Glebe Farm

Councillor J Camilleri and Councillor Higgins have spoken to Councillor McDonald again with regards to the delay and he approached TVBC Planning for an update.

The S106 final draft has been issued by the Test Valley Borough Council solicitors. This is now in the hands of the developer. Until the Parish Council have sight, they are unable to make any progress on Rectory Hill pathway.

River Group

A big Thank You is due to the 25 people who attended the river clearance on October 11. There is little water in the river at present but there was a staggering amount of weed. Clive has collected the weed and will invoice in due course.

Footpaths

A meeting has taken place between Cllr Lee and the Wilts Rights of Way Officer. All concerns about paths (as well has potholes, blocked gullies etc) that require reporting should be posted to MyWilts. Cllr Lee is attending a training session on Wednesday morning to discuss footpath asset registration. Wiltshire Council has published documents e.g. Crop flyer & environmental Services – Rights of Way and Countryside Policies



Crimes and incidents

Report for past 30 days:

At 2am on 1st OCTOBER on ASHMORE LANE a hole was cut through commercial fencing to gain entry to a yard but nothing was stolen from within. There were two intruders, both wearing balaclavas and goggles. Police have completed enquiries and the suspects remain unknown.
