Grafty Gourmet

This is another very simple recipe for you to try. Roasting a pineapple whole gives you the best of both worlds. The outside is hot and sticky, but the middle remains juicy and sweet, making this the perfect summer dessert.

Roast Pineapple with Coconut Rum Cream

100g of light muscovado sugar
1 teaspoon of chilli flakes, plus extra to serve
1 teaspoon of cracked black pepper
1 pineapple, peeled with top leaves left on
50g of butter
160g can of coconut cream
2 tablespoons of white rum

1. Heat the oven to 160C for fan oven or 180C for conventional oven. Mix the sugar, chilli flakes and 1 teaspoon of cracked black pepper in a large roasting tin. Roll the peeled pineapple in the mixture. Leave the pineapple in the tin and dot the top with large pieces of the butter.

2. Roast the pineapple for 30 minutes, basting every 10 minutes with the buttery juices, until sticky and golden. Remove from the oven and let it cool slightly.

3 While the pineapple is cooling, make the rum cream by whipping the coconut cream to form soft peaks. Then fold in the rum. Just before serving, baste the pineapple again in the buttery juice. To serve, Sprinkle with a few extra chilli flakes and slice up the pineapple. Add some of the extra sauce from the roasting tin and a large dollop of the cream.

Now, the big news is that our **Medieval-themed fete** is only a month away, on **Saturday 2nd Sept**. You don't need much to give your get-up a medieval flavour. Become a medieval monk in your hooded bathrobe or a peasant with an old shirt and some string around your trouser legs. Perhaps, somewhere in your family, there is lurking a Robin Hood or Maid Marion outfit. Search 'medieval costume' on-line for loads of ideas for things easily made.

On the next page are simple designs for hats that can be made out of stiff paper, but other headgear is possible. A floppy cap with a feather would make a lovely squire's hat and a plastic bucket or bowl + ingenuity would make a fine knight's helmet! Medieval fete – Saturday 2nd September

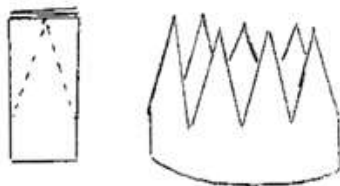
Make a 'jester's crown' or a 'princess cone'

from stiff paper (perhaps left-over wallpaper) following the instructions below:



Jester's Crown:

1. Measure round your head at forehead level.
2. Cut out a piece of paper this long (plus 2"-3" for an overlap) and about half as wide.
3. Colour the sheet at this stage, if it is plain.
3. Fold its length in half, then in half again, then in half again.
4. Mark mid-way along the top of the folded sheet and on each edge 2"-3" from the bottom.
5. Draw a line from the top mark to each of the side marks and cut the corners off.
6. Open the sheet out, overlap and join the ends with sellotape inside and out.
7. Curl the points down and decorate them with something light & fancy from Hobbycraft!



Princess cone:

1. Cut paper into a square with sides of 12" or so and colour/decorate it.
2. Curl the paper diagonally (top left corner towards bottom right corner) and overlap it as necessary to form a cone.
3. Sellotape these edges together, inside and out.
4. If necessary, make holes about 1/2 way along each of the open edges, reinforced with sellotape, and thread through some ribbon to form a chin strap.
5. Attach some tissue paper or light material to the point of the cone so it hangs to the back.



Make a hobby horse like this, or go on-line for more ideas:

1. Start with a broom handle, or dowling of similar dimensions.
2. Use a saw to make a groove around it approximately 12" from one end.
3. Stuff a long sock to make the face and neck of your hobby horse, and temporarily tie some wool or cord around the top to keep the stuffing in.
4. Sew on buttons for the eyes.
5. Cut two pieces of felt to make ears and sew or stick these to the heel of the sock.
6. Wool can be used for the mane and fringe, and tape can be used to make a bridle.
7. When the head is finished untie the sock in order that you can feed the dowling/broom handle in, so that it reaches the heel of the sock.
8. Using strong thread or cord, tie the head onto the dowling using the prepared groove to secure the head tightly.

A Tweet is an expression of a moment or idea. It can contain text, photos, and videos. Millions of Tweets are shared in real time, every day.

When you follow people, their Tweets instantly show up in your timeline. Similarly, your Tweets show up in your followers' timelines. To see interesting Tweets, follow interesting people: friends, celebrities, news sources, or anyone who's Tweets you enjoy.

Reading Tweets and discovering new information whenever you check in on your Twitter timeline is where you'll find the most value on Twitter. Some people find it useful to contribute their own Tweets, but the real magic of Twitter lies in absorbing real-time information that matters to you.

Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council on Monday 10th July 2017, 7.40pm in Grafty Green Village Hall

Present: Cllrs R Turner (Chair); A Allum; T King; J Collins
Clerk Mr Chris Hume

In attendance: Cllr Shellina Prendergast

Cllr Turner opened meeting at 7.40pm

1. Anybody filming or recording this meeting to declare it: No declarations made.
2. **Apologies** – received and accepted apologies for absence from – Cllr R Galton, Chris Wheal, John Boyd, Stuart Ellesmere, Cllr Martin Round
3. **Declarations:**
Any lobbying - none
Any interest in items on the Agenda - none
Any changes to the register of pecuniary interests – none
4. The minutes of the meeting held on the 8th May 2017 were approved.
6. **Matters Arising** – there were no matters arising
5. **Public session** - no one in attendance from the public
7. **KCC/MBC Reports**

Cllr Shellina Prendergast requested that the Parish Council responds to the Planning Inspectorate appeal with regard to land at the rear of The Meadows. It was agreed that the Parish Council would respond in line with the previous submission to the planning application.

