

Look two, one's going, one's gone

Since writing the last newsletter, I was expecting the weather to be slightly warmer and with a little less rain and snow. As I write the wet snow falls for the second time today, I am therefore getting a little worried about Easter weather, as it is just around the corner so to speak.

We have rung for services at All Saints held on 6^{th.} and 20th. January, 3rd. and 17th. February and 3rd. March, our next service being 31st. March, which is Easter Sunday at 10-30a.m. entitled, Presentation of Light and Morning Worship.

We have not been able to ring for every practice, owing to other commitments and colds no less. When we have rung, I have been proud of 'the team' not only on practice evenings, but also ringing for the services. Our future services after Easter are as follows, April 7th at 10.30 a.m. and April 21st at 6-00p.m. When, we hope to give the Rev'd D. Yabbocome a ringing good welcome for his first service at All Saints. The services on May 5th·10-30a.m. and May 19th·9-00a.m. are followed by our first wedding for the year to be held on Friday 31st. May at 12-30p.m.

The wedding is of Miss Laura Hudson and Mr. Jamie Diggin, both are from Lincoln. Laura has been a teacher at Queen Eleanor School for four years and has subsequently selected All Saints for her big day. We in the belfry wish Laura and Jamie a long and happy married life. We are looking forward to this ring for a second reason. It will be our last ring before the bell restoration project.

The current ageing bell set up as manufactured in 1877 is due to be refurbished including the fitting of modern bearings by Whitechapel bell foundry. The Notice of Faculty being received by Pat Hazel in early February enables the work to commence on 10th. June, following the wedding on the 31st. May. "What, no Bells?" I hear the Bowls Club say. We ourselves have to make access into the belfry from the ringing chamber, by removing sufficient chamber ceiling timbers and belfry floor, thus allowing the bells to be lowered into the ringing chamber. We also have to remove floor boards in the ring chamber to allow further decent of the bells to ground level.

Pat has been busy writing to various organisations, making enquiries regarding grants towards this project. To date, Pat has received confirmation of a grant from Nottinghamshire Historic Churches Trust. The actual figure will be dependent on the final invoices for the work and is based on a percentage of the costs. "Thank you Pat"

Although the time scale for the project is a little unknown to date, I am expecting the refurbished bells to be 'up and running' in time for our second wedding this year, booked for 21st September. "You will have to put your wedding back John, at a moment's notice I'm afraid, if all's not well, I wouldn't think Julie will mind, the wedding cake won't go off will it?" All will be revealed in the next issue.

The £300 raised by the fayre will be going towards the fitting out of the new school hall, which is due for completion in the summer. This hall will be of very great benefit to the children of the school giving them indoor sporting facilities for the first time. The Friends of Queen Eleanor are concentrating their fund raising activities this year on making sure the hall is everything the school need it to be. Please look out for other fundraising events we will be holding as we greatly appreciate the support of the wider local community.

Finally I would like to thank Noble Foods, Tesco, Doddington Hall and Morgan Tucker for their generous donation of prizes.

NEWS FROM QEP – Jeremy Bingham

The hall is now nearing completion with the roof already on! In spite of the weather the builders are over 3 weeks ahead of schedule and we hope to be using it for PE and events in late June! More good news is that the hall and in fact whole school, will benefit from a new Biomass boiler which will replace our old oil boiler, and will heat both buildings! The hall has been self funded by the school but the County Council are kindly providing the boiler which we hope to run on locally sourced wood pellets.

In our efforts to improve our service to our pupils, school has decided to start a breakfast club on the 15th April (immediately after the Easter holidays) to provide child care for working parents in the mornings, before school starts. This will run from 8am to 8.45am when the children will be 'handed over' to the teachers of their respective classes. Breakfast will be served (cereal, toast and juice) and the cost will be £2.50. Please let us know if you are interested!

As you may know, school was graded as 'Good ' in June 2012 by OFSTED- a grading that is becoming increasingly difficult to achieve! We have very high standards of behaviour and attainment, but also provide a fantastic variety of extra curricular experiences for our children, including a choir, violin lessons, swimming, climbing, an activity holiday, plus various visits to theatres and museums. We are very proud of our achievements and we will very soon have some of the best facilities of any school in the immediate vicinity. Annual Parish Meeting minutes to be approved

Annual allotment and field rents collected.

<u>Village hall</u> accounts were slightly down on the previous year. Main income was from dog training in the hall, Post Office hire, and private bookings. The hall is to be decorated this year.

<u>School</u>: The new sports hall is being constructed. It will have changing rooms, storage, a badminton court sized area and a kitchen. The school is also to benefit from a new boiler and a new kitchen. The OFSTED inspection in June maintained its GOOD judgement.

<u>Playing Field:</u> Car boots were successful last year and raised funds for village organisations. Bonfire night was well attended. New committee members are required. The committee has decided to contract out grass cutting for a year's trial. New junior play equipment is currently being installed.

General Meeting (March) minutes to be approved

- The village is to be entered in the Best Kept Village competition.
- 1st date for the Village Tidy arranged for <u>Sun 12 May 10am Village Hall Car Park</u>, all invited to participate.
- An increase in fly tipping has been noted since Whisby recycling centre opening hours were reduced.
- £500 has been received from County Cllr Dobson towards creating a new Community Led Plan. An open meeting is to be held to start the process.
- Church Road footpath remedial work is on Highways waiting list.
- A village welcome pack is being drafted.
- The Harby community website is to be updated later this year and re-launched.



Harby Thorney Wigsley Community Led Plan

Open meeting – Thursday 25th April Harby Village Hall at 7.30pm

An opportunity to shape the future of our community

In 2005, everyone in Harby participated in the development of Harby Parish Plan, setting out a ten-year vision for the future of the parish eight years later, most of the actions have been achieved and a new vision for the wider community is proposed. Harby Parish Plan has helped secure tens of thousands of pounds of funding for a range of projects such as the history book, conservation initiatives, information boards, multi-sports court on the playing fields and new play equipment for the children's play area to name a few.

The parishes of Harby, Wigsley and Thorney have individual identities and character, but also have much in common Queen Eleanor School, our snail's-pace broadband speed, flooding on Wigsley airfield, transport infrastructure, service provision etc. By working together on common priorities as well as things that are important to individual parishes, in collaboration with Rural Community Action for Nottinghamshire we can collectively shape the future of our communities with a Community Led Plan.

Everyone in the parishes of Thorney, Wigsley and Harby is invited to an open meeting in Harby Village Hall on Thursday 25th April at 7.30pm to learn more and form a steering group for the parishes who want to proceed. Karen Tarburton of Rural Community Action for Nottinghamshire will give a presentation on Community Led Plans and answer questions.

Thorney Parish Council and Harby Parish Council have already secured some initial funding and endorse collaboration on a Community Led Plan, but it is the communities of the three parishes who will determine how it progresses. Over 4,000 communities across England have already developed Community Led Plans, it's up to you to determine what happens in our part of rural Nottinghamshire.
