From the Vicar

Dear Friends

I'd like to begin by thanking everyone who worked so hard to organise and run the annual Cuddesdon Fete, including Ripon College Cuddesdon for hosting the fete. We had a lovely day, the sun shone, the band played and we raised important funds for All Saints Church. Thank you to all who contributed, in whatever way.

I am writing this on the feast of Pentecost – formerly known as Whit Sunday – when the Church celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit.

All Saints' Church held our Annual Parochial Church Meeting last Sunday (19th May). After 11 years of faithful service to All Saints Church, and its congregation, Robert Wilson had decided the time was right to step down as Churchwarden. We marked the occasion with prosecco and cake, at the end of our meeting, and a small presentation from the church congregation. Robert's efficiency in managing a host of questions, building projects and events in All Saints' will be sorely missed, but he has assured those of us trying to fill the gap of his continuing support. I would like to record my immense gratitude to Robert, for all that he has done to support me, personally, in my ministry over the past 4.5 years. I would also like to thank Anne Stern for agreeing to continue as sole Churchwarden for a further year.

The role of Churchwarden is a demanding role - Robert managed building projects, the vacancy after Emma left, bell repairs, and a variety of other tasks. Although I have every confidence in Anne and her abilities, I do think that the Churchwarden role is best when the challenges, responsibilities and joys can be shared. So if you have relevant gifts and skills, and an interest in the future of All Saints' Church, then I encourage you to speak to Anne or to myself.

This month, I'd like to share a poem with you which I wrote a few days before Pentecost / Whit Sunday, inspired by a piece of artwork depicting a white dove, representing the Holy Spirit, against a blue background. I hope that it will speak to you, and help you to reflect upon the Holy Spirit, and the way the Spirit acts in the world, throughout history and today.

SAVE THE BAT AND BALL



As I hope you know, the Bat and Ball is up for sale.

We explored what's happened and what might happen at a recent meeting in the village hall. If you would like a full report, please email

savethebatandball@outlook.com for a copy or put a note through my door at 12 The Green.

Looking forward, the Parish Council has to decide at its meeting on the 4th of June whether or not to trigger a four month pause of the sale. The pause would be to allow us to organise ourselves to raise the money to make an offer to buy the pub.

We do know that Admiral, the owners of the pub, are talking to a local pub owner/manager about a sale. But it is very unlikely that a deal will be finalised before the 4th of June. By the time you read this, we hope to have met them to establish their position.

The worst case scenario is the Parish Council agrees with Admiral not to trigger the pause – so that the sale can go ahead quickly – only to find that the deal collapses. Admiral can then use this as evidence that the pub is not financially viable and ask for change of use for housing. That's the outcome we don't want!

For this reason and because of the uncertainties, the recent meeting felt that it was pretty inevitable that we would need to trigger the moratorium so as to produce our own bid and to keep other options open.

There is a small group of people taking this forward at the moment – Peter Rutt, Philip Spinks and Nicola Swift as well as myself. Do let us know if you have relevant skills or experience.

**VACANCY FOR PARISH CLERK
CUDDESDON AND DENTON PARISH COUNCIL**

The Parish Council is seeking a highly motivated, enthusiastic person to take on the post of Clerk to the Council and Responsible Financial Officer.

The post is part time, averaging four hours per week, working mainly from home. The hours of work are flexible except for attendance at meetings.

The salary is within the NJC salary scale range SCP13 - SCP23 (£13.97 - £16.67 per hour). Actual salary is dependent on qualifications and experience.

The Clerk should be available to attend Council meetings which are normally held on the first Tuesday of each month at 7:30pm.

The successful applicant must be IT literate. Computer equipment will be supplied.

The Clerk stores Council equipment and files securely at their home address.

Duties will include acting as advisor to the council, minute taking, and managing the correspondence and filing. The Clerk is also responsible for maintenance of the village website.

The role of Responsible Financial Officer includes management of the Council's financial affairs, including the accounts, payments and receipts, and managing the financial records.

The Parish Council would prefer the successful applicant to take on the roles of both Parish Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer.

Training is available where appropriate.

The starting date will be agreed between the successful candidate and the Council.

