

It is with great sadness that we inform you John Maunder passed away on Saturday 19th October in Maidstone Hospital. He had been suffering from cancer for a number of years but it had been in remission. However during the past few months the cancer returned and though he was upbeat about conquering it again, it was not to be.



John moved to Grafty Green in 1987, but most of the village did not see much of him then as he was frequently away working for Sainsbury's as an Architect and Project Manager.

After he retired in the mid 1990's he became a familiar face in the village, helping in such activities as the Youth Club and with the celebrations for the Millennium. He became a member of the Village Hall committee and helped organise village entertainments. John helped many villagers with any planning applications as he was very knowledgeable and understanding of

the latest building regulations. After retirement he started going to the Kings Head pub, where most of us initially met him.

He enjoyed going on holiday to exotic far flung places with his family. After a trip to New Zealand, he became inseparable from his New Zealand fleece! He also joined the Thorne family on many holidays.

John contributed to this magazine (starting in October 2007) with his monthly insight to the Night Sky. He was a keen viewer of the heavens and was regularly out in the garden with his telescope viewing some distant planet or star.

John was a lovely gentleman with a dry sense of humour and we will all miss him.

His funeral will be at Charing Crematorium on Monday 4th November at 11.20.

Creating Space for Protected Wildlife

Volunteers donned waders on Saturday, October 5th at Chilston Ponds near Lenham and took the plunge into the historic ice pond. The aim of the day was to remove some of the vegetation in the pond to prevent it from becoming completely covered by reed mace and other weeds. This is good news for the protected Great Crested Newts that are found in the pond as they need open water to perform their courtship ritual and is key to the survival of the species.

Some of the willow trees on the island in the middle of the pond were also cut down to create a more diverse habitat and also to provide a clear view of the historic ice house from the entrance of the park.

Mike Phillips of the Mid Kent Downs Countryside Partnership said, "It's really encouraging to see people who care so much about the places where they live. This sort of positive action taken by the Heaths Countryside Corridor is inspirational and shows what can be done when a community works together."

The site is managed by local charity, Heaths Countryside Corridor, and formed part of the Heritage Lottery Funded Wandering and Wondering project. Grafty Geeks - Windows 8 – Customising the Start Screen

Moving Tiles

To move a tile simply click and hold the left mouse button and drag the tile to the desired location, then release. The other tiles will automatically re-arrange themselves.



Resizing Tiles

1. First right-click on the required tile to bring up the context menu in the lower part of the Start Screen. The tile will now have a border with small tick in the upper right to indicate it has been selected.
2. There are only two sizes of tile, so if you want to make one smaller, then click the "smaller" icon in the menu, if you want to increase the size, then click the "larger" icon.



Note: some tiles cannot be resized, if the icon is not available when you right click then that tile cannot be resized.

Removing Tiles

Just like the original Windows Start menu the tiles are shortcuts, so they can be removed or unpinned easily

1. First right click the required tile to display the context menu
2. Then locate and click the "Unpin from Start" option which will remove the tile from Start.





Grafty Gourmet

I had some left over Feta cheese at home and thought I would try it with chicken. It worked wonderfully. This is yet another very simple recipe, with a slight Greek influence. Its great served with rice, pasta or just a simple cucumber and tomato salad.

Chicken Stuffed with Feta Cheese & Bacon - Serves 2

8 tablespoons olive oil	4 skinless, boneless chicken breasts
2 teaspoons lemon juice	4 slices feta cheese
4 cloves crushed garlic	4 slices bacon, fried and drained (or grilled)
1 tablespoon dried oregano	
salt and pepper to taste	

1. Preheat oven 175 degrees C.
2. In a small bowl combine the oil, lemon juice, garlic, oregano, salt and pepper. Mix together.
3. Cut a slit in each chicken breast, place chicken in a baking dish and pour oil mixture over chicken.
4. Stuff each chicken breast with 1 slice feta cheese and 1 slice bacon. Secure open sides with toothpicks.
5. Bake uncovered at 175 degrees C for 30 to 35 minutes.

Water, water....everywhere?

It's the rainy season again, but next time you curse the wet stuff give a thank you instead for the technology that brings that rainfall into our houses as clean water. How different would our lives be without an abundance of water?

In Zambia it is not uncommon for families, young children and adults alike, to walk four kilometres every day over steep, rough terrain, just to get fresh water to drink and cook with. Farms often fail to support the families who run them because of a lack of fresh water. Children miss out on getting an education because they are too busy fetching and carrying heavy containers of water. Disease is rife because water is unsanitary.

The four Churches in the Len Valley benefice: Lenham, Harrietsham, Boughton Malherbe and Ulcombe, would like to work with our village communities to help four villages in rural Zambia experience the fresh water that we take for granted.

What we would like to do, with your help, is join the Tearfund initiative to build five boreholes in four communities in the Choma and Kalomo districts of southern Zambia. This would be sufficient to provide freshwater for 1800 people, improving health, improving farming yields, improving quality of life.

Look out for activities over the coming year, for the benefit of our community and at the same time for the benefit of rural Zambians. Lets have some fun together, be it in the rain or the sunshine, and get a bit closer to water, water everywhere.

"God, this isn't fair."

A disaster occurs in a remote part of the world. There's an appeal. Cheques are sent, prayers are said, relief workers go to the scene.

Several of my friends work for aid and mission organisations and I receive regular letters from them. Recently I was moved by the honesty of a letter from Ann (not her real name) who works in the Philippines where, in addition to war, natural disasters are a common occurrence.

It's hard for us in this country to imagine how aid workers feel but this letter paints a picture of their emotional struggles. Ann and her husband have not abandoned their commitment to the Philippines and are continuing their faithful development and relief work there.

Part of Ann's letter follows.

"I have been a missionary nurse for almost 30 years now. Hardships, suffering, heartbreak, calamities, sickness and death – I have seen them all. This wasn't just reading from newspapers of people I do not know but close up and personal.

I have taken care of and buried a patient named Moses, whose mother didn't even have the money to get him a decent casket. I have visited a woman in a dark, dirty and smelly prison, and she was not even a criminal but mentally ill.

My husband and I have travelled during red alert season to bring food to war evacuees. We have gone through bumpy, rocky or muddy roads up and down the mountains, taken small boats sailing through angry waves, walked across hanging bridges to conduct medical missions to people who have not seen a doctor or nurse in their lifetime.

I can go on with a litany of tragedies I have personally encountered in my life and somehow I have made it through with faith intact and a sense of fulfilment knowing the Lord allowed me, weak and frail as I am, to alleviate people's suffering and bring them hope.

However, the tragedy of typhoon Pablo has created in me a strong feeling of helplessness and utter hopelessness. Miles and miles of houses destroyed (looking more like a bomb has exploded and wiped out whole villages), banana plants on the ground, coconut trees uprooted, power lines all twisted and people staring blankly into space.

Standing on top of huge boulders of rocks where once families lived and loved, laughed and played, my heart was almost at the verge of being torn apart by sadness, my head starting to ache and my shoulders felt too heavy as if I was carrying all the burdens of this tragedy!

*I was tempted to say, "God, this isn't fair." I cried out to the Lord in the following days and searched the Scriptures. Many verses came to mind and I concluded that it is in times like this that we need to **run to God** and not away from him.*

"Do not be quick with your mouth, do not be hasty in your heart to utter anything before God. God is in heaven and you are on earth....." (Ecclesiastes 5:2)

"He is before all things and in him all things hold together." (Colossians 1:17)

In my heart I know that God has been and will always be fair.
