
Letter from the Chairman of the

Parish Council Finances

We have undertaken a thorough review of our financial situation and have concluded that we need to increase the amount of money we can collect from residents to be spent in Marden. This is called the Precept (collected by Maidstone Borough Council on our behalf as part of the Council Tax) in the next financial year from April 2016. We need to do this in order to ensure that the Parish Council stays on a sustainable financial footing and to maintain the existing level of service. This means that a Bank D tax payer will see an £8.35 per year increase, or 69p per month in the next financial year.

Parish Council Elections – Thursday 5th May 2016

The Parish Council is up for re-election on the 5th May, and if you are interested in becoming a Councillor and feel you have something to offer the village, please contact Alison for more information. The criteria includes that you are British, or a citizen of the Commonwealth or the European Union; over 18 years of age; are registered to vote in the area or if you have lived, worked or owned a property in Marden for at least 12 months before the election. If you would like to get involved with the work of the Parish Council, why not consider standing for election?

Planning Update

Many local residents have commented about the 'pineapples' atop the pillars at the entrance to the new Highwood Green development on the Goudhurst Road. We didn't like them either! And the upshot is that following amicable discussions with the developers they have been removed and the amended entrance will now be more in keeping with the area. As far as the development planned for the other side of Goudhurst Road opposite Highwood Green – The Parsonage – is concerned, the Parish continues to be consulted on the current amended plans and endeavours to recommend design features to complement the area. Keep an eye open on the Parish website and notice boards for any meetings relating to this and other planned developments in and around the village.



The Marden in Bloom group are entering the 2016 South & South East in Bloom competition and judging will take place in July.

We are currently fund-raising to kick-start our project and this year's plans are to install planters around the village with a red, white and blue theme in honour of HM's 90th birthday celebrations. We are also aiming to brighten up a few areas such as the Memorial Hall dependent upon monies raised. We will shortly be contacting all village groups and businesses for their thoughts on ways they can help or participate.

Calling all Marden Residents & Businesses – 'Best Floral Display'!

As part of the South & South East in Bloom campaign, Marden will be holding a 'Best Floral Display' competition. There will be two categories: 'Best Home' and 'Best Business' with a prize and plaque for each and judging will be during the first two weeks of July. This is a chance for all you 'green fingered' Mardenians to brighten up your neighbourhood and will also help to fund raise for bigger projects too. If you want to participate, the theme is red, white and blue.

The Marden in Bloom project is about village engagement and participation and a chance to be proud of the village you live in. Number 28 Bus Service

There has been much concern over the NuVenture's cancellation of the number 28 bus from Marden, particularly by parents whose children use the service to schools in Maidstone. With the intervention of our MP Helen Grant, County Councillor Paulina Stockell as well as the Parish Council, Kent County Council (KCC) have now thankfully reinstalled the service which is being operated by 1st Bus Stop.

Flooding in Pattenden Lane

Pattenden Lane still continues to flood as no improvements have been made regarding the recent flooding under the railway bridge. It is understood that residents have been informed that Kent County Council would not be taking any further action due to lack of funding. The Parish Clerk is continually logging this on the Kent Highways website and will follow up and lobby our County Councillor Paulina Stockell.

Marden pronounced 'Best Treed' Village in Kent

In last year's 'Kent Men of Trees' competition Marden was considered by the judges to be the best treed village — what an amazing accolade and certainly one we should be very proud of. As a result, we have received a voucher towards purchasing a new tree which will be placed along Rookery Path.

Proposed Parking Restrictions

The new parking restrictions in Marden High Street which Maidstone Borough Council are planning to implement have been delayed as several changes need to be made to the Order. You can view the changes on MBC's website (www.maidstone.gov.uk) or a copy is held in the Parish Office.

Speedwatch

A trial speed watch was held back in December and two volunteers met to set up the equipment. They observed very considerate drivers pulling in and allowing each other to pass at safe speeds. They spoke to several neighbours who were

delighted to see them in action and the offer of training for more volunteers was made. No speeding was recorded, which is a success – we do not want drivers exceeding the speed limit in Marden.

