Visiting Oxford Hospitals

From Wednesday 17 May, the following changes apply:

- * Inpatients in our hospitals can have any two visitors with them at any one time between 8am and 8pm (they don't have to be the same two visitors throughout the day)
- * Patients on our Children's wards and in Neonates and the Paediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU) can have immediate family members, including siblings, with them at any time (wider family visiting will be considered on a case-by-case basis)
- * Patients attending our Outpatient Departments and Emergency Departments can have two people with them if required.

Maternity guidance remains the same - maternity inpatients who are not on the labour wards can have up to two visitors a day with them between the hours of 8am and 8pm (birth partner and one other nominated person)

As with previous visiting rules, we will protect mealtimes wherever possible unless visitors are offering assistance.

As always, there will be consideration for exceptional circumstances such as patients sadly at the end of their life and patients with additional needs.

As a reminder, patients and visitors must wear face masks if:

- * Visiting immunocompromised patients
- * Attending departments at the Churchill Hospital including Haematology, Oncology, Transplant, Chemotherapy, and Renal (including Dialysis)
- * Advised by Infection Prevention and Control (for example, visiting patients with COVID-19).

Anyone may of course wear a mask if they choose to, and if a patient or visitor asks staff to wear a mask then they will do so.

As always, we will keep this guidance under review and let you know if anything changes.

From the Vicar Rebecca Peters

Dear Friends,

"The Archbishop of Canterbury has said that he takes antidepressants so that he can maintain an "Eeyore status", instead of "something much worse."

He referred to his depression during a recent lecture he gave in Canterbury Cathedral, where he also spoke of having sought professional help for his mental health.

Archbishop Welby said: "As the psychiatrist I see tells me, the aim is not to make me so laid back that I'm horizontal, but just to settle things enough that I react like an average sort of human being. I'm sad when things are sad, and happy when they're happy, and so on and so forth."

The Archbishop went on to say that he likens human emotions to the characters in Winnie the Pooh, and compared himself to Eeyore, the often melancholy donkey, as opposed to a "bouncy" Tigger.

The Archbishop said that taking antidepressants "restore me to Eeyore status from something much worse." He went on: "Some of us are Tiggers, some of us are Eeyores. Probably, some of us are many of the other characters in Winnie the Pooh."





It is a very exciting prospect - we anticipate getting even more disabled and less mobile people from our area, with their friends and families, out on the river in our wheelyboat, WOW-one. She is in gleaming condition just back from an annual service and complete with a few additional accessories to aid our passengers and crew members alike."

Jenkins continued: "We have introduced a new booking system which will make it a lot easier for our clients to book a voyage and for our crew members to review their duty schedules. All our clients have to do is go to www.wabc.org.uk/book and enter the required details of their friends and family members who will be accompanying them. It couldn't be easier. And a glorious trip on our lovely river awaits!!"




Come for a walk during the North Wessex Downs Walking Festival 2-11 June 2023

Today we will be looking into a beautiful tree. They have large fragrant flowers in bowl or star shapes, and can show off a variety of colours including white, pink, purple, green or yellow. Have you guessed it? Well, let's see.

The answer is Magnolia!

Congratulations to those who got it right, but if you didn't then there is nothing to worry about as after this page, you all will be sprouting knowledge about magnolias.

Let's start things of with some quick fun facts about magnolias.

No.1, Magnolias are believed to be the earliest known flowering plants, with their fossils dating back from over 100 million years. Blimey, that is one big number.

No.2, Magnolia trees have a lifespan of about 80 to 120 years old but the oldest recorded tree is 320 years old and still living. I do like my big numbers!

No.3, In Mississippi lives the biggest magnolia tree in the WORLD! Measuring 122 feet, this whopper is 22 (or more) fully grown men tall, wow!

Now last but not least -

No.4, Magnolias represent Luck and stability, hence, they are found in many gardens here in the U.K.





Moving on to the descriptions, but seeing as there are about 300 known species, because I can't describe them all, I will just pick out my favourite one which is the... Yulan Magnolia, known to be one of the prettiest of all species.

The Yulan magnolia, also known as the lily tree, has light grey furred flower buds in the winter, which open in spring to reveal thick, pure white petals. The bark is smooth and grey, but often cracks when grown older. The crown is dense and all of the branches are relatively thin, and like to curl and twist around each other, creating this wonderful, mystical illusion.

The name Magnolia comes from a french botanist named Pierre Magnol, hence the name. He discovered, recorded and described the first known magnolia species known as the Magnolia Virginiana. That was just a little fact but now back to the topic.

Yulan magnolias are huge pollinator attractors, their sweet nectar can be smelled for miles by bees, but not only them but also other insects including fruit flies and leafhoppers.

The magnolia woods are mostly used for furniture items including doors and shelves.

If you were wondering, there are also magnolia shrubs, -we have one in our garden-, but this is tree time not shrub sanctuary!
