
We have had an incredible start to the new school year! We have already been out and about in the community.




During 2019-20 Bilsthorpe Parish Council will be working on the creation of an updated Community Plan for Bilsthorpe to help showcase, shape and improve our beautiful village. Over the coming months, the Parish Council will be actively seeking the views of all residents to help us in developing this new Community Plan.

The Parish Council would like to remind residents that both Crompton Road and Maid Marian Play Areas, including the green play spaces, have Public Space Protection Orders in place which mean that dogs are not permitted in these areas. There is an exception for Assistance Dogs of course!

These areas are specifically for play and we need to keep their users as safe as possible. We ask that if you see antisocial behaviour of any kind, including the exercising of dogs or the use of motorbikes or off-road vehicles, in these play spaces, please report it to the Police on 101. The Crompton area is covered by CCTV which will support any reports made.

Recently there has been a dramatic increase in the amount of people using offroad vehicles in the village, most notably on Forest Link and the surrounding fields and trails. If you see anyone using an off-road vehicle, such as a quad bike

#### Bilsthorpe Community Green Spaces Group.

On 1st October the grounds team from Newark and Sherwood District Council will be coming to start preparing the ground at the bottom of Kirklington Road in preparation for us to start sowing seeds and planting bulbs. They will be surface clearing weeds and brambles and stacking them at the rear of the site so that no insects/wildlife habitat is lost.

The seeds we have chosen are native wildflower seeds from **Pictorial Meadows** and **Meadow Mania** as they have

seeds that work really well in the shaded setting of the site and are suitable for autumn sowing, they also provide a fantastic display of colours.

As well as sowing seeds we are planning to plant native bluebell and snowdrop bulbs amongst the trees as these will make a stunning display year on year.

The Gardening Club has kindly offered to provide some native bluebell bulbs for the site which is wonderful and is much appreciated.



If anyone has any native bluebell or snowdrop bulbs they could donate as well that would be really appreciated as we are hoping to make a big splash for the spring.
