#### **Grafty Gourmet**

A twist on a traditional bread pudding recipe. Perfect for those cold Winter nights. Try using brioche or pannetone instead of plain bread to make it extra special.

#### **Butterscotch Bread Pudding -** 8 Servings

300g of day old bread torn into small pieces
1 litre of milk
100g caster sugar

125g butter (melted) 3 eggs (beaten) 2 teaspoons of vanilla extract

#### For the Butterscotch Topping:-

300g dark brown sugar 8 tablespoons of golden syrup 400ml of water

- 1. Preheat your oven to 180 degrees C. Butter a 23 x 33cm baking dish (or similar size).
- 2. In a large bowl, combine the bread, milk, sugar, melted butter, beaten eggs and vanilla extract. Mix well. The mixture should be the consistency of porridge. Then pour into the prepared dish.
- 3. In a saucepan, bring the brown sugar, golden syrup and water to the boil, stirring constantly, for 1 minute. The carefully pour the hot syrup mixture over the bread mixture.
- 4. Bake in the oven for 1 hour, until nearly set, and serve. (the mixture should wobble and not be totally solid when ready).

#### **Resilience – Community Self Help**

At the last Parish Council meeting the subject of 'resilience' was raised and discussed and further discussion will take place at the meeting on January 28<sup>th</sup>. In these difficult austere times some 'self -help' can make a real difference to our lives and safety – 'self help' has always been around us and the current discussion and proposals really reflect some new thoughts. Whilst the parish council is at the heart of the community and should have an active interest it should not be, or indeed is it practical for them originate and administer everything. There is of course wide ranging debate and views regarding the levels of service which should be provided by the emergency services, county, borough and parish councils' but the reality is money is tight hence self- help is on the agenda.

A recent article in Malherbe Monthly focused on *Community First Responders* – a volunteer organisation within ambulance services whom work in a 3 mile radius of their home, particularly in rural areas, to provide emergency 'first person on scene' assistance prior to the arrival of a paramedic crew. The CFR's are mobilised by ambulance control centres at the same time as mobilising a 999 ambulance crew – CFR's importantly carry defibrillators and oxygen as well as an array of other equipment; it is an established fact that the first few minutes of medical emergencies can be critical to patient outcomes hence the origination of the CFR schemes meaning trained local help is available almost immediately pending paramedics whom probably would have a longer response time – importantly CFR's are *additional to and not in place of paramedic response.* 

Our ambulance area **SECAmb** operates the CFR scheme and has indicated it would support a scheme in our locality and considers it important. As CFR's are volunteers it would not be practical to achieve 24/7 cover however by operating a dual system a reasonable compromise can be achieved:- by having trained and equipped CFR'(s) supplemented by a 'public fixed defibrillator' whereas the latter is in a locked cabinet accessible to the community with SECAmb holding the lock code which is given to 999 callers when appropriate (defibrillators are easy to use albeit some basic training is advantageous). It is intended to push ahead to develop a scheme in Boughton Malherbe: Lenham, Kingswood and Egerton have CFR's, Bearsted have a public defibrillator, Coxheath and others are developing schemes. It will cost money to implement and fund raising will soon start.

**KCC Community Wardens** have been around since 2002 and there are now nearly 200 primarily covering larger parishes like L Lenham and Headcorn. It

is difficult to quickly summarise their role – they can be likened to the long forgotten 'traditional village bobby' – they patrol in uniform but do not currently have any powers but are trained to deal with wide ranging aspects of rural living and have important roles regarding the safety, well-being or worries of lone or older residents, the vulnerable, young families, the young and youth. Stuart Ellesmere (the Headcorn warden) is to start 'patrols' and contact with Boughton Malherbe very soon – his contact number 07969 583923.

**Kent Fire & Rescue Service Community Volunteers** – non-operational volunteers form part of the community safety team and cover diverse roles promoting fire and road safety. A further role developed since our first major fire back in October 2011 has been the regular visual checking of village fire hydrants ensuring both visibility and availability to fire-fighters albeit we hope they will never again be needed – they can become overgrown or damaged. Robert Turner and Chris Wheal now regularly check our hydrants but welcome any 'extra' eyes and Chris can help with fire and road safety advice including free KFRS home safety visits – 01622 858100 or 0800 923 7000.