Cllr Prendergast advised the council, with regard to heavy goods vehicles using Liverton Hill, to collect data using a lorry watch approach and write to her on the issue of 7.5 Tonne signs.

Cllr Prendergast invited the Councillors to arrange an informal meeting with her to discuss Parish issues. Clerk to arrange.

If there are any further abandoned caravans Shellina advised that the Clerk writes to John Edwards at MBC with a copy to her.

8. **Local Policing/community**
Councillors were disappointed to note that none of the invitees were present. The Clerk was asked to inform invitees of their disappointment and request attendance at future meetings.

9. **Highway and Footway Matters**
- 9.1 Liverton Hill – noted forthcoming closure and concerns raised by residents
 - 9.2 Ditches, gullies, pot holes - noted works completed on potholes. Agreed to keep pressing with regard to gullies
 - 9.3 Speedwatch – noted problems arising from the approvals process
 - 9.4 HGV Signage – signs now in place but too small. Cllr Turner will write to Shellina Prendergast with regard to a 7.5 tonne limit
 - 9.5 Lorry watch – it was agreed that this should be explored

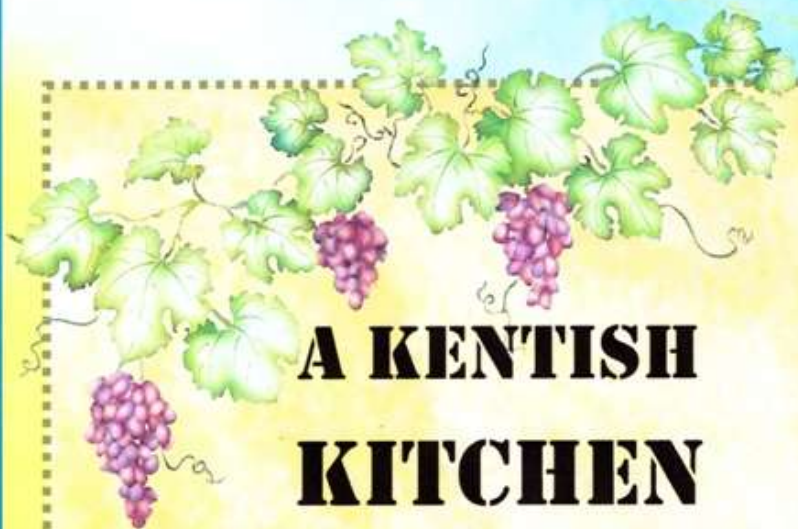

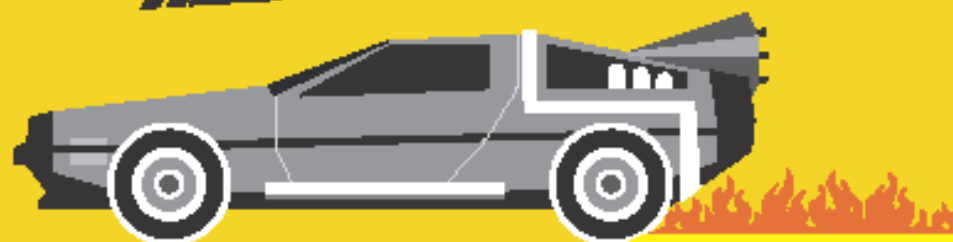

Christian Message August 2017

Phew!

After four years of study my Reader training course is finished at St Augustine's College. Initially it was a case of sighing with relief that the work was all over, a little sadness at the parting of the ways from fellow students and tutors, and then a time of celebrating the results.

With an ending, however, comes time to take stock and reflect; uncertainty and questions about one's future, a sending out and eventually, new beginning. I'm sure this must be familiar to many people, not least those who have recently left school, university or have changed jobs

God prepared Moses for the task ahead of him and then sent him out. In fact again and again in the Old Testament people are prepared for a task and then sent out, often reluctantly and with fear and trepidation but eventually with success through God's power.

In the New Testament Jesus went through the same process and later prepared his disciples for the life that lay ahead of them and then sent them out to carry on with the work that he had started. Just like the disciples, we are called to step out in confidence to carry on God's work; to care for his creation; love one another; look after those in distress, hungry and suffering and witness to him.

It is important to BE PREPARED as all good Girl Guides know but there is no need to be hesitant if we study God's word, follow his 'rules' for life, pray regularly and let the Holy Spirit guide us. My late father used to say that you only really learn how to drive a car once you have passed your test. My mother said something similar about teaching, claiming that all the training in the world can never quite prepare you for the 'classroom experience.' We have to expect the unexpected but, protected by our armour of faith, we know that we *can do all things through Jesus Christ who strengthens us (Philippians 4:13)*. Of course it helps to have the love, guidance and support of others. The four parishes of our Group could not have been more welcoming and supportive to me over the last four years and the ministry team are available to help and to guide.

I pray that I can serve the community, our new incumbent and God to the best of my ability and look forward to the next step in my faith journey. I hope our new Vicar is looking forward to the next step in his faith journey and experiences the same welcome in each parish that I have, and I hope that you look forward to the next step in your faith journey strengthened by the knowledge that Jesus loves you whatever you do next.

If you have not yet asked Jesus into your life, now is your chance to take that step and know his love. It may feel like a giant leap into the unknown but you have a whole Church family ready to welcome and support you.
