Children's Room Beer Garden

Grafty Gourmet

This is a mouth watering curry from north of India. Serve with rice or crusty bread. Although it has a few ingredients, the cooking process, as with all my recipes, is very straight forward.

Kashmiri Lamb

4 dried red chillies
3 fresh green chillies
1 teaspoon cumin seeds
1 teaspoon Kashmiri garam masala
1 inch piece of root ginger, peeled and
grated
5 cloves garlic, crushed
4 tablespoons desiccated coconut
3 tomatoes, chopped
6 tablespoons oil
2 large onions, sliced thinly
1kg (2 lb) lamb, washed, pat dry and cut
into 1 1/2" pieces
1/2 pint plain yoghurt
1/2 teaspoon turmeric
1/2 teaspoon saffron
20 blanched almonds
A handful chopped coriander
salt to taste

1. Grind the red chillies, green chillies, cumin seeds, garam masala, ginger, garlic, grated coconut and tomatoes together into a smooth paste.

2. Heat the oil in a pan and fry the onions until golden.

3. Add the spice paste and fry it until the oil separates from the mixture. Now add the lamb pieces and the salt and cook until it is almost done. Stirring frequently. Add the yoghurt, turmeric, saffron and the blanched almonds and mix well.

4. Cook over low heat until the meat is tender and the gravy is thick. Garnish with chopped coriander leaves and serve.

Clearing Browser History

Clearing browser history is common advice given when people ask how to speed up their PCs. The reality is that clearing the cache does not speed up the computer at all. The opposite may be true, because cache files mean that commonly used information does not have to be downloaded or generated repeatedly.

Cache is a hardware or software component that stores data so future requests for that data can be served faster; the data stored in a cache might be the result of an earlier computation, or the duplicate of data stored elsewhere. A cache hit occurs when the requested data can be found in a cache, while a cache miss occurs when it cannot. Cache hits are served by reading data from the cache, which is faster than recomputing a result or reading from a slower data store; thus, the more requests can be served from the cache, the faster the system performs.

What matters when it comes to browsing speed is the time lapse between initiating a process and receiving the results. Most people have noticed that the first time they visit a site it takes longer to open than subsequent visits, and that is thanks to the cached information saved in the browser history. If the history is deleted, the computer must do all that initializing again the next time.

There are, however, times when the browser's history requires deletion. Examples of this include when a computer doesn't have enough drive space and there are too many temporary files, when cache corruption is present, and when the user is concerned about privacy issues.

To clear your browser history:

- Open your browser
- Locate the Setting options (use search or help)
- Find Clear browsing history/data
- Select what you would like to clear

Notice of Forthcoming Planning Appeals

At a meeting of the Boughton Malherbe Parish Council Planning Committee on the 1st February 2018, attended by 43 Parish residents, the Council undertook to inform residents of forthcoming appeal hearings. These are as follows:

The Meadows

An Appeal Hearing concerning the four Appeals submitted under the common reference U2235, plus a total of 35 linked cases at the end of June last year against the refusal by Maidstone Borough Council to grant permission for Gypsy and Traveller sites on plots 1-5 and 6-10 at The Meadows, Lenham Road TN27 9LG has been lodged, and is due to be heard on the **15th May 2018** as a Public Inquiry, starting at 10.00 AM at Maidstone Town Hall.

Acers Place

An Appeal Ref APP/U2235/C/17/3189217 against an enforcement notice regarding unauthorised change of use of land to a gypsy/traveller site at Acers Place, Lenham Road Headcorn for two caravans, hard standing and gates which is contrary to both national guidance and the local development policies has been lodged, and is due to be heard on the 17th April, starting at 10.00 AM at the Hazlitt Theatre, 36 Earl ST, Maidstone, ME14 1PP.

The public are free to attend these hearings in the public gallery.

If you attend and ask to speak to give your views, the Inspector may allow you to do so at his discretion. Or, you may wish to inform your elected Maidstone Borough Councillor of your views, preferably by Email.

Ulcombe History Society 2018 Visit to Amiens

The four singers are from St Petersburg. Their leader is Andrei Sysoev, the choirmaster of St Peter's Cathedral in Petersburg. He is well known for his work with choir music of the Renaissance but also is involved in composing, teaching, and music for the cinema.

The singers are all well known in Russia. **Zlata Gogol**, contralto, has a wide repertoire singing music by Russian and European composers, and has taken the leading role in many operas such as Eugene Onegin and Euridice.

Aleksei Goloviznin, base, started singing at the age of five. He has worked in various choirs and vocal groups in St Petersburg, and toured the USA, Japan, France, Italy, Germany, Austria, Holland, Belgium, Sweden Norway, , Finland, and Poland. He has made many recordings and is currently very involved with jazz music.

Marina Busse, soprano, was a solo singer from 2005 to 2010 in the State Conservatoire of St. Petersburg. She has won various international awards and for the last two years has been a laureate of Chopin's International Competition and Rachmaninov's International Competition in St. Petersburg.

Eugenii Tsvetkov, tenor, is a soloist of St Petersburg Chamber Choir. He has been on tour with several famous male voice choirs. He specialises in church music. He is also interested in jazz music and plays the jazz guitar.

Wonderful religious experiences are very special but, fortunately for those of us who are more familiar with the M25 than the road to Damascus, what sustains us day in and day out is the word of God where we can learn and enjoy so much:

So it may be a bit late for New Year's resolutions or Lenten promises but, if you don't already dip into your Bible regularly, then why not start today? You could also join a homegroup and enjoy discussion, friendship and tea, while unravelling the mysteries and meanings of harder passages.