Our village Firemen have very kindly offered to help out and if you would like to become involved, after initial training, it would only take an hour or two of your time per session. Please contact Erika in the Parish Office - we need you!

Please note, because of the current National Speed Limit in Chainhurst, volunteers are unable to undertake Speed Watch in that area.

Chainhurst Speeding

Kent Highways, as authorised by our County Councillor Paulina Stockell, undertook a traffic survey in Chainhurst because of speeding concerns. However they have now raised issues regarding restrictions/speed limits in that area and the Parish Clerk has contacted Kent Highways to enquire what the next step is. The Parish Council will continue to monitor the situation.

Speeding in the Village

As previously advised, the Parish Council met last year with our County Councillor and Kent Highways over the issue of safely crossing roads in Marden. Councillors discussed how we could overcome this problem and the possibility of installing a pedestrian crossing. The Parish Clerk is chasing our County Councillor to see if there are any funds available to undertake a feasibility study which would then be put before Kent Highways for their recommendation. Watch this space!

UPDATE ON PARISH MATTERS:

- Fingerposts We are aware that some of the Parish fingerposts need attention and we are endeavouring to find someone who would be interested in refurbishing them. The 'Marden in Bloom' group are particularly keen on cleaning up the sign outside the Post Office (opposite Maidstone road junction) and if you know of anybody, please ask them to contact the Parish Office.
- Junction of Hunton Road and Green Lane − The Parish Council have made contact with Kent Highways regarding the lack of give-way signage at the junction of Hunton Road and Green Lane. Kent Highways have now responded to advise that because of reduced budgets and the fact there have been no recorded personal injury crashes at this location for the past three years, Kent Highways are unable to assist with our request for a new sign at this moment in time.
- O Public Car Park A new sign has been erected and the parking restrictions are already being enforced with 32 Penalty Charge Notices being issued. Please note that the car park is closed from 7.15am-8.15am Monday to Friday.
- O Litter Bins Maidstone Borough Council (MBC) have recently installed some new litter bins around the village and these bins can be used for depositing dog waste as well.
- Anti-Social Behaviour/CCTV Due to problems with the supplier, the CCTV camera which was to be placed close to the Public toilets to help deter any anti-social behaviour, has still not been installed. However, if you want to report any anti-social behaviour, please call 101 as soon as possible so PCSO Nicola Morris can provide sufficient evidence to Maidstone Community Safety Unit. Nicola has also been monitoring activity in various hot spots in the village in the evenings.

- The Kent Air Ambulance clothing bin This is due to be removed by beginning of February as it frequently overflowed and was not emptied regularly. This will now free up a couple of extra car parking places. You can put out your discarded fabrics/clothing with the green recycling bin.
- Cemetery We will shortly be planning the layout of the new sections in the cemetery, and if anybody would like to make a donation towards the planting of this area, please let Alison know.
- Napoleon Drive Play Area the Parish Council is currently finalising the transfer of this play area from Taylor Wimpey and hopefully, at some point, we will be able to replace the current play equipment for the under 5's dependent on Developer Contribution monies.

Marden at Christmas



Another successful 'Marden at Christmas' event took place in December. The festivities began at The Allens with carol singing led by the 'Village Voices' and entertainment by the Weald of Kent & Boughton Monchelsea Morris dancers. The Parish Council elves served warming refreshments and provided face painting for the children. Father Christmas made a brief appearance before his sleigh delivered him to the Memorial Hall where lots of children were waiting to visit him. En route to the hall there were refreshments in the Unicorn; the Scout Group served 'Toasted Smores' at the Vestry Hall; Marden Church served warming soup where a Christmas Tree display was taking place, Kebab Fish Knight gave out chips and the West End Tavern hosted Anno Gin, 12 Bar Brewery & Turner's Cider together with serving turkey burgers. Whilst Father Christmas handed out gifts to the children, people busied themselves at the craft fair and refreshments were served by the WI and Ballards Butchers.
