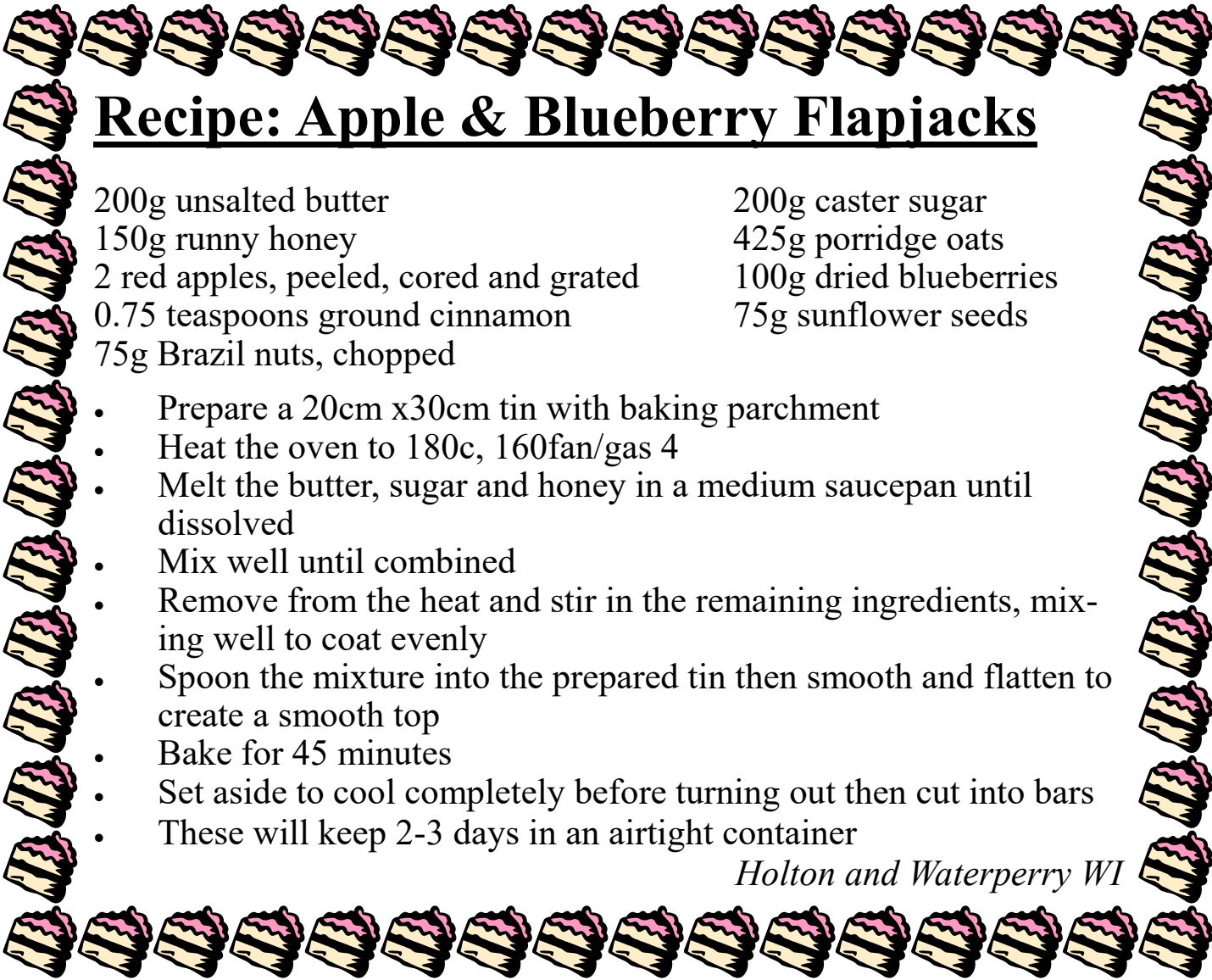

Recipe: Apple & Blueberry Flapjacks

200g unsalted butter

150g runny honey

2 red apples, peeled, cored and grated

0.75 teaspoons ground cinnamon

75g Brazil nuts, chopped

200g caster sugar

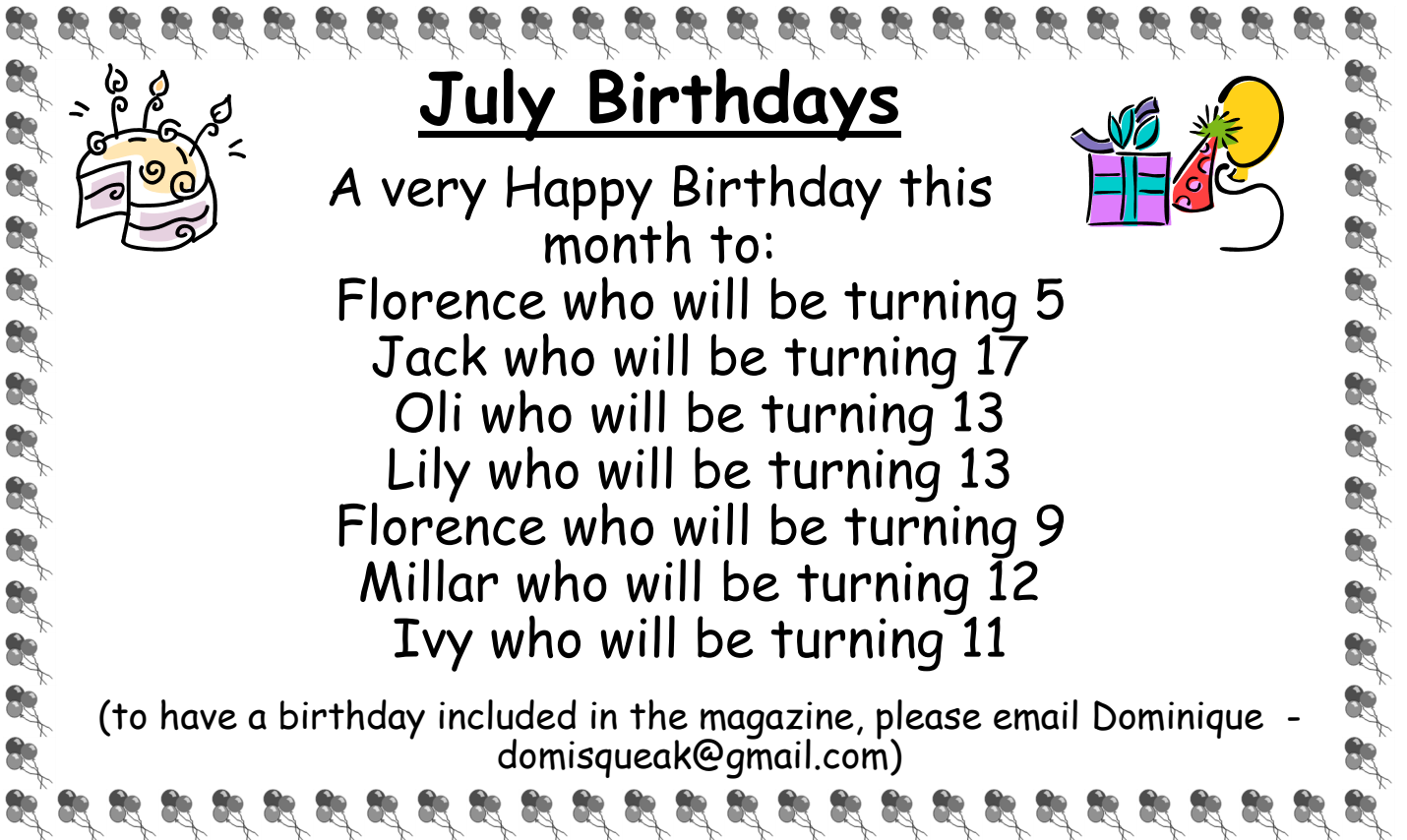
425g porridge oats

100g dried blueberries

75g sunflower seeds

- Prepare a 20cm x30cm tin with baking parchment
- Heat the oven to 180c, 160fan/gas 4
- Melt the butter, sugar and honey in a medium saucepan until dissolved
- Mix well until combined
- Remove from the heat and stir in the remaining ingredients, mixing well to coat evenly
- Spoon the mixture into the prepared tin then smooth and flatten to create a smooth top
- Bake for 45 minutes
- Set aside to cool completely before turning out then cut into bars
- These will keep 2-3 days in an airtight container

Letter from the Vicarage

Hello,

July is with us and the year has turned. However the earth and sea take their time to catch up so in our hemisphere history records that normally the hottest days are still to come. So it's holiday time for families, and mums and dads of school children across the country are already counting the days until September rolls around again! Just joking – all parents adore having their children home 24/7. Well it's what they tell the little darlings anyway.