Highway Issues – whilst pot holes are the biggest single issue, there are others such as overgrown vegetation obscuring visibility, flooding and extra large puddles, blocked rights of way (footpaths), litter, damaged or missing road signage, litter etc. Many of these issues can be easily resolved and some are in fact already done by a few people on an ad-hoc basis – for instance large potentially dangerous puddles have been easily remedied by digging small verge channels to drain water into ditches. Subject to insurance clarification with the parish council it may be possible to form a 'works team' that could meet perhaps for three or four hours once a month to attend to any of the straightforward 'niggling' issues which occur.

**Policing** – unfortunately it is probably true to say now this is very much 'reactive' and unlikely to change in the next few years, however there is an opportunity for 'self-help' with the volunteer Special Constabulary – but it does rely on 'volunteers'. Neighbourhood watch can play a part and there are big efforts to re-vitalise this but again it relies on enthusiastic volunteers. Speedwatch again can make a difference to road safety by promoting speed awareness and Boughton Malherbe is fortunate to have a very small group of dedicated volunteers.

#### **Grafty Geeks – What's New in Windows 8.1**

Microsoft has now introduced Windows 8.1, here are some of the new things to look out for:

- 1. <u>Search:</u> Get results from your PC (such as files, songs and settings) and from the web with Bing. For some searches you can tap or click right from the results to open maps, play songs or call a business.
- 2. <u>Using multiple applications on one screen:</u> Arrange applications side by side in whatever size suits you best.
- 3. **Personalisation**: More tile sizes, more colours options and animated backgrounds
- 4. <u>All applications:</u> See all your apps in one place with the Apps View. You can choose which apps to pin to Start so you can keep you Start screen organised.
- 5. **New built-in apps:** Windows comes with new built-in apps, including Calculator, Alarms, Reading list, Food & Drink and Health & Fitness



- 6. **Photos:** Edit your photos with rich editing tools in the new Photos app.
- 7. <u>Desktop features:</u> The Start button has returned to the taskbar (tap or click to get to Start). Or go straight to the desktop or Apps view instead of Start when you sign in. Use the same background for your desktop and Start
- 8. <u>Lock screen:</u> Answer Skype calls, take photos or see a slide show of your photos without having to unlock your PC.

#### **Christian Message - January 2014**

I grew up in Scotland at a time when the shops were open on Christmas Day and the New Year Celebrations were the major event. In my family it wasn't the Hogmanay of partying and over indulgence that is often portrayed as the norm north of the Border.

Rather it was a time of renewal. Every cupboard, every corner, every normally forgotten cleaning chore was cleaned to a brilliant standard. The table was laid with the traditional foods, the fire black leaded and roaring and even the small children carried a 'wee dram' (non alcoholic, of course) to give to anyone who might visit. It was an outward sign to all that hope and expectation were alive and well in the family. The story, as I was told, was that if you had plenty at the turn of the year then you were sure to be prosperous in the months ahead. 'Plenty' meant being able to offer strangers food and drink, being generous and welcoming to anyone who happened to cross the threshold. It meant that however hard the past had been the future was full of promise.

The visit of the Wise Men to the baby Jesus brings a profound spiritual depth to this secular notion of hope and renewal. Their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh symbolically confirm the Kingship and virtue of Christ on earth, deity or prayer and sacrifice through death and suffering. They are Gentiles, confirming that Christ came to redeem our sins once and for all - all ways and for all people. The meeting happened in the most ordinary of places, a stable. The witnesses were men of the fields – humble and poor. Even the animals in the stable were beasts of burden. All mirrored in the simple traditions of welcoming strangers at New Year.

Yet what happened at that first Feast of the Epiphany, fixed in our calendar as 6<sup>th</sup> January, celebrates the visit of the Magi as the revelation of the Incarnation of the infant Christ and the realization that Christ is the son of God. It brought the hope and promise of an eternal faith, a future full of the light of Christ in our world and an assurance that whoever we are or wherever we start from He came for our sake.

So, if our New Year Resolutions – made once and broken often – are to be worth the making, maybe we should resolve to follow His teachings in our daily actions not just for Christmas!
