In the past Collingham has been criticised for untidy pavements, leaf debris on pavements and weeds growing in front of walls, so we would ask that we all cast a critical eye over our own bit of the village and have a goody tidy up. The Parish Council will be asking Newark and Sherwood District Council to send in the street cleaning squad to sweep up the roads; they no longer clean pavements, that is the responsibility of householders.

Other areas to look at are road signs of all sorts, including street names. It is also the ideal time to report signs in a state of disrepair, faded letters and loose or damaged fixings. The Parish Council will pass on this information to the District Council for repair or replacement. This also serves the practical purpose of making life easier for our all our residents, for deliveries and most important of all for the emergency services.

We are not judged on being the prettiest village but on all our residents, of all ages, working together for the community, something which Collingham is especially good at. It's not just to win prizes or just for a couple of months of the year, but to improve the standards for everyone throughout the year.

There will be changes in the roles at the Parish Council after our Annual meeting on May 12, I am resigning as Parish Chair, but will still be on the Parish Council. Being Chair is a transitory role, what goes on is community life.