As is the case with every month there are the usual weird and wonderful celebrations. The 1st Saturday is 'International Free Hugs Day'. And here I was charging for mine. On the 7th we are encouraged to participate in 'World Chocolate Day'. Surely every day is cho.... Oh, or is that just me? Close to my heart is the 12th which in Kiribati is lauded as 'Elderly Men Day'. It's about time someone recognised us. I think a coach party for a combined moan about... well everything, should be organised for the day. Incidentally, I am told that when elderly men get together to talk about their health this is known as an 'organ recital'.

The 3rd Sunday of the month is 'National Ice Cream Day', presumably patron saint Mr Whippy. So for July; enjoy the freedom of the summer outdoors, enjoy the freedom of our heritage and explore the freedom God.

Waterperry News

Traffic Survey

At the annual meeting last month one of the ongoing concerns was about the speed and volume of traffic through the village: can we find ways to slow vehicles and make the road safer for our children and visiting walkers? The parish council feels we have to properly understand the scale of the problems if we are to find sustainable ways to manage them. Our first step in this is that we have commissioned Highways to run traffic surveys for us. By the time of reading this magazine you may have noticed tube surveys in a couple of locations along the village, which record vehicle speed, class and flow over 7 days. We should have the results from these by early July and hope these might help us to direct our efforts towards the right sort of traffic management.

Further to this, we also have a site meeting planned with a couple of representatives from OCC's strategic planning departments for them to visit and understand the character of the village road, with a view to them advising us on what might be suitable steps to take. We'll update on this in future meetings and magazines.

Hedgehogs

One or two of us have been lucky enough to have hedgehogs back in our gardens this spring and early summer. It's several years since we've had prickly residents and it's been great this year to be able to watch them on our garden wildlife camera. Busy little creatures! Caroline spotted one foolhardy little chap scurrying across the road down near Green Ground – as they say, the grass is always greener on the other side! I've put small Hedgehog Aware signs on the post near our garden and the PC is looking at purchasing a couple of bigger signs. But we appeal – please drive slowly, especially in the evenings and at night – with eyes on the road ahead to avoid squishing our endangered visitors.

And in other news: Anything Waterstock can do.....!

Yes, hot on the heels of the TV debuts of Henry and Sara Manisty and their various garden residents, Waterperry has our own television star! I'm guessing that most of us heard via the social media hotline that a Farmers' Choir was taking the Britain's Got Talent heats by storm (I partly watched it this year for the first time ever – there was a lot of channel hopping involved though!) but did everyone spot our very own Grace Blackwell in the choir? It's maybe a bit cheeky to claim Grace as our own, as she's still a Bucks girl through and through, but I think she's lived in the village long enough now that she is firmly a Waterperry villager.

