Biography of John Newman Davies



In traditional village terms I would be considered an interloper as I was born in Yorkshire. At aged 8 my father's work brought the family down to Kent where I have lived ever since. I attended schools in Rainham and have studied a BA in Banking, Insurance & Risk Management at Sheffield Hallam University, and a Post Graduate Management Diploma at University of London.
