2018 saw us raise our biggest yearly total for the village charities. In December we handed over £6,000 in total, a share for the Church, Chapel and village hall of £2,000 each. To date we have raised over £33,000 which has all been ploughed back into the village to help with general running costs etc. This year we are continuing our fund-raising efforts by means of undertaking a variety of activities; the most recent being catering for a funeral of over 400 mourners.

Our membership has continued to grow, and in spite of us losing a key member of the group just recently, we now have a membership of 30 which is amazing. We still have a variety of speakers and demonstrations....this month we are engaging in some willow weaving which is pleasing to the "crafty" members of the group. In May we have been asked to help out and assist the Merton Monks at the yearly Rally. Although on a much smaller scale, due to a bereavement, there will be no stalls, however, we have been asked to serve an afternoon tea. Any profit made at this event will be shared with us, Cancer Research and the local hospice.

We will continue to raise as much as we can for our village charities. This can only be achieved by the time, effort and generosity of the group members and we thank everyone for the support they have shown us at our various events over the years.

We are grateful to the village for supporting us either in donations, attending fund raising events and coming to services.

The PCC continues to care for the Graveyard and pay for having the grass cut. It is quite an expense out of our budget every year, we do receive a grant of £250 from the Parish Council but that doesn't cover the cost of one cutting.

An Alpha course held last September was very popular and led to a fellowship group which meets once a fortnight. We do hope to hold another Alpha course this year so if you are interested please speak to me or David French.

Our fund-raising events were well supported, the ferret racing was very enjoyable and we hope to do it again. The cider and pasty walk was also well supported thanks to Emma Richards and Richard Gooding for planning the route. The Victorian evening saw everyone really go to town on their outfits which were wonderful.

The PCC hopes the church will continue to grow in membership and that the village will continue to support all our efforts.

## **Merton and Petrockstowe Heritage Group**

We have had varied and interesting speakers throughout the year and enjoyed trips to Tapley Park, Lew Trenchard Manor and Holsworthy Museum where we heard about the prison camp sited in Holsworthy during WW2. Many of the prisoners were sent to work on local farms as labour was in short supply. Talks have included early photography in N Devon, old postcards of Dartmoor and Conchies held at Dartmoor Prison.

The group put on a display in St Petrocs church remembering men from the village who had fought in WW1 and also contributed photos for a display about the Baxter Hall which celebrated its 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

Membership has fallen slightly as some members have moved away. Philip Collins stepped down as chair at the AGM after many years of service for which we are most grateful. His place has been taken by Roger Vooght.

We look forward to more interesting speakers and trips this year. Meetings are split between the 2 villages.

The club are holding their AGM tomorrow evening in the Methodist Chapel Hall at 7.30pm when the dates of the 2019 season will be agreed, however the date for the Fete and Dog Show has been set for Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> July. One major alteration this season is the fact that Petrockstowe Cricket Club has resigned from the North Devon Cricket League and will therefore only be playing friendly matches. Finally, on behalf of the Committee I would like to thank Geoff Fox for draining the water in the pavilion and buildings during the winter months. ## **Clr Saywell**

(Following on from a discussion about engaging youth) I am the youngest Clr on the County Council but it can be difficult finding younger people wanting to join the council or get involved, and I would urge the Council to look at other ways of engaging young people to get involved in village life (e.g. through social media). The County Council's projected budget is on track. Children's Services have overspent by £11 - £12million. There was a mild winter so Highways and Adult Social Care were not overstretched. I am pleased to have been able to give £850 to Baxter Hall, and the recent success with road signage. Road at Berry Cross will be resurfaced in mid-July and the road through the village is also scheduled. Within Torrington Rural there is £1.4million for capital highways work in the budget. DCC work hard to look after those who need it; the old, young and vulnerable. I'd like to thank the PC for all their help and support and look forward to working with them moving forward.