The choir's journey began just over a year ago when a Facebook call went out for "strong singers who are farmers" for a project with Jeremy Clarkson's Hawkstone brand. With Grace's musicality and her family background and work in farming, she was an obvious candidate – and she and husband Michael were early visitors when Jeremy's pub opened, so she answered the call (along with hundreds of others). And so it was that a group of farmers and farming professionals gathered for a one-day recording session at The Farmer's Dog pub to record a series of sung advertisements for the beer. If you're a fan of Clarkson's Farm, you'll be unsurprised to know that the songs have a colourful turn of phrase, but they're beautifully sung and all available to watch on You Tube. Good for a giggle! From that small beginning new friendships were forged and the idea of forming a proper choir took root and germinated (to keep the agricultural theme going!). Representing every corner of agriculture—including dairy, arable, and livestock farmers, as well as an entomologist and a farm secretary - the choir members managed to take time away from their busy lives all over the UK, to rehearse, sometimes via video links from the

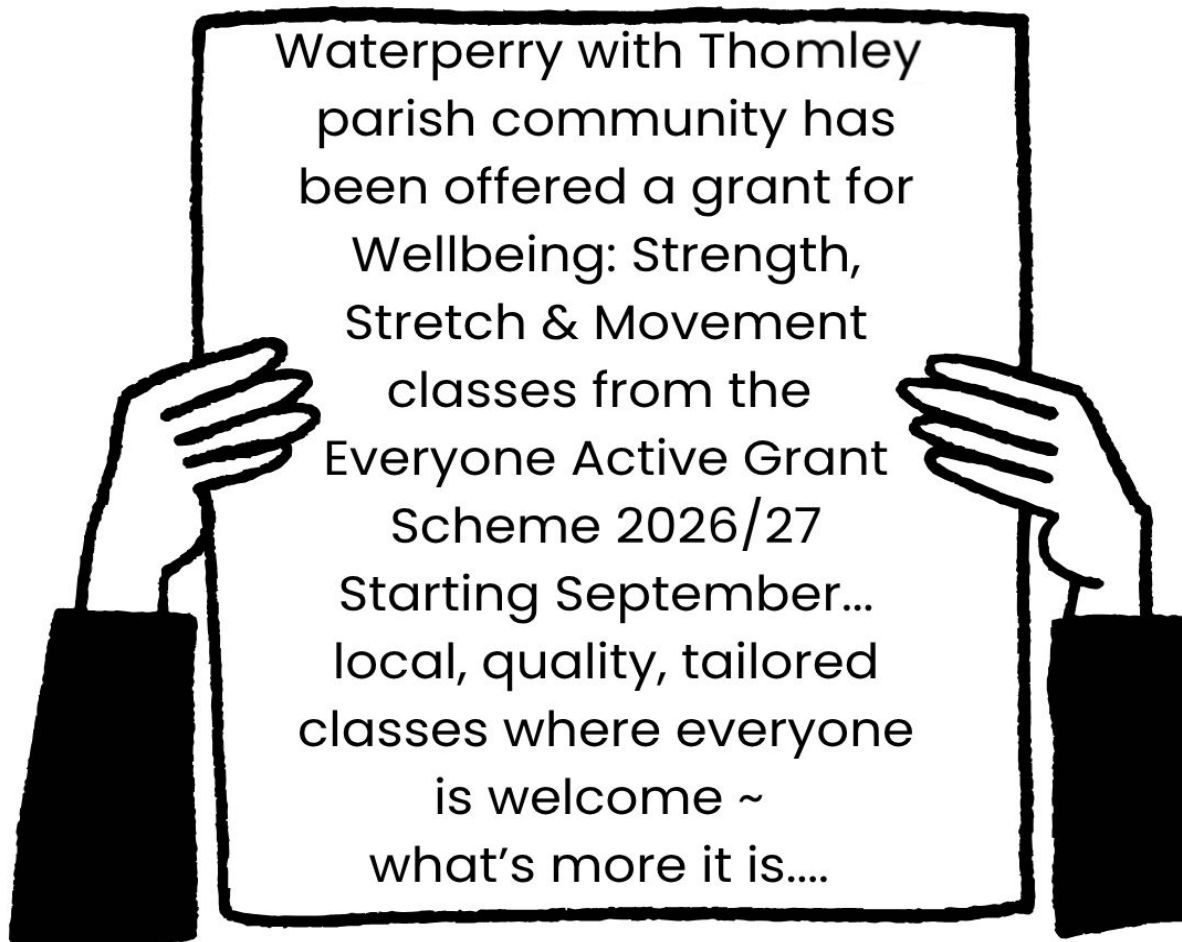
cabs of tractors, in the middle of fields, or the milking shed and just a year on from that first casting call, they pulled off a mighty victory by winning the BGT Final with a song written especially for them. They became the first choir ever to win the contest and word is that they took nearly 29% of the final vote – double the nearest runners up vote.