Patients aged 75 or over (or will turn 75 by 30 June 2024) are being invited for a COVID booster vaccination. Also, appointments can be booked online at <https://www.nhs.uk/get-vaccination> or on the NHS App. You can find your nearest COVID-19 vaccination walk-in site at <https://www.nhs.uk/covid-walk-in>. 30 June 2024 is last date to get a booster vaccination .

The NHS launched the Pharmacy First Service (PFS) on 31st January (see NHS Pharmacy First Service (PFS) | NHSBSA) Appointments can be booked directly with participating pharmacies for the treatment of 7 common health conditions namely sinusitis, sore throat, earache, infected insect bite, impetigo, shingles, uncomplicated urinary tract infections in women. Pharmacists can offer advice to patients and supply NHS medicines where clinically appropriate. This will help reduce the pressure on Morland House Surgery. I spoke too soon about replacement of the goal frames on the recreation ground. The first one was fairly easy to replace but one of the posts of the second one was badly rusted into its socket. In trying to remove it, the post broke off because it was so badly rusted, so new sockets will need to be concreted into the ground. This work will be done as soon as possible. In the meantime only one goal will be available.

Chris Luke has been elected Chairman of the Parish Council for another year. Looking back at the records, this is his tenth year in the post, which is an admirably long time.

Admiral have put the Bat and Ball up for sale. It is my understanding this has happened because the person who took over running the pub had encountered some problems, particularly relating to the ventilation and extraction from the kitchen. The costs were very large and the landlord felt he could no longer continue to rent the pub.

Since the pub is an asset of community value, we were told as soon as Admiral decided to sell. Our community has to decide by 7th June whether we will put in an offer to buy the pub. If that goes ahead, then we have until the end of October to prepare an offer, and during that time Admiral are not allowed to accept offers from anyone else.

As Chris told you in last month's Newsletter, I have decided to step down as Parish Clerk. I will write more about this later, but for now I would urge you to consider becoming the Parish Clerk. If you care about your community and have some time to spare then it might be something you would enjoy doing. It is a paid role and the duties are not very hard. I will be around and am very happy to be of assistance during the transition to the new Clerk to make sure everything runs smoothly. Please think about it.

The calling of a General Election for 4th July took most people by surprise. I write this on the last day of this Parliament after which there will be no MPs until results are announced in early July. I announced in April 2023 that I would stand down as your MP at the next General Election. My decision was taken on the basis of my age and that I did not want to be an MP into my 70s. As such today is my last day as an MP and the day brings to a close the 16-year period during which I have had the honour of being the MP for the Henley Constituency.

In that time I have enjoyed meeting very many constituents in many different circumstances, some happy, some less so. I have visited all of the schools in the constituency – many several times, met with a wide range of businesses, talked with local councillors, police, NHS staff and leadership teams to name but a few. I have lobbied on behalf of constituents on various issues from disabled access at stations, support for home educators, and demands for cleaner water. It is impossible to mention everything as the work of an MP involves so many aspects of life.

Much of the work is behind the scenes, helping individuals and families to resolve personal issues – lobbying ministers or organisations on their behalf. Perhaps some of the more public achievements have been in contributing to the success of the Europa School in Culham and in working with others to establish the new Townlands Hospital in Henley. My work in Parliament to introduce Neighbourhood Planning, thus giving communities a real say in the future of their areas, has been widely taken up. I am pleased that so many villages and towns in this constituency have got such plans in place. I have also had the privilege of serving in Parliament as a Parliamentary Private Secretary to four Secretaries of state, as a Trade Envoy to Nigeria, and most recently as Leader of the UK Delegation to the Council of Europe.

Of course no one can do the work of an MP without the support of a team, and I have been blessed with a strong and loyal team supporting me over the years and I am deeply grateful to them all.

I am also grateful to our local magazine and newsletter editors who have given me space to share thoughts with constituents in these regular publications. Thank you too to those who have sent me copies so that I have been able to keep abreast of what is going on in the 113 settlements across the constituency.

At this General Election the name changes to the Henley and Thame Constituency, and the area covered reduces. Wherever the administrative boundaries place you I wish you all the very best. Whether we have agreed or not, it has been one of the greatest honours of my life to have served as your MP.






