Following Marsh Gibbon Parish Council's objection to this application, Chair had spoken with Paul Hill of W.G.Hill & Sons who had expressed his disappointment at the Council's objection.

VALE OF AYLESBURY LOCAL PLAN (VALP)/MARSH GIBBON NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

It was noted that the Vale of Aylesbury Local Plan is due to be approved by Buckinghamshire Council on September 13th (Cabinet) and 15th (Council).

"VALP will not replace the Neighbourhood Plans (made before the adoption of VALP), but will sit alongside them, with its policies applying ahead of similar policies in the Neighbourhood Plan." (page 64, para 274 of the Inspector's Report of August 19th).

So MGPC will need to consider how relevant policies in VALP will take precedence over similar MGNDP policies. If significant, it will be necessary to update MGNDP and consult the residents on those and any other changes that MGPC may propose.

10 REPORT FROM VILLAGE HALL

10.1 Car Park Repairs

A representative from the village hall committee was unable to attend the meeting but had sent the following note:

"Village hall car park update - we are awaiting the final design & survey from Flow Drainage (due this week). We can then send to the selected panel of contractors for them to send revised quotes, based on the design to ensure a fair tender process.

The Village hall committee will then be able to prepare a final report when we have all the information back. We can then arrange next steps with the Parish council to discuss in more detail." It also was noted that the CCTV had been installed.

11 PLAY EQUIPMENT, TEENAGE RECREATION AREA AND RECREATION GROUND

11.1 Maintenance

11.1.1 All Weather Pitch

Technical Surfaces continue with the maintenance.

11.1.2 Signage

Cllr ET reported that the 'Close Gate' sign had been removed.

Actions: Clerk to put up a new sign and check that all signage is 'current' and Cllrs to remove all the COVID signs as they visit the area.

11.1.3 RoSPA Inspection

It was noted that there were no high risk issues in the report.

11.2 Playground Upgrade

The playground sub-group continue to work towards getting the funding of £78K for the playground upgrade:

They have made applications to:

- FCC for £58K.
- S106 (Planning application07/01493/APP (Land Adjacent to Manor Farm Main Street, Poundon) for £19,248 and noted that this could go towards the FCC third party funding.
- Rothschild Trust £1000.
- Tesco Bags of Help amount to be determined.
- It was noted that if the funding is in place, work on the upgrade could start in March 2022.

11.3 Recreation Ground

11.3.1 Cllr RC reported that he still was waiting for the Hiring Agreement

11.3.2 It was agreed to get the hedge cut.

Action: Clerk to get a quote for the hedge cutting from Country Equestrian.

11.3.3 It was noted that clerk had requested Everflow to check the latest invoice as the charge seemed high compared to previous invoices. However, it was noted that the charge in June 2019 was similarly high.

12 BCC DEVOLUTION OF SERVICES

12.1 Hedges / paths

12.1.1 Acland Terrace Hedge: It was noted that part of the hedge had been cut.

Action: Clerk to ask RTM to cut the remaining hedge.

12.1.2 **Scotts Lane**: Following the complaint regarding nettles overhanging the path, further correspondence had been received from Thames Water.

CC Michael Rand agreed to confirm the exact procedure the Council should follow when writing to the resident to ask for the nettles to be cut back.

Action: Clerk to liaise with CC Rand and draft letter to resident.

12.1.3 **Hedgeside/ Village Hall-Moat Lane pathways**: The cutting back of brambles is on these pathways is on the contract with RTM.

Action: Clerk to ask RTM to carry out the work as soon as possible.

13 ROADS AND PATHWAYS

13.1 Potholes

None was reported.

13.2 HGV Weight Limit

The location of the "Unsuitable for HGV" signage had been agreed with Buckinghamshire Council and would be installed by Ringway Jacobs. Council have now paid for the signage but it hasn't been erected yet. Action: Clerk to chase Bucks Council.

Residents present were appalled at how dangerous it is for children walking to school along West Edge. It was suggested that "No Footway" signs are erected.

It was pointed out to the residents that the Parish Council could not get a weight limit installed as, according to the police, it is unenforceable.

13.3 Speed watch

No updates were available.

14 STREET LIGHTING

It was noted that the street lights in Tompkins Lane and Scotts Lane still had not been repaired. Action: Clerk to report again to E.on and suggest that if the repairs are not completed soon, the Parish Council will not pay the next maintenance payment.

15 CEMETERY MATTERS

15.1 General Maintenance

There were no general maintenance issues.

15.2 Burial, Interments, Advance booking requests and Memorial applications 15.2.1 Burials

There were no burials to report.

15.2.2 Advance reservation / Memorial requests

There were no requests for reservations or memorials.

15.3 Cemetery Road

Cllr PE reported that she had made arrangements to meet the contractor, Alan Hickford, to discuss the way forward with the road repairs, but he did not turn up for the meeting. Another meeting has been arranged. It was noted that some trees should probably be felled as their roots are above the ground.

16 ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS

16.1 Flooding

It was noted that Mud Pond is not draining properly. It also was noted that Bucks Council still has to carry out gulley cleaning, which it is hoped will help to stop the pond flooding.

C.Cllr Rand reported that he thought the Council was trying to do a whole area at the same time.

16.2 Ware Pond

It was agreed that work should be carried out to clean the pond and to contact E&S Burborough Ltd to carry out the work. It also was discussed as to whether S106 money could be used for painting/repairing or replacing the white railings.

Action: Chair to liaise with Peter Ferens and Clerk

17 STREET FURNITURE

Cllr ET will ask P Taylor to inspect the notice board near Forge Close to determine if it is worth repairing.

18 MARSH GIBBON SILVER BAND

Cllr TR reported that a recruitment Plan of Action to keep the Silver Band viable had been put in place with letters sent to the school and local newsletters.

19 EAST WEST RAIL (EWR)

No updates were available.

20 HS2

It was noted that the local Member of Parliament had spoken against continuing with HS2 in Parliament.

21 COMMUNITY BOARD

The next Community Board meeting is scheduled for 4 November. Cllr TR confirmed that he had accepted an invitation to attend the Freight Working sub-group meeting.

22 COMMUNITY PUB

Cllr RC confirmed that discussions are on-going and that a meeting with Ewelme Trustees has been scheduled for 21 September.

23 JUBILEE PLANTATION

Cllr RC and TR had inspected and Jubilee Plantation. Following a discussion as to the purpose of the plantation, Cllr RC agreed to speak to a school governor to enquire if the school would like to get involved with it.

24 FACEBOOK

There was nothing to report.

25 OXFORD TO CAMBRIDGE ARC

No updates were available but it was agreed that Councillors should continue to monitor it.

26 ANY OTHER BUSINESS

- 26.1 Chair thanked residents for coming to the meeting.
- 26.2 It was noted that the Parish Council is unable to do anything about the van which is blocking the line of site in Acland Terrance if it is taxed and insured.
- 26.3 It was noted that the manhole cover at the junction of Clements Lane and Church Street has not been repaired

It was noted that the manhole cover had not been replaced properly in Whales Lane. Action: Clerk to inform Bucks Council.

26.4 It was agreed that Clerk should write to the resident who had requested the Council's input into the Climate Coalition's Great Big Green Week and inform her that the Council regularly organises litter picks and has recently obtained funding for a 'wild life' project for the school.