The idea for the choir grew out of all those people meeting and sharing their personal stories about the trials of a farming life, talking about friends they'd lost, often to mental health issues arising from the sometimes lonely lifestyle and the stresses of making ends meet. They have donated a significant portion of their prize money to various agricultural mental health charities and since their win, Grace and the choir have sung at agricultural events to raise awareness of an important cause.

They will be busy rehearsing again later this year to sing for the King at the Royal Variety Performance in November. I'm sure we all wish them well.....and that sounds like another date in front of the TV! Congratulations Grace!

Bus Service from Waterperry Gardens to Thornhill Park & Ride

Waterperry Gardens is delighted to announce that they have arranged for a bus service (the WP1) between Thornhill Park and Ride and Waterperry Gardens on the weekends and Bank Holidays.

It started on Saturday 13th June and will continue until the end of August, and will stop along the route in Wheatley.

This is a trial, as it is expensive, and if it is successful it may continue it in the years ahead.

Hopefully it will be useful for residents in the village, visitors to Waterperry Gardens, visitors to arts events and even philosophy students travelling to Waterperry House.

It is a small 29 seater bus and the idea is that it helps reduce traffic and helps with accessibility for those who prefer to use public transport or do not have access to a car.

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Waterstock News

After an extraordinary period of weather in late May where the temperature dropped from 30 to 13 degrees within a couple of days, we had several days of regular and much needed rain. Now the seasons are settling down and to give reassurance the cuckoo was heard at both ends of the village in May and June. We welcome news from Henry on the activities of Doris, the heroine of the Secret Garden episode and also of the kingfishers...

“Doris, the ‘Secret Garden’ supermum, who coaxed her ducklings into leaping unhurt from their tree nest, and then defended them from an otter attack, has this year taken up residence in a large planter on the river wall between the Mill and wooden weir, where she is sitting on no less than 12 eggs. While she is on the nest her every move is being filmed, but who knows where she will take her ducklings when they hatch? Knowing Doris, she might make them leap 10 feet directly into the river. Or perhaps she will lead them over the wooden weir into the meadow and from there to the river.

Meanwhile downstream, a pair of kingfishers are nesting again exactly where they nested in ‘Secret Garden’. However, the recent rains have raised river levels, and I have had to remove the wildlife cameras mounted on posts in the river covering the activity”.

Not such welcome wildlife activities have been occurring in the church as a jackdaw found its way into the building, made a nest and produced a clutch of chicks which were fed by both parents. We hope that Robin Pykett has successfully blocked up the gap between wall and roof now that the fledgelings have flown off.

In the coming month we have a wedding: Sarah Godowski’s son Robbie is marrying Jess at St Leonard’s on July 18, with the reception in their field afterwards. Sara says- “There’s still a lot to do including growing the flowers! Carriages are at midnight so hoping not to disturb anyone too much.”
