayfield Homes have started work on the former RAF Airfield at the edge of our village. The development has been named Hayfield Green and street names will reflect the types of aircrafts flown from the site. The Parish Council has provided input on the street names and will continue to work with the developers throughout the building phase.

As you know the site is rich with history from the Second World War, most notably as the starting point for a crucial raid, and for being Winston point for Churchill's departure the pivotal Casablanca Conference. To retain its historic significance, Hayfield will be respectfully bringing some of the remaining buildings into the modern day, with careful refurbishment. Other historic structures will be brought back to life and used as informal recreation features, with informative boards explaining their heritage. Walking routes will weave their way through Hayfield Green and along the airfield's former taxiway so that residents, locals and visitors alike can partake on a historical journey of the site's story. In the short term it was necessary to close the foot path through the centre of the development for safety reasons.

The developers are creating a new community hub within the refurbished former Guard Room which will be handed over to the Parish council to manage and maintain and make available as a 'community use building' to new and existing residents alike.

The planning permission for this development is for 66 new homes, including 5 homes within retained airfield buildings and a mixture of 1-5 bedroom new build homes, includes 9 bungalows and 40% affordable housing. Hayfield is aiming towards an

off-plan launch in April 2019, with a show home opening in the summer.

Village Spring Clean

Thank you Steve Tuck for organising the March Spring Clean. It was good to see so many young and old people out collecting to help us ensure the village remains litter free. The volunteers focused in the village this month as the B4449 road side was the focus last month. As a result over 30 bags (and some large items) were taken to the tip.

Next Litter Pick Saturday April 13^{th,} 10am – the same day as the next Village Market in the Village Hall so you could support two community events in one day.

Village Hall Car Park

The 1st phase of the Car Park Improvement has been competed - tarmacked slope and additional granite chippings to aid drainage but unfortunately, we don't have a date for the road and pavement repair at the car park entrance

Cycling Race

The OVO Energy Women's Tour professional cycling race will pedal through the county on Wednesday, June 12. The council expect cycling fans to visit Oxfordshire to watch the race, generating additional business for restaurants, bars, hotels, B&Bs and shops.

The race will start in South Oxfordshire and end at Blenheim Palace. Details of the exact route, which will pass through the Vale of White Horse and West Oxfordshire, will be revealed in coming weeks.

Oxfordshire Fire & Rescue Service are looking for Oncall Firefighters to join their team!

Do you want to earn extra money, serve your community and save lives in a rewarding role? If so, a career as an On-call Firefighter might be just the thing for you.

On-call Firefighters are the backbone of the fire service and anyone can be one. If you're employed full-time, are a parent, out of employment or just have some spare time, you can respond to emergency calls.

On-call Firefighters are trained and paid for their time and service - and on average are expected to be called out two or three times each week for about an hour at a time - this can be at night or during the day.

They are looking for anyone over the age of 18, who is physically fit (this can be worked on), doesn't suffer from vertigo, claustrophobia or dislike the sight of blood. They need good common sense, to be enthusiastic, reliable and honest.
