2 members of Sustrans came to outline the proposals for a cycle route along the Trent Valley Way from the Fledborough Viaduct to Collingham. This will be a permissive route.

The opportunity of discussing the route of NCN64 was taken. The route of NCN64, along with all Sustrans routes, was chosen to enable an unaccompanied 12 year old to cycle safely. The route is unlikely to be changed, but it may be possible to provide signing to the facilities on the High Street as part of the current proposals.

PCSO Katie Hyde gave a breakdown of the current crimes reported this month. Children have been breaking into the old school on Woodhill Road. CCTV has now been installed and they have been caught on camera and the police are now trying to identify them.

Stealing tools from vans is the major crime in the Parish at the moment – property marking is available if anyone would like to contact Katie.

2 incidents on Breamer Road/Snowdon Road offering to buy old jewellery – the concern is that this might be a precursor to distraction break-ins.

The police will have a tent at the Mayfair which will be stocked with signs and notices.
