1	Public Participation				
	 M Cobb – The trees planted for the diamond jubilee have done well but a couple have now died. Are the Parish Council responsible for replacing them? The Chair confirmed the Parish Council was looking into the costs of replacing the trees and this would be done later in the year. R Woodfin – Notices have gone missing from the notice boards. Could we consider having half of the board for 'official' notices? It was agreed that the notice board in Ashorne would be made half official notices (Parish Council, church etc) and half public on a trial basis. M Bates – The recently moved trees are doing well and will be staked. The Chair thanked Mr Woodfin for watering the trees since their relocation. Mr Bates would like to allow Herd and Grow visitors to camp at the site. While the Parish Council have no objection to that in principle there was concern over potential difficulties surrounding the use of allotment land for other purposes. Cllr Parry agreed to make some enquiries with the planning department. Report from the church – Meetings will be held in July to get more information about the financial situation in advance of the interregnum starting in August. More space may have been identified in the churchyard but needs to be confirmed as appropriate by an archaeologist etc and help may be needed to fund this. The state of the road through Newbold Pacey is a concern. The Chair reported that the area had been marked up so we anticipate work will commence soon. Cllr Parry will chase this up. Report from the Village Hut – Regular meetings are being held with 8 members of the committee currently. The group would like to than the Parish Council for its support. Water at the Square – despite the hot weather, water is still sitting across the road. A blocked ditch is likely to be the cause. This will be a safety issue when temperatures drop.

Hi-5 Holiday Activities for Children

Hi-5 is the holiday activity programme delivered by Stratford-on-Avon District Council during the Easter and Summer holidays. The programme offers a wide range of activities including sports, art, drama and games for children aged 5-11. For 2018, Hi-5 will be offering a standard day and an extended day (at some of our activity camps):

Standard Day: 09:00 - 15:00, costing £12 a day or £50 a week **Extended Day:** 09:00 - 17:00, costing £16 a day or £70 a week

Hi-5 day camps take place during the school holidays and are delivered by trained Activity Leaders. Leaders will supervise children throughout the day until they are collected by a nominated person. Each day children will be offered a range of activities to ensure that all children can find something they will enjoy including Arts & Crafts, Outdoor Sports and Fun Games.

Affordable Housing

Stratford-on-Avon District Council is delighted to report the successful completion of a record-breaking number of new affordable homes last year.

Every year, the Council reviews the number and type of homes built in the district. During the course of last year (the financial year ending on 31 March 2018), a total of 377 new affordable homes were built which is the highest-ever recorded annual total. Nearly all the homes were built by the District Council's

partner housing associations, and almost three-quarters of the homes were for rent.

Jeremy Wright QC MP Surgery

Jeremy Wright will be holding a surgery in Wellesbourne on Saturday 8th September – venue to be confirmed – which will provide local residents of neighbouring parishes to talk to him about issues of particular importance to them.

Planning Matters

Steve Bromley has sent me the proposed plans for the dwelling in Ashorne on the former village garden site. However, I shall not be responding until the application has been submitted and validated.

Cllr Parry also reported that the process had begun to implement a compulsory purchase order on the Wellesbourne Airfield site which should protect the airfield function. There were still issues to be clarified around the impact on the current tenants.

Community Grant

a) Cricket Ground bridge works

- c) Defib training

The training session was cancelled due to low numbers. The Parish Council will consider rescheduling if greater levels of interest are shown in the future. There is debate about whether the code to access the defib should be publicly available or whether people should call 999 and take direction from the operator. The Clerk will make enquiries to confirm.

d) Churchyard capacity

As discussed under Public Participation, a solution may now have been found.

e) Councillor Recruitment

As discussed at the AGM, the Parish Council now has two vacancies with further vacancies anticipated in the new year so expressions of interest are encouraged from residents.

f) Website
